



Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 20, 2025

Our scripture passage comes from the Gospel of Luke 10:38–42. It is the story of Jesus going to the home of Martha and Mary. This scene should be read in the context of the lawyer's question from last week (see Lk 10:25) and the subsequent discussion regarding love of God and love of neighbor. That context is important because this week's reading demonstrates what love of God looks like, just as the Good Samaritan parable from last week demonstrated what love of neighbor looks like. As this encounter with Mary and Martha unfolds, it becomes a teaching moment for all disciples about the need to stay focused in the midst of our active apostolic lives. Like many texts of Scripture, this passage can be read on both superficial (literal) and deeper levels. Both levels can be beneficial for our reflection.

On a surface level, this story tells us that Martha was so busy doing things for Jesus that she actually ended up ignoring Him. When that happens, (then) relationships suffer. This is an important insight for us as disciples because it affects how we relate to our families, friends, and co—workers on a human level. Jesus reminds Martha, and us, that only one thing is necessary when it comes to hospitality, and that is to pay attention to the other person. Everything else we do for them is secondary. Sometimes we get our priorities out of balance and can end up spending time doing all sorts of things for other people but not spending time with those people. Our deepest longing is for love and that is the one thing necessary in our human relationships. It's interesting that Jesus doesn't say anything to Martha until she complains. The Lord allows her to do her works of service and intervenes only when she expresses anger and frustration. It is then that He can speak to her and refocus her heart by helping her see what is out of order. Martha's works of service should have been an expression of her love for Jesus. Instead they became a source of anger, judgmentalism, and resentment. What could have been a blessing for Martha (the opportunity to serve Jesus) became nothing more than a burden. Imagine how many people would have been honored to have Jesus visit their homes, but Martha lost sight of the honor and the opportunity to experience the Lord's wonderful presence. Sometimes that happens to us in our daily interactions as well when we are motivated more by duty than by love. Think of how quickly the opportunity to attend an event with your child can become the burden of an additional demand on your schedule. Also, think of how the opportunity to care for an ailing parent can become an imposition on your personal freedom.

When Jesus speaks to Martha, notice how He has to call her name twice. In the Scriptures, when a name is called twice it is often done in order to awaken someone who has fallen asleep (see 1 Sam 3:10 and Lk 22:31). By calling out "Martha, Martha!" Jesus is telling us that Martha has fallen asleep in her faith and that is the ultimate cause of her unfocused life. The Lord has to wake her up so she can once again have the right relationship with Him. Lots of things can cause us to fall asleep in our faith life. For some people, it is the routine of daily prayer or even the liturgy which becomes so ordinary that they stop reflecting on what is taking place. A good rule is this: our religious works probably don't mean much to God if they don't mean much to us. Other people can fall asleep because of a fundamental disinterest in their faith lives. When that happens they can perceive prayer as fruitless and stop spending time with the Lord. Anytime we think that we have God figured out then we have fallen asleep and need to be awakened to the Lord's unfathomable mystery. Jesus is relevant for every moment of each day. If we cannot see that relevance then it is our own blindness which prevents us from appreciating the profound life He offers to us. This Gospel passage specifically says that it was busyness and the distractions of much serving that led Martha to fall asleep in her faith life. That detail cautions us to not become so preoccupied by our tasks that we end up obsessed with completing our duties. Sometimes people have to be awakened from such a state of spiritual sleep lest they forget the fundamental reason for those works of service and love.

Lastly, some people fall asleep in their faith due to simple carelessness and lack of discipline when it comes to observing basic religious practices such as attending Sunday Mass, praying daily, regular celebration of Confession and so forth. By allowing these good and regular practices of faith to slowly decline in frequency, people can actually end up in a state of non-practicing faith. The Christian spiritual tradition attests that the figures of Martha and Mary, despite their obvious differences in attitude and disposition, have also become the ideal for what we call in the Church "contemplation" and "action." The integration of Mary (contemplation) and Martha (action) for a true disciple is the perfect balance we strive for in our ministry to the Lord.

- What makes you fall asleep in your faith life?
- How can people become overburdened by being involved in ministries in your faith community?
- How does Mary's response to Jesus inspire you?



Do Catholics believe in signs from the dead?

When we lose a loved one, we may look for signs a bird, a butterfly, or anything that gives us hope that they are, in some way, still with us. Can the dead communicate with us? Fr. Mike Schmitz answers this question below, adapted from one of his videos.

When You Are Grieving

Sometimes people who are grieving the loss of a loved one tell me that certain things have happened after the individual has died, and they believe these are signs that their deceased loved one is okay.

Grief can be so overwhelming that you might say, "I would do anything. Just give me some kind of sign, some kind of indication that you're okay." This desire is normal. Seeking signs is a natural part of grief. We want that glimpse to know that the ones we love are okay.

But people cannot cause "signs" to happen—only God can work in nature in that way. Unexpected occurrences can remind us to pray for our loved ones and recall the gift of their lives. Things we may see as signs can help us keep people who have died in our hearts. Is God okay with us looking for signs? To a certain degree, there is nothing wrong with seeing a kind of sign in something. A woman once told me that whenever she saw a certain number on the clock, it always reminded her of the child she lost. There is nothing wrong with that. It inspires us to be grateful and pray.

When your grief about a loved one who has died comes to the surface and you see something that reminds you of that person, let it console your heart. Perhaps

you pray something like,
"That cardinal reminds
me of Dad. I miss him
so much. Let him rest in
your loving arms, Lord."
If tears come, let them.

ing arms, Lord." and you see a reminder of that person, let it console your heart. Then pray."

"When you are grieving over


a loved one who has died,

"God winks" happen because our God of the

broken heart is with us. That is why I think there is nothing intrinsically wrong with associating something you see with a loved one who has departed. In our grief, God is there. God cares.
