

Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 13, 2025

Our scripture passage comes from the Gospel of Luke 10:25–37. In this text we read of Jesus' interaction with a lawyer regarding eternal life and then the famous parable of the Good Samaritan. Because most of us are very familiar with this passage we may actually miss some of the subtle teachings Jesus wants to communicate. Let's study the passage in depth to see what insights can be offered for our discipleship. The passage begins with a lawyer asking Jesus what must he do to inherit eternal life. Although the lawyer already knows the answer, the question is posed in an effort to test Jesus. The malicious question of the lawyer reveals a serious dichotomy in his faith life: although he may know the correct answer (love God and neighbor), he is not acting on that knowledge as is demonstrated by his repeated attempts to test and trap Jesus. In response to the Lawyer's actions, Jesus commands him to start acting on his knowledge of the Law.

The question "What must I do" is a common theme in Luke's Gospel and surfaces at various moments. For more information on the importance of this question of practical discipleship, the reader is encouraged to consult the reflection in Come Follow Me for the 3rd Sunday of Advent in Year C. Certainly the study of the Law is important, but what good is it to know the right answer yet not live it? A person who knows (what is) the right thing to do but doesn't do it is more culpable than the person who lacks knowledge of right and wrong. For disciples, it is important to have an integrated faith that seeks to live out in concrete deeds what we know to be true and revealed by God. If we fail to integrate our faith into daily action, then we are like the lawyer in this story who may have known the way to eternal life but wasn't following it. Jesus' teaching was challenging because contemporary groups like the Pharisees actually esteemed the study of the Law over practicing it. Jesus is emphasizing the necessity of doing as a result of studying.

Christian love is not a mere sentiment but rather an active movement to do the divinely-willed good for another person. To love God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind is to give the Lord a complete sovereign claim on every aspect of our lives. If any part of our lives is held back from the Lord then we have not fulfilled the commandment to love. It is worth reflecting on the various aspects of life governed by the categories of heart, soul, strength, and mind. The heart is the center of affection and represents all those attachments we have to things and people. When we love God with all our heart, then we will root out any affection or attachment that is irreconcilable with the Lord's presence and will. We will also root out all affections and attachments that are self-serving to the exclusion of our neighbor.

The soul is the principle of life and the eternal aspect in each of us. To love God with all our soul, means to give God His rightful place in the center of our lives every hour of every day. It means to have a mature relationship with the Lord in which we faithfully live out our friendship with Jesus and do His will in each moment and every decision. We cannot love God with all our soul unless we are dedicating quality time to be in prayerful communion with the Lord each day. When we love God with all our soul then we turn to the Lord and the Lord alone for our identity, value, worth, meaning, and security. To love God with all our strength is to serve God with our actions whether they occur during work, family life, recreational activities, leisure, and so forth. God has blessed all of us with natural talents and abilities by which we can serve the Lord as an active member of the Body of Christ. When we fail to use our strengths to serve the Lord by doing His will, then we fail in our love of God. The focus of our actions will demonstrate where our true love lies and that is often with ourselves rather than God or others.

To love God with all our mind means to be conformed to the mind of Christ through the process of repentance. It also means that we commit ourselves to studying and learning the Lord's self-revelation to us through His Word in Scripture and the living tradition of the Church as authentically taught by the Magisterium. We are not loving God with all our mind if we are not committing a part of each day to the study of God's Word. We are also not loving God if we choose to fill our minds with vengeful, addictive, lustful, or other such sinful preoccupations.

- What affection or attachment is present in your life that is irreconcilable with God's presence and will?
- How can you dedicate a part of each day to studying and learning God's Word?



I'm trying hard to grow out of sin and into virtue. How do I make real progress?


Wanting to get rid of sinful habits and become serious about them is important. Once we have that desire about them is important. Once we have that desire, the question is, How? In today's reflection, adapted from an episode of Ask Fr. Josh, Fr. Josh Johnson offers some perspective and counsel.

Letting Go of Vices

A great gift that we can give God is our sins-our vicesin the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What do we bring to the confessional? Scripture, as always, can help.

Every time I read the Word of God, the Lord inspires me. I become motivated to be a saint, but I'm also convicted. I'm challenged by how far I still need to mature-how much more I need to grow in my relationship with God, the Church, and my walk toward eternity. When I read the Bible, I become aware of where I am falling short of the glory of God.

For me, reading the Bible is like that first look in the mirror in the morning. You see that your hair is mussed, you have "sleep" in your eyes, and more. The mirror shows me things that I wouldn't have spotted if I had not looked. Scripture is our spiritual mirror. It reveals our sins to us.



Proverbs 6:16? It says there are seven

abominations (vices) in our hearts. If you don't know what to bring to confession, take along those seven deadly sins: envy, greed, gluttony, sloth, lust, wrath, and pride.

Most saints struggled with one or more vices. St. Teresa of Ávila had problems with pride; St. John XXIII, sloth; St. Francis de Sales, wrath; St. Augustine, lust. In your walk toward eternity, we probably will experience one or more troublesome vices. Address them in your heart, in prayer, and in confession. Doing so can help you eradicate sins born of vice.
