I want to share with you a brief bit of the story of how I became a priest and the power of the Eucharist. I wasn't always called to be a priest; in fact, I was planning to be a Crown Attorney; however, God had other plans. One day, Fr. Min the Associate Pastor of the parish I used to attend (I was a non-practicing Catholic for 4+ years), invited me to a Come and See Weekend. This weekend took place at the Seminary of St. Augustine's and was an opportunity to see if God was calling me to be a priest. Often times we think that God calling us is like a friend calling us on a cell phone, but I see it as God's call is more like a gentle whisper - easy to miss, but constant and consistent.
