How Synodality Benefits a Parish

A synodal journey of accompaniment

It's about more than just holding meetings; it's about the very way we are church. Think of it as walking together, listening to one another, and discerning the path forward as a unified body in Christ, guided by the Holy Spirit.

Synodality in action

Why is this synodal approach so important? It benefits the whole community.

Benefits for the whole community

Beyond your direct ministry, embracing synodality has profound benefits for the parish as a whole. A synodal parish is:

- More Missionary: The end goal of synodality is to make the church more effective at evangelization by making it more participatory and inclusive (see Final Document, 89). By fostering a culture of listening and collaboration, the parish becomes more attuned to the needs of its members and the wider community, enhancing its ability to share the good news.
- A Community of Communion: Synodality strengthens the bonds of communion within the parish. When parishioners feel heard and valued, they are more likely to engage actively in parish life, fostering a stronger sense of belonging and shared purpose.
- **Discerning and Responsive:** Through synodal processes, the parish can better discern the signs of the times and respond more effectively to the challenges and opportunities it faces. This includes pastoral planning, addressing the needs of those on the peripheries, and fostering a more vibrant faith community.
- Countering Clericalism: By actively involving the laity, including your catechumenate team, in meaningful dialogue and discernment, the parish moves away from a purely top-down approach and embraces the gifts and charisms of all its members (see Final Document, 74).

Taking on a new mindset

Embracing synodality requires a shift in mindset and a willingness to listen and dialogue, even when encountering differing viewpoints. However, if we can make that shift in mindset, we will see a more vibrant, participatory, and missionary church, and a deeper, lifelong conversion for those journeying towards initiation into Christ. So when you encounter "synodality," try to get past the word and understand the vast vision for mission that the concept promises. Your work with seekers is essential to this process. You are already living out the principles of synodality. By intentionally embracing listening, inclusivity, and communal discernment, you are not only accompanying seekers on the journey of faith, but you are also contributing to the ongoing renewal your parish, helping it truly become a community that walks together in faith, radiating the light of Christ to all.



Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 17, 2025

This is an unsettling teaching in which Jesus speaks about fire, baptism and the divisions caused by faith. We should remember that our Lord's words in this passage follow His caution to the disciples when He said that much will be required of the person entrusted with much (see Lk 12:48). When a disciple faithfully carries out the will of the Master, it will lead to an all-encompassing commitment of life. This commitment of life may bring harmony between the disciple and the Master but it will sometimes cause division with others.

Jesus cautions us that being on fire with faith will not necessarily make our lives easier. In the passage immediately before this week's reading, Jesus told us a parable about servants who bring joy to the Master through their faithful and responsible stewardship. Although we may bring joy to the Master of the household by lives of faithful service, other members of the household may not be so happy. That is because not everyone will share in our passionate love for God and neighbor or agree with our decisions of discipleship. As a result, the gift of faith sometimes can become a cause of division and rejection rather than a source of communion and harmony.

In the early Church, many people were disowned by their families for becoming Christians. Their decision to persevere in their commitment to Jesus was a cause of serious division. Oftentimes this meant that they lost their possessions, positions, and economic standing in society as well as some of their closest relationships. Many people today can experience rejection, persecution, and similar disharmony for their decision to follow Christ. Such an experience can cause bewilderment in a disciple's life because we tend to think that faith only brings peace and good will. This passage cautions us that faith doesn't always make life easier and that sometimes those closest to us will not agree with our decisions of discipleship.

- -Whom do you know that has experienced difficulties because of their decisions of faith?
- -When has your commitment of faith brought about division with others?
- -How can we as individuals and as a faith community support those who are isolated or rejected because of their decision of faith in Jesus?
- -How can people in a faith community encourage one another to persevere in their faith even when it means risking alienation or going against the values of those closest to them?



Where does the Rosary come from?

Many Catholics are at least somewhat familiar with the Rosary. We get that it has something to do with the Blessed Virgin Mary, something to do with following the story arc of the Gospel, and it is prayed using beads. But where did the Rosary come from? As we draw near to the date on which we celebrate Mary's Assumption into heaven (August 15), it is appropriate that we join Fr. Mike Schmitz as he discusses the origins of the Rosary.

Saints Dominic and Simon Stock

In the 1200s, St. Dominic and St. Simon Stock were two pioneers, or champions, of the Rosary that we Catholics pray today.

To start, 150 Hail Marys were prayed throughout the day, and that number could be divided into groups of ten. Each group of ten is called a decade. The first decade would begin with the Our Father and close with the Glory Be. Each decade would reflect on a scene from Our Lord's life. This practice led us to name the main sets the joyful mysteries, the sorrowful mysteries, and the glorious mysteries.

Those Hail Marys total 150, a number equal to the number of psalms in the Bible. To help the Faithful keep track, beads or knots were introduced as a helpful tool. Christians prayed like this starting in the 300s. St. Simon Stock, St. Dominic, and other Christians were regularly saying "I want to reflect on the Lord's life" with the mysteries. These mysteries of the Rosary helped—and still help—Catholics keep the Incarnation "alive." Then, and now, at least every couple of days—maybe even every day—the Rosary helped the Faithful to reflect on the mystery of the Incarnation, the mystery of God humbling himself and entering our lives.

Praying the Rosary throughout the year helps us keep God the Son's life active in our lives. When you are praying the Rosary, you get to reflect on that deep, profound gift of love that Jesus gave to the world, and you honor the Triune God and our Mother Mary.

Centuries ago, the Rosary started as a powerful prayer, a tool that Christians could use against a culture that was changing dramatically. I think you can readily recognize that our precious Rosary is still mightily needed today in a world where God is often shunned.

"Hail Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with thee," And lo, he is with us, too. Always.



Ponder and Pray

- What is the role of the Rosary in your life? Have you tried praying along with an app or other tool?
- What would be the best and most realistic course for you to continue to grow in your own relationship with Jesus and Mary through the Rosary?
- 1. Holding the rosary beads, make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Pray the Apostles' Creed (on the crucifix).
- 3. Pray an Our Father (first bead).
- 4. Pray three Hail Marys (second through fourth beads).
- 5. Pray the Glory Be and the (optional) Fatima Prayer (fifth bead).
- 6. Announce the first mystery, and then pray the Our Father.
- Pray ten Hail Marys on the next decade (ten beads), meditating on the mystery.
- On the next single bead, pray the Glory Be and the (optional)
 Fatima Prayer.
- On the same bead, announce the next mystery and pray the Our Father.
- Repeat steps 7 to 9 for each of the four remaining mysteries.
- After the fifth mystery, pray the Hail, Holy Queen (on the rosary centerpiece).
- Conclude with the Rosary Prayer, and make the Sign of the Cross.
