

My dear brothers, I offer this article for your prayerful reflection throughout this month. I hope it will fruitfully enrich your prayer and family life.

## Assembly's 'Family of the Year' 2023-2024

### SK Carl and Lady Karen Baillargeon



I am pleased to be able to re-initiate this award subsequent to the covid doldrums because of the importance of family and the support of one's spouse in the realm of those active in the Order. This Bro. and Sir Knight along with his wife, exemplify a tangible commitment while employing all of their talents and skills. This Brother joined Fr. Nicholas Point Council 4375 on Dec 11, 2002 and was indeed a contributor to the council and its projects when his time permitted. Having retired a few years ago, this knight has emerged from the 'underground' and has **'shed his energetic light'** on his council, his church and our Assembly.

As a new SK only a year ago, this Brother Knight, upon his retirement, joined our Assembly and has quite an impact.

He soon joined the Honour Guard of our Assembly by boldly ordering the new uniform from the U.S supplier and getting involved. He and his wife then attended the Milestone Dinner in St. Thomas and virtually every other occasion calling for an Honour Guard in the Windsor Essex County Area including Remembrance Masses, Funeral Masses, McGivney Feast Day Parade and Service at the McGivney Statue Site, Special Olympics Day in Chatham, Legion of Fatima Masses, Cemetery Sunday, and shared in the fraternalism with area assemblies and Councils. Soon because of his enthusiasm, he became a member of the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee and excelled at the creation of the Souvenir Book and the evening's video. He assisted the last year's Nativity Float Team of the Archbishop O'Connor Council and then took on the task of securing and reconstructing a new 19.5 ft trailer and combined his metalworking, welding and fabrication skills to build a new float that will be used by local council at Christmas and Canada Day. He and his wife have operated a greenhouse business for many years, have donated centerpieces for our last two Fundraising Steak BBQs and have as well, donated maple syrup products as door prizes. The beautiful flowers that adorn the Ste. Anne property are grown and donated by this couple and they spearhead the planting of same. His wife has become a member of the CWL of St. Anne's. This Sir Knight has also taken on an ambitious caretaker volunteer role at Ste. Anne's and has researched and spearheaded many unique projects that are too numerous to mention. He and his wife have helped at Third and Fourth Degree Dinners and she has graciously donated baked goods whenever a situation arises and delivers lunch to the volunteers in the workshop.

This Sir Knight and his wife are indeed the epitome of commitment. He is a committed usher at Ste. Anne's and aided in the installation of the historic Fatima Bell at Ste. It has become accepted practice for Councils and Assemblies to seize an opportunity such as we are engaged in this evening, to extend thanks to deserving Brothers and Sir Knights who have contributed much to their respective organizations.

Through the covid years, our Assembly lacked the social occasions in which to present such awards although a ***Family of the Year*** was presented last year to SK Ronald and Lady Laurie Barnhard while we attended the Christmas Dinner hosted by Dean Wagner Assembly.

The soon-to-be-welcomed recipient of the ‘**2023-2024- Knight of the Year**’ is a most deserving 51 year Third Degree Member and a 34-year Fourth Degree Member of our Assembly who remains consistently present and active. Despite his many years of activism in our Assembly, as an active Honour Guard Member and attendee at all functions such as parades, processions, Remembrance Day Services, cenotaph services, et cetera, even if assisted with a cane or walker, religious events, funeral masses and wakes and Fourth Degree social events area-wide. This SK lives out his mandate as he is active in his parish, serves as an usher at Our Lady of Guadalupe and was named Goodfellow of the Year in 2010 and where he continues to give of himself daily throughout the year. He has served in several positions on the Executive of our Assembly and is currently a Commander. He continues to have a presence and offers good judgement at our meetings and has an awesome memory for all things Assembly-related and hence he remains a valuable resource. This SK excels at the ‘fraternalism’ side of the Assembly and has a keen knowledge of matters pertaining to the members.

This SK was named Knight of the Year in 2017-2018 and yet continues with great interest and attendance at all matters Assembly related. He and his wife Lady Marie attend many events and both are a fine reflection on the commitment and friendliness of those in our Assembly. And so, while trying to condense these reflections on this well esteemed Sir Knight, on behalf of the Assembly 1789, I am honoured to again bestow the title of ***Knight of the Year*** to SK Thomas Ray.
