Our friend and Sir Knight Alan Sims died on April 25, 2025 at the age of 84 years. Many brothers and Sir Knights from his former Councils 9671 and Windsor Most Precious Blood Councils 1453 kept in touch with Alan through the last few years where his challenging health issues kept him in and out of hospital care.....along with a broken arm and a broken hip from his falls. Through all of this, SK Al kept his spirits up and welcomed visitors while confined to his home and while in the hospital.

His interest in *'The Knights'* never waned and I believe this kept his spirits up through challenging medical times. Alan remained concerned about what was happening at the McGivney Statue Site, talked about having a large Pig Roast to raise funds. He suggested that there should be a movement to create a local 'K of C Museum' so that the significant local supply of artifacts and remembrance items that were held by local councils and assemblies could be retained and displayed for encouragement of others.

SK Alan and his dear late wife Barbara were both converts to the faith and Alan quickly became a member of Victor C. Côté Council 9671 where he eventually became Grand Knight. When Alan was treasurer and Dennis Drew was GK of 9671, the initiative was born to create the McGivney Statue Site at Heavenly Rest Cemetery. A fundraising program was launched and a statue was commissioned to be made in Vietnam. The total cost of the statue and monuments was \$40,000.00. The statue was officially dedicated by Bishop Anthony Daniels on September 25, 2005. SK Alan has remained committed to the McGivney Site ever since. SK Alan was also instrumental in the fine project initiated by Council 9671 to make crucifixes and small altars from the red oak of the pews of St. Gregory the Great Church.

SK Alan was my mentor when I served as his warden in District 76. He very much savored the fraternity of visiting councils and he always shared a motivating, long, message.

During covid, a sizeable group of knights met on his front lawn on Pheasant Run to wish him a Happy Eightieth. SK Alan was active with the Degree Team and served as Membership Information Officer. As a 'convert' he indeed left his mark with the Order!

SK Alan was very much a proponent of the miniature statues of the revered statue at the McGivney Site. *(These replicas are still available at a cost of \$85.00). (As well, Alan would approve of a reminder about the newer granite 'Heritage Bricks' that are available for \$100.00 or \$150.00)*

SK Alan was the father of Jane Munkasci, Andrew Sims (Shelley), and Christopher Sims. He was the grandfather to Sarah (Pat), Nicholas (Shawna), Melissa (Robert), Wesley (Daniella), Jonathan, and Brittany (Mike). He is survived by his brother Neil (Gloria) in the United Kingdom, as well as nieces and nephews and extended family overseas.

Born in Wales, Alan met his wife Barbara and they married in 1961. In 1977, he relocated his family to Canada, settling in Tecumseh.

Alan had served as a constable in the Gwent Constabulary in Gwent, Wales, from March 1961 to October 1977. Prior to his retirement, he was a Family Counsellor with the Windsor Catholic Family of Cemeteries and was employed at Heavenly Rest.

The McGivney Site Steering Committee invites all to a Memorial Service to honour his memory and to render thanks for his contributions. The gathering will take place on Friday, June 20, 2025 at 7 p.m. at Heavenly Rest Cemetery. All are welcome.

Those with the Fourth Degree Uniform are asked to wear it so as to join in a parade to the McGivney Statue Site. In case of inclement weather, the service will take place in the St. Francis of Assisi Mausoleum that looks out onto the McGivney Site.

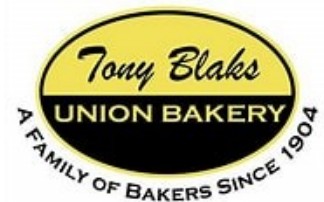
