WORLD YOUTH DAY 2027

What is World Youth Day?

World Youth Day 2027 – Seoul, South Korea (WYD) is a global gathering with the Pope held every few years bringing together young people from around the world for prayer, celebration, and faith. The last WYD took place in Lisbon, Portugal in August 2023, and the next will be in Seoul, Korea in 2027. Open to all youth (16+), WYD offers a powerful opportunity to encounter Christ, experience the universality of the Church, and grow in faith alongside hundreds of thousands of peers.

The Youth, Young Adult, and Family Ministry Office is excited to announce plans to bring a group of young people and adults to this life-changing World Youth Day pilgrimage. We are partnering with Tour Design to create a meaningful and memorable package that will make this journey unforgettable. To begin forming our diocesan group, Christine Coyle will be hosting two online information sessions: **Thursday, October 23rd at 7:30 PM** and **Sunday, October 26th at 3 PM**. Both meetings should only last an hour. You only need to attend one session. Afterwards, participants will receive details on registration, forms, deposits, and next steps. Don't miss this chance to be part of an incredible, faith-filled experience!

Age Requirements for WYD 2027

Participants are encouraged to be at least 18 years old by the time of departure (end of July 2027). The minimum age to attend is 16 at departure, provided that proper adult-to-youth ratios are in place. Parents and/or guardians are strongly encouraged to travel with their teens to ensure a safe and meaningful experience.

JOURNÉE MONDIALE DE LA JEUNESSE 2027

Qu'est-ce que la Journée mondiale de la jeunesse ?

La Journée mondiale de la jeunesse 2027 – Séoul, Corée du Sud (JMJ) est un rassemblement mondial avec le pape qui a lieu tous les deux ou trois ans et qui réunit des jeunes du monde entier pour prier, célébrer et partager leur foi. La dernière JMJ a eu lieu à Lisbonne, au Portugal, en août 2023, et la prochaine se tiendra à Séoul, en Corée, en 2027. Ouvert à tous les jeunes (âgés de 16 ans et plus), la JMJ offre une occasion unique de rencontrer le Christ, de découvrir l'universalité de l'Église et de grandir dans la foi aux côtés de centaines de milliers de jeunes du même âge.

Le Bureau de la pastorale des jeunes, des jeunes adultes et des familles est heureux d'annoncer son projet d'emmener un groupe de jeunes et d'adultes à ce pèlerinage des Journées mondiales de la jeunesse qui changera leur vie. Nous nous sommes associés à Tour Design pour créer un programme riche et mémorable qui rendra ce voyage inoubliable. Afin de commencer à former notre groupe diocésain, Christine Coyle organisera deux séances d'information en ligne (*en anglais*) **le jeudi 23 octobre à 19h30 et le dimanche 26 octobre à 15h**. Les deux réunions ne devraient durer qu'une heure. Vous ne devez assister qu'à une seule séance. Ensuite, les participants recevront des informations détaillées sur l'inscription, les formulaires, les acomptes et les prochaines étapes. Ne manquez pas cette chance de participer à une expérience incroyable remplie de foi !

Conditions d'âge pour les JMJ 2027

Les participants sont encouragés à avoir au moins 18 ans au moment du départ (fin juillet 2027). L'âge minimum pour participer est de 16 ans au moment du départ, à condition que le ratio adultes/jeunes soit respecté. Les parents et/ou tuteurs sont fortement encouragés à accompagner leurs adolescents afin de garantir une expérience sûre et enrichissante.

From the Pastor's Pen ~

Here are the highlights of the guidelines about our bodily posture during the celebration of the Eucharist that we presented last week during the homily from Bishop Fabbro. Bishop Fabbro noted, "Whatever changes that are needed in individual parishes should be seen in light of the Church's ancient teaching that the liturgy is the Church's prayer and not our own to do with what we want or like, or to do only what may seem convenient... They are important to ensure that we celebrate Mass well and with the mind of the Church, and that we do so in the same way across the Diocese."

Here are the postures we should be observing:

1. During the Preparation of the Offerings, the people are sitting but should stand after the washing of the priest's hands or after the hymn has concluded (whichever is finished last) to be ready for the invitation, pray brothers and sisters, and make the response.
2. Our practice is to kneel at the end of the Lamb of God. The Priest then genuflects, holds the Host above the paten or chalice, and says, "Behold the Lamb of God" to which the Priest and assembly respond, "Lord, I am not worthy". At the end of this prayer, the assembly stands and remains standing during the Communion Procession until everyone has received Communion. The Communion Procession starts when the priest receives Communion and ends only when the last person has received Communion. Then, at that point, people may sit or kneel. In this way, we will all have the same posture during the most important moment in the celebration, the reception of Holy Communion, as a sign that we are all in communion with God and each other.
3. When before the minister to receive Holy Communion, the faithful should make a simple bow of the head (not a profound bow at the waist). When receiving Holy Communion in the hand, they reverently open their hands placing one beneath the other, creating a "throne" for the host to be placed upon. When receiving Holy Communion on the tongue, they reverently open their mouth and extend their tongue to create a place for the minister to lay the host. All should respond "Amen" (no other responses are appropriate) before they receive the Host and then consume it immediately upon receiving it.
4. We do not remain standing until the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the Tabernacle because the focus must be on the Holy Communion you have just received and not on the Blessed Sacrament going into the Tabernacle. Our Eucharistic Theology emphasizes that our priority is to reflect and focus upon the beautiful gift that is now within us.
5. Following the period of silence after Communion, the people stand when the priest stands after which the priest will say, "Let us pray." The priest offers the Prayer After Communion which brings an end to the Communion Rite.

De la plume du pasteur ~



Voici les points saillants des directives concernant notre posture corporelle pendant la célébration de l'Eucharistie que nous avons présentées la semaine dernière lors de l'homélie de Mgr Fabbro. Mgr Fabbro a fait remarquer : « Les changements qui s'imposent dans chaque paroisse doivent être considérés en fonction de l'enseignement ancestral de l'Église selon lequel la liturgie est la prière de l'Église et non la nôtre, que nous ne pouvons pas adapter à notre guise ou selon nos préférences, ni réduire à ce qui nous semble pratique... Ils sont importants pour garantir que nous célébrons bien et dans l'esprit de l'Église, et que nous le faisons de la même manière dans tout le diocèse. »

Voici les postures que nous devons observer :

1. Pendant la préparation des offrandes, les fidèles sont assis, mais ils doivent se lever après le lavage des mains du prêtre ou après la fin de l'hymne (selon ce qui se termine en dernier) pour être prêts à répondre à l'invitation « Priez, frères et sœurs ».
2. Notre pratique consiste à nous agenouiller à la fin de l'Agneau de Dieu. Le prêtre s'incline alors, tient l'hostie au-dessus de la patène ou du calice et dit « Voici l'Agneau de Dieu », ce à quoi le prêtre et l'assemblée répondent « Seigneur, je ne suis pas digne ». À la fin de cette prière, l'assemblée se lève et reste debout pendant la procession de communion jusqu'à ce que tout le monde ait reçu la communion. La procession de communion commence lorsque le prêtre reçoit la communion et ne se termine que lorsque la dernière personne a reçu la communion. À ce moment-là, les fidèles peuvent s'asseoir ou s'agenouiller. De cette manière, nous aurons tous la même posture pendant le moment le plus important de la célébration, la réception de la Sainte Communion, en signe que nous sommes tous en communion avec Dieu et les uns avec les autres.
3. Lorsqu'ils se présentent devant le ministre pour recevoir la Sainte Communion, les fidèles doivent faire une simple inclinaison de la tête (et non une profonde révérence). Lorsqu'ils reçoivent la Sainte Communion dans la main, ils ouvrent respectueusement leurs mains en les plaçant l'une sous l'autre, créant ainsi un « trône » sur lequel déposer l'hostie. Lorsqu'ils reçoivent la Sainte Communion sur la langue, ils ouvrent respectueusement la bouche et tendent la langue pour créer un espace où le ministre peut déposer l'hostie. Tous doivent répondre « Amen » (aucune autre réponse n'est appropriée) avant de recevoir l'hostie, puis la consommer immédiatement après l'avoir reçue.
4. Nous ne restons pas debout jusqu'à ce que le Saint-Sacrement soit placé dans le tabernacle, car l'attention doit se porter sur la Sainte Communion que vous venez de recevoir et non sur le Saint-Sacrement qui entre dans le tabernacle. Notre théologie eucharistique souligne que notre priorité est de réfléchir et de nous concentrer sur le magnifique don qui est maintenant en nous.
5. Après le moment de silence qui suit la communion, les fidèles se lèvent lorsque le prêtre se lève, après quoi le prêtre dit « Prions ». Le prêtre prononce la prière après la communion, qui met fin au rite de la communion.
