

Playing chess can impart valuable virtues and lessons essential for success in life.

This one-on-one game requires concentration and the ability to anticipate future moves, both yours and your opponent's.

While it might seem like a pastime for long Siberian winters (Russia boasts the highest number of grandmasters recognized by the International Chess Federation), chess is indeed a sport. It's not just a game; it's a mental battlefield that demands significant mental exercise and teaches numerous values. Here are some lessons you can learn from playing chess:

- 1. **Think before you make decisions**: Every move has consequences. Moving a pawn forward might seem insignificant, but it could expose your queen or king. Our words and actions have consequences in life, so we must think before we act and reflect before we speak.
- 2. **Pay attention from the first move**: Chess requires constant focus. You can't afford to be distracted, even at the beginning. Being careful from the start can prevent mistakes and missed opportunities.
- 3. **Look ahead at different possible scenarios**: In chess, you must imagine the potential outcomes of each move and how your opponent might react. This foresight is crucial in life, as our decisions today can have significant and long-term effects. It's a reminder of the weight of our choices and the importance of thinking ahead.
- 4. **Make a move**: Chess tournaments have time limits, forcing players to make decisions promptly. Similarly, we must avoid getting stuck in indecision and take action when necessary.
- 5. **Be patient**: When your opponent makes a move that allows you to capture a piece, acting quickly is tempting. However, chess teaches us the value of restraint. Patience is essential to avoid falling into traps. In life, it helps us resist impulses and make better decisions. It's a reminder that sometimes, the best move is to wait.

Another important point to remember is the role of the Queen, who has great power and can influence and guide the interaction between the other pieces. Our Blessed Mother Mary is our Queen, who helps each one of us stay close and protect our relationship to the King, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Lord. Look to our Blessed Mother to assist us in powerful ways in the chess game of life.

These lessons from chess can be applied to real life in various ways. For instance, thinking before making decisions can help in career planning, paying attention from the start can prevent errors in a project, and looking ahead at different possible scenarios can aid in financial planning. This makes board games more than just a way to pass the time—they're training for life and in the ways of faith.

ship to 'move on' was prompted by the late recent Past Faithful Navigator of Dean Wagner, SK Marc J. Morneau (Nov. 21, 1954—Jan. 27, 2025) who thought that since his Assembly was the eldest in our area, that it should show leadership. As mentioned, they currently have 16 who are equipped. SK Marc was number 17. Their Commander Larry Coleman also pushed for this resolve to accept what 'the Order' opted to do over seven years ago. HGs Carl Baillargeon, LaVerne Martins, David Lee and myself took part in a regional Honour Guard at either the wake prayers or the funeral mass for SK Marc. There were 17 Honour Guard in place for his funeral mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel.




Commander and PFN Baldrics

Dear Grand Knights and Faithful Navigators of Districts #10, 21, 23, 39, 76, and 88,

In the late summer of 2024, the Fr. McGivney Statue Site Committee facilitated the purchase of a 20 ft.- 2 axle trailer to be available for use by our local Windsor/Essex County K of C Councils and Assemblies at the various parades which occur throughout the year in Windsor/Essex County. This project was initiated by the idea of Br. Drew Tarnowski, GK of Archbishop Denis O'Connor Council #14969. Br. Carl Baillargeon, DGK Tecumseh Council #4375, skillfully rebuilt and transformed this trailer, along with the assistance of various other Brother Knights, to become a structurally sound and useful tangible asset for local knights.

This trailer was used during the 2024 Windsor Santa Claus Parade as well as the Harrow 2024 Christmas Parade. Note that this Trailer was the **ONLY** Float which had a **Nativity Scene** thereon during the 2024 Windsor Santa Claus Parade, and was viewed by a great number of onlookers and was the subject of numerous photos and videos. As Knights, we might like Santa Claus, but we certainly know that Christ, not Santa Claus, is the centre of the Christmas Season. This Trailer emphasized this point in a direct and actual way. Onlookers loved it, with **Merry Christmas** being shouted all the way through the parade route by the many happy parade onlookers. This trailer is not merely a piece of machinery. **This trailer is a very visible mechanism whereby the Knights and their message of Catholicity is transmitted to the public at large.**

The trailer, including its numerous modifications, has cost approximately \$3,000 of which \$500 has already been recouped from the kind donation of the Br. Sonny Sangemino Agency. A kind donation from Harrow Council #5350 for its use during the 2024 Harrow Christmas Parade is also forthcoming.

We are asking Councils and Assemblies for a donation to offset the cost of this trailer. Kindly print this letter and present it to the members of your Council/Assembly during your meetings.

Remembering an exemplary DGK and PFN and DD...

It has been said that when you loose someone to this life, that one appreciates more the "gift of memory" one can utilize so as to recall at will the impact that that person had upon you.

In the spirit of the fraternalism that exists in the Third and the

local leader that was so engaged locally and who succumbed to an illness in but a matter of months, is **SK Marc J. Morneau** who died on January 27, 2025. Relocating back after 36 years following a leadershipstyle career that took him throughout Canada and assignments in Europe he moved to south Windsor and connected with Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish. He retired as the Regional Sales Director of Eastern Canada in one of Canada's leading food, beverage and cheese importers and distributors.

Marc was a PGK of Council 5073 in Burlington and a 2 term GK with Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Council 13405. He later served as FN of Dean Wagner Assembly 0862. A while back, Marc was a guest speaker at a meeting of Council 4375 to provide information on UKnight and setting up a council website. Hence, Dean Wagner employ a useful website where SKs can sign up for participation at events. As well, with the change in the approved 'new' Fourth Degree Honour Guard uniform seven years ago, Marc was one of those accepting change and promoted compliance within his Assembly. They now boast about 16 or more in the 'new' attire and the Assembly fields numerous requests for Honor Guards and so his SKs can be as busy as they wish. His assembly has been a motivator for other local assemblies. Marc always had as friendly presence at area- wide K of C happenings.

On Friday, January 31st, a large number of Brothers and Sir Knights from across Windsor and the county, gathered for a wake prayer at Families First on Dougall. GK Marc Vallee of Council 13405 and SK Paul Brownlee from the Assembly shared personal remarks about the impact of SK Marc on both the council and the Assembly. SK Paul Brownlee shared how Marc's efforts at incorporating '*fraternalism*' in the meetings have improved the participation in his assembly. Marc was in place plying his leadership skills as the District Deputy of District 10 immediately prior to his death.

Seventeen Honour Guard and numerous knights throughout the church gathered to bid farewell to Marc at his funeral mass Feb.1st. He was attired in the latest version of the Fourth Degree attire. Of all his accomplishments in his career and as a spouse, father, grandfather, brother and uncle, it is moving to see how proud he was of his faith. Fr. Michael Parent, the homilist at the mass, called for all to ponder how meaningful physical suffering can be in the context of our faith. Fr. Mike reflected on the symbolism of Simon of Syrene carrying Jesus' cross and how it is sometimes a gift to bear a burden.

As shared in his obituary.... "Marc was the beloved husband of 50 years to Sandra (nee Ducharme) and is the father of Jason (Tammy) and Jeffrey (Tricia). He was the cherished pépé of Abigail, Taylor, Benjamin, Landon, Joshua and Carter, He will be missed by his brothers Gerry (Patti), Tom (Susan), Pierre (Cindy), John (Marie-Josée) and David (Nancy) as well as many nieces and nephews"

At a luncheon that ensued after the funeral, is was rewarding to hear testimony from the family of how Marc was always there for them and so involved in their lives. SK Marc was indeed exemplary in many dimensions.

May his memory of pride in his faith, love for his family and activism in '*The Order*' live on as an example to many.



The Fourth Degree was founded 125 years ago ... on Feb. 22, 1900

On THURSDAY, Feb. 22, 1900, in honour of George Washington's birthday, 1,100 K of C gathered at the first Exemplification at the Lenox Lyceum in New York City. The purpose of the new degree was to create honour guards that could attend church and community events so as to enhance the patriotic, fraternal and charitable tenets of the Order.

In 1900, the attire was a tuxedo with tails, with a white shirt and bow tie, black top hat, a social baldric and a ceremonial sword. In 1940, it was changed to the 'nautical themed' attire which included a black tuxedo, a plumed chapeau, a cape, a social baldric and a ceremonial sword.

In 2017, the uniform was modernized to consist of a blue blazer with the Fourth Degree emblem on the left front pocket, on the tie and

beret, along with a white shirt, dark grey pants and a ceremonial sword. In Canada, the sword sash has a red stripe whereas in the U. S. it is a blue and red stripe.

The photo shown below, is that of the late SK Jean Charles Campeau (June 16, 1928-



Oct.29, 2024) in St. Boniface, Manitoba, prior to his marriage to his wife Anita. The photo depicts the original Fourth Degree uniform. The photo hangs in the room of **Mrs. Anita Campeau** who expressed several times how much she and her late husband SK Jean enjoyed the Knights of Columbus. When SK Jean moved to the Windsor area, he became engaged in and was an organizer for Knights of Columbus insurance.

SK Jean was proud of his French heritage and was a member of Conseil St-Jérôme and St-Jérôme Church.
