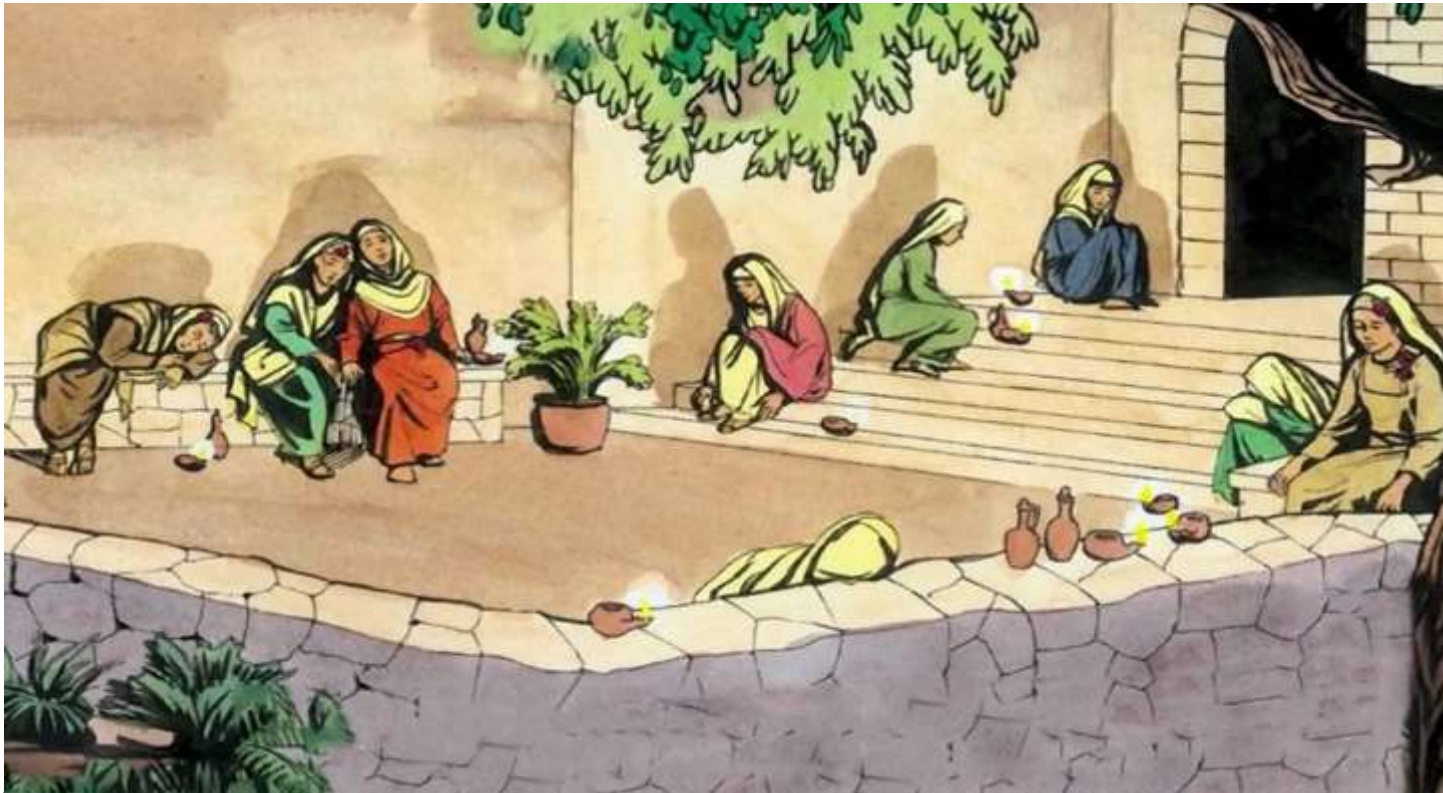

How Synodality Benefits a Parish

A synodal journey of accompaniment

It's about more than just holding meetings; it's about the very way we are church. Think of it as walking together, listening to one another, and discerning the path forward as a unified body in Christ, guided by the Holy Spirit.

Synodality in action

Why is this synodal approach so important? It benefits the whole community.

Benefits for the whole community

Beyond your direct ministry, embracing synodality has profound benefits for the parish as a whole. A synodal parish is:

- **More Missionary:** The end goal of synodality is to make the church more effective at evangelization by making it more participatory and inclusive (see Final Document, 89). By fostering a culture of listening and collaboration, the parish becomes more attuned to the needs of its members and the wider community, enhancing its ability to share the good news.
- **A Community of Communion:** Synodality strengthens the bonds of communion within the parish. When parishioners feel heard and valued, they are more likely to engage actively in parish life, fostering a stronger sense of belonging and shared purpose.
- **Discerning and Responsive:** Through synodal processes, the parish can better discern the signs of the times and respond more effectively to the challenges and opportunities it faces. This includes pastoral planning, addressing the needs of those on the peripheries, and fostering a more vibrant faith community.

Countering Clericalism: By actively involving the laity, including your catechumenate team, in meaningful dialogue and discernment, the parish moves away from a purely top-down approach and embraces the gifts and charisms of all its members (see Final Document, 74).

Taking on a new mindset

Embracing synodality requires a shift in mindset and a willingness to listen and dialogue, even when encountering differing viewpoints. However, if we can make that shift in mindset, we will see a more vibrant, participatory, and missionary church, and a deeper, lifelong conversion for those journeying towards initiation into Christ.

So when you encounter “synodality,” try to get past the word and understand the vast vision for mission that the concept promises. Your work with seekers is essential to this process. You are already living out the principles of synodality. By intentionally embracing listening, inclusivity, and communal discernment, you are not only accompanying seekers on the journey of faith, but you are also contributing to the ongoing renewal your parish, helping it truly become a community that walks together in faith, radiating the light of Christ to all.

Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 10, 2025

Our scripture passage comes from the Gospel of Luke 12:32–48. This text is a continuation of Jesus' teaching on the need to place our trust and security in Him and not in our material possessions. The right use of material possessions is an essential response of faith for disciples and Luke's Gospel contains more teachings on this topic than any other gospel. Jesus begins this section by specifically addressing the fear of insecurity and insufficiency that can lead a person to care only for themselves rather than generously and sacrificially caring for the needs of others. In the verses immediately preceding this passage, the Lord instructed the disciples about God's care for the ravens, lilies, and grass of the field. If God cares for these created things so well then the Lord will care even more for disciples who seek His Kingdom. Jesus teaches the disciples that they can trust in the Father's loving and caring providence over their lives because God is in control of all things. With that blessed assurance, there is no need to fear. Rather, disciples who have received the Kingdom must be disciples who freely give the Kingdom to others. For this reason, the sharing of resources becomes a witness of faith in God's protection and providence as well as a disciple's participation in the Kingdom of God.

This teaching on the right use of material possessions then moves into a series of parables that describe different people's actions concerning accountability and faithful stewardship. It should be noted that the accountability Jesus refers to is not just a once-for-all experience at the Last Judgment, the end of the world, or the death of the individual Christian. Similar parables are used in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark to communicate such an apocalyptic understanding of the Master's return. However, this passage from the Gospel of Luke implies that the Master returns to check on his servants in the course of every day and is a reminder of our need to live an ongoing experience of accountable and responsible discipleship (see the apocalyptic use of similar images in Mt 24:42, Mt 24:43–44, Mt 24:45–51, Mt 25:1–13, and Mk 13:33–37). Such emphasis on more regular accountability and daily judgment is a distinctive theme of Luke's Gospel. The first parable is about servants who wait for their Master's return from a wedding. They are the ones who are "watchful" meaning that they are prepared for his return by prayer and faithful fulfillment of their duties. The Master's return for them is a cause of joy and they are invited to participate in a great banquet in which the Master serves them. We should not be surprised by such an action because Jesus said in the Last Supper that He was among them as one who serves (see Lk 22:27).

The meaning of this parable is that faithful servants have nothing to fear. The Master's return for them will be a time of wonderful blessing as God's greatness is revealed in humble service for His servants. These servants are eager for the Master's return because it is what they are living for. Obviously, this parable is about the many ways in which Jesus comes to us each day and our need to be watchful servants who are praying and faithfully fulfilling the responsibilities God has entrusted to us. It can be easy to fall asleep in our faith life and to forget the responsibilities the Lord has entrusted to us as His servants. That is especially true when it comes to the right use of material possessions. The Master of the household may come at any time in the course of our day to see how faithful we are in generously caring for the needs of others according to His will. When we fall asleep in that duty, then we fail to act according to the Master's will (see Lk 12:47).

As disciples, we grow in our knowledge of God's will through the study of His word, prayer, and Christian formation. With each new insight comes the responsibility to live it. Disciples do not learn about their faith only as a matter of personal interest or trivia. Rather, disciples learn about their faith so as to more fully conform their lives to God's will. Greater knowledge doesn't make greater disciples unless they are putting that knowledge into practice and faithfully serving God and neighbor as responsible stewards. For those who do not respond in such a faithful and accountable way, greater knowledge actually means more serious judgement.

Your Faith in Focus

GIVE IT TIME

How do I build healthy relationships?

Fr. Mike Schmitz spends lots of time on college campuses engaging with young adults in a very formative stage of their lives. He has walked with many young couples from dating through engagement and beyond. Fr. Mike offers three tips for building healthy relationships that can help you, whether you are dating, married, or looking to cultivate better friendships.

1. There are some things that only time can reveal.

"Time is absolutely essential for a relationship," Fr. Mike says.

He explains that even if you talk frequently and have wonderful communication with your significant other, the things you discuss within the first six months of dating are very different from those things you talk about at sixteen months.

Fr. Mike believes you can only reach a certain depth in a relationship with the gift of time. He holds that his first tip is to slow down. Take your time and enjoy getting to know one another.

2. Allow your relationship to be the age that it actually is.

For his second tip, Fr. Mike shares how he meets couples who "know" they will get married after only two months of dating. He warns us not to skip ahead in relationships.

"If you have been in a relationship for six months, let your relationship be six months old," Fr. Mike advises. This is important because if you allow the relationship to progress at the right pace, you deal with potential issues and difficulties as they arise naturally. "There's something good about letting it be the fourth date," Fr. Mike says.

Don't dismiss potential problems just because you think you'll get married. The issues will only return, and you won't be equipped to address them. Fr. Mike advises couples to treat their relationships as the age they truly are rather than the age they wish they were.

3. Learn how to make decisions together.

For his final tip, Fr. Mike says, "One of the greatest skills that couples can work on with each other is learning how to solve problems." He says this advice differs from the previous two tips because it involves developing a skill.

Every relationship is bound to meet obstacles and roadblocks. Regardless of the type of relationship, problem-solving will always help it grow and move forward smoothly. Because everyone makes decisions differently, Fr. Mike says learning how to solve problems together is fundamental to a healthy relationship.
