## This Week: A Message from Fr. Petan and Fr. Ted

### An official announcement from Fr. Dominic Petan, Vicar for Clergy

Father Mark Walter has taken time away and received expert counseling and spiritual direction. Having done so, he still feels the need to step away from priestly ministry at this time, because of his persistent doubts about his call to the priesthood. For the time being, he intends to reside in the Greater Lafayette area and has taken up secular employment.

Therefore, upon consultation with the Clergy Ministry and Life Committee, Bishop Timothy L. Doherty has made the following appointment, effective immediately. Father Ted Dudzinski, VG, JCL, is appointed Administrator of Church of the Blessed Sacrament, West Lafayette. Deacon Mike Gray will provide leadership support to day-to-day, operational activities as Parish Life Coordinator.

Please continue to pray for Father Mark and your parish community. Those interested in contacting Father Mark may address cards or notes to him to the parish office, and we will ensure that he receives them.

### A Message from Fr. Ted Dudzinski, Administrator

I write this bulletin on the Celebration of the Feast of the Queenship of Mary. As many of you are aware, my very own priesthood has been entrusted to Mary, Mother of Priests. She is the great source of unity in bringing souls to her Son, our brother, Savior, and High Priest, Jesus. My continued prayer for the Church of the Blessed Sacrament during this time of uncertainty, born out of my love for this parish family, has been for unity, peace, and stability. I am grateful that Bishop Doherty has faith and confidence in myself and Deacon Mike Gray to work with the parish leadership to provide stability until a more permanent solution can be discerned.

Personally, I have worked with Dcn. Mike Gray for years as he served as the Associate Director for Ordained Deacons in the diocese, and having his presence here with us during the pandemic shutdown. His ability to assist at Mass and preach was a great joy. Most recently, I have been able to observe his leadership in the Pastorate of St. Francis Xavier, Attica, and St. Joseph Covington, and I am excited for his prayerful and authentic servant leadership to be on display here.

The title ‘Administrator’ by its very canonical definition doesn’t provide for the long-term stability of a pastor but carries with it most of the same rights, responsibilities, and obligations. Having said that, I also realize my own limitations given my diocesan responsibilities. I believe that with Dcn. Mike, we will be able to provide the leadership necessary for the successful implementation of the *Uniting in Heart 2030 Pastoral Plan* and, more specifically, the Pastorate Vision Plan developed by your parish leadership. To that end, I will certainly have a sacramental presence and provide guidance to Dcn. Mike, our Pastoral & Finance Councils, and have a presence at staff meetings. Dcn. Mike will have direct responsibility for the staff and ensure day-to-day operations run smoothly.

Finally, I beg for your prayers for Dcn. Mike, myself, the parish staff, leadership, and our parish family—that we strive to accomplish God’s most Holy Will, that God will be glorified, and that we will become the saints He desires.

Let us start with Jesus through Mary.  
Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, pray for us!

I hope you're all adjusted and back in the swing of things for this new school year! Please know of my continued prayers for you; as always, please keep myself and the rest of our staff here at CBS in your prayers as well!

## Music Ministry Updates

Rehearsals for the following groups will begin in September (singing at Masses begins again in October) – if you've always thought about joining up and singing but haven't yet taken the plunge, please contact me asap – I'd love to get you involved. Please see the info (shared below) that I put out in August.

**Adult Choir:** this Choir is comprised of those ages 18 and up (including Cantors). They sing around 3 times a month on a rotating Mass basis at the 5:30pm, 7:30pm (Spanish) and 8am Masses. They also often sing for a Mass on Holy Days of Obligation, Christmas, Holy Week, etc. The music is a variety of repertoire, with different styles being featured at the different Mass times (5:30 – Contemporary, 7:30 – Spanish, 8:00 – Traditional). This group typically is in session from around the beginning of the school year until Corpus Christi; they break during the Summer

**Children's Choir:** this Choir is made up of children grades 1-8 (Including Cantors). They typically sing once a month (usually at the 5:30pm Mass), and for special occasions (Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc.) This group is typically in session from around the beginning of the school year until Corpus Christi; they break during the Summer

**Praise Band:** this Group plays/sings Praise & Worship Music at the 11am Mass 2x a month, and at the 7:30pm (Spanish) Mass 1x a month. Some musical proficiency is required for this group. Cantors are those in high school and those ages 18 and up

**Instrumentalists:** Instrumentalists play for a variety of different Masses throughout the year [depending on the instrument] with each of the different groups. Proficiency in your instrument is required

**Cantors:** Cantors at CBS sing at Masses either by themselves or in the context of one of the [above] groups. Musical proficiency and an interview with me is required to see if you're a fit for this role at Blessed Sacrament (this process is not scary J)
