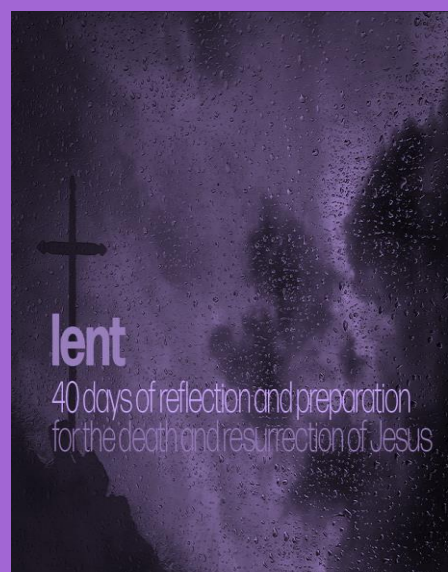

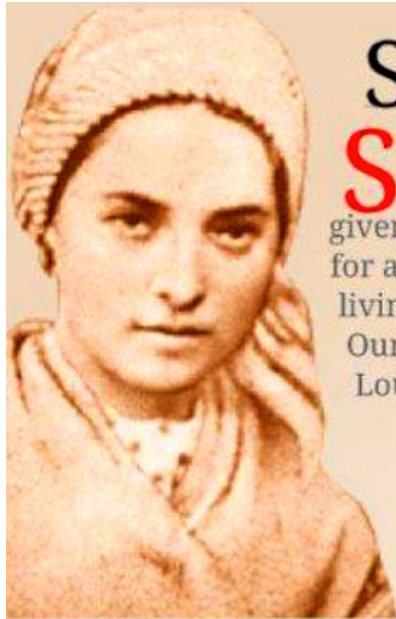

St. Bernadette Soubirous



St. Bernadette Soubirous a young, poor, illiterate, sickly girl, had the courage, in spite of opposition from all sides, to pass on the message given to her during the apparitions by Our Lady. This Message was given for all of us. The Message of Lourdes is Prayer, Penance, Conversion, and living as God would want us. Bernadette a saint is not because she saw Our Lady but because she live the message of Lourdes.



Anyone who is not prepared to suffer
all for the Beloved and to do His will
in all things is not worthy of the
sweet name of Friend, for here below,
Love without suffering does not exist...

God exalts none but the humble,
truly this is the great lesson of
St Bernadette's life.

1844

Bernadette, was born on Jan 7. She was the firstborn of a miller from Lourdes. She had six brothers and two sisters. Only three of her siblings lived beyond the age of ten.



St. Bernadette's father Francois was a good man and was never in a hurry about being paid, especially by his poorest customers.

1853

Crops were poor and famine struck France. Hard times soon followed.

1855

Cholera struck Lourdes. Bernadette was not spared. She survives Cholera but became permanently asthmatic.

1856

Failing again to meet their meager rent in May, the family was this time left homeless.

1857

Her family was forced to move in one small room called the "Cachot".



The Cachot was an old jail, abandoned in 1824 for sanitary reasons.

Bernadette's father was accused of stealing a bag of flour causing him to be imprisoned for a week. The charges were shortly dismissed, but he was left with a reputation as a thief.

In Nov. Bernadette was sent to Bartres to work as a shepherdess and house servant.

1858

Her desire to receive First Holy Communion brought her back to her home in Jan.

At age 14, she could scarcely read or write. She goes to school conducted by the Sisters of Charity and prepares for her First Holy Communion, studying the basic Catechism with 7 year old children.

On Feb 11, Bernadette was out with her younger sister and a friend looking for firewood. Her two companions waded across a stream and left her taking off her shoes and stockings. Suddenly, she saw a figure in the opening of a grotto. Instinctively, Bernadette pulled out her own rosary and began to pray. When she finished her prayers the Lady bowed, smiled at her and disappeared.

This occurred at a location called the Grotto of Massabielle, alongside the riverbank of the Gave.

Over the next few weeks there were seventeen more apparitions.



She saw a young girl, dressed in white and a blue girdle. She wore a white veil, yellow rose on each foot and was holding a rosary.

During the visions, the Lady requested prayer and penitence, asked for the construction of a chapel and a procession, and led Bernadette to a fresh water spring that is believed to have miraculous healing powers.

Many reports of miraculous cures followed. Pilgrims flock to the grotto of Massabielle.

Despite strong doubt from the town mayor, the local judge, eminent physicians and parish priest, including being detained for a time and questioned by the local police, Bernadette remained steadfast and humble.

On March 25, the Lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

In June, she received her First Holy Communion.

1860

She moved into a hospice at the Sisters of Charity, Lourdes where she lived, worked, and learned to read and write.

Patronage: Bodily illness, Lourdes, France, shepherds and shepherdesses, against poverty, people ridiculed for their faith

1862

The Bishop of Tarbes authenticated the visions.

1866

Bernadette joins the congregation of the Sisters of Charity in Nevers. She takes the name Sister Marie-Bernard.



1879

Throughout her life she remained sickly, but attended patiently to her duties as infirmarian and sacristan. She died of tuberculosis on April 16.

1909-25

Her body was exhumed three times in 1909, 1919 and finally in 1925. There was no sign of corruption.

1933

On Dec 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, St. Bernadette was canonized by Pope Pius XI.



St. Bernadette's body can still be seen incorrupt in the Chapel of Nevers in a glass reliquary.
