

WE ARE DISCIPLES: LEARNING, LOVING & LIVING CHRIST'S MISSION



If there is one thing for certain in the world today it is this: there is a huge market segment dedicated to all sorts of publications and fix it stuff on how to live your life. You can go into any bookstore such as Barnes and Noble (but not many do anymore) or log in to Amazon\Books\Self-Help and you will find an almost endless list of books and publications offering you the simple answer to the question, "What do I need to do to fix myself?" Well, I am going to let you in on a

well-known secret. Jesus, when he shared with us the Sermon on the Mount, He instructed all men and women who would ever be born the principles of living a good, holy life. In other words, He gave us a recipe for life, the Beatitudes. "Blessed are you who...." along with, "Woe to you who...." are not just platitudes; they are meaningful instructions on how to live out our relationship with God, with ourselves and with our neighbor, the "other," whoever that is and wherever that relationship exists.

An example, *Blessed are you who are poor for the kingdom of God is yours*. Poor does not necessarily mean lacking in worldly wealth, though it certainly could be that. It does describe the relationship with money and wealth that one should have. We should live as if we did not have money or wealth at all, depending on the Lord and His providential care. Then, when our earthly treasure chest has deposits in it, we should use those gifts to spread the Good News of the Kingdom of God to all those with whom we come into contact. Then and only then will our lives feel complete. *Woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation*. This is another part of the recipe, an ingredient not to be used. When gifts received are hoarded out of lack of trust and not shared with others, our hearts are hardened, keeping us on the outside of the kingdom of God.

Jesus, in the Beatitudes presented in this passage from Luke, provides all of us instructions on how to and how not to live our lives. We do not need to go somewhere else to find the Recipe for Life. My wife, Mary Beth, loves to bake cookies and share them with others. It is one of her special gifts. Quite a few years ago, she found a recipe for "No Fail Chocolate Chip Cookies." It makes a huge batch of cookies, ample for sharing with others which we do. I can attest that never has a batch failed to deliver. Jesus, in the Beatitudes, has provided us with a "No Fail Recipe for Life."

May we all tuck away His recipe in our hearts, use it every day of our lives, never straying, never leaving out an ingredient, and always following His instructions. Then and only then will we be among those counted as Blessed are you who....! Remember, you do not have to go searching elsewhere. Let us all learn to make His No Fail Recipe for Life an integral part of our living in the kingdom of God.

40 Days for Life Campaign and Kickoff Rally

Did you know that **40 Days for Life** is an internationally coordinated 40-day campaign that seeks to end abortion through prayer, fasting and peaceful all-day vigils on sidewalks in front of centers around the world? It is a peaceful and educational presence, and those who are called to stand witness during this presence send a powerful message to the community about the tragic reality of abortion. 40 Days for Life also serves as a call to repentance for those who work at the abortion center and those who patronize the facility. **Since its inception in 2007, 19,198 babies have been saved, 112 abortion centers have closed and 221 abortion workers have quit.**

This Spring's 40 Days campaign runs from 7 a.m. to 7p.m, March 2nd through April 10th, beginning with a 40 Days for Life Kickoff Rally on Tuesday, March 1st, 7-8:30 p.m. at St. Lawrence Social Hall.
