since my youth and whom I have admired as community and church leaders, gather to support others in their time of grief. 





Canada Day Parade 2025...

.... A fine example of Patriotism and Fraternalism in practice!

July 1st, being a bright sunny day was a breeze, was a good backdrop to the ambitious K of C entry into this year's Canada Day Parade. The presence of the Fourth Degree Color Party and Honour Guard has been a staple for many years as Dean Wagner Assembly has hosted and encouraged participation in this parade. But, this year, the entry featured the re-sided bright red maple leaf, mounted on a 2 ft. stem, hailed the wording in bold white lettering....'...the True North strong and free....". This happened top be the theme of his year's parade as defined by the Windsor Parade Corporation.

Placed on the perimeter of the float bed, were 13 flags of the provinces and territories. Two Ontario K of C 125th flags, were draped from the back corner with 2 Canadian flags on the front. In remembrance of the late SK Al Sims who was a member of the McGivney Statute Site Committee whose members spearheaded the float, two 12 inch McGivney Statues, modelled from the statue at Heavenly Rest, were mounted on the float as were 2 samples of the 8 inch Heritage bricks and two of the wooden crucifixes that were made by Council 9671 from the red oak wood of the pews of St. Gregory the Great Church. (This was a fundraising project of which Al had been engrossed.) If nothing else, these items were meaningful for those of us remembering SK Al.)

Bro. Carl also mounted two loud speakers under the floor of the float and coupled with an amplifier, rang out **Oh Canada** in both official languages. Riding the float was John Semaan who was equipped with a microphone.

(Rarely thou, does John require amplification.)

Between the flag bearers, the Honour Guard ands the float were six knights carrying a 15 ft. by 7.5 foot flag. Former District Master Gord Edwards towed the float with his pickup.

By and large the parade route was well lined with spectators, particuarly in the shady areas. The K of C entry received generous applause of approval and the sentiment of 'Thank you for your service' weas overheard several times.

Thank you to Dean Wagner Assembly and Frank Galtieri who hosted a lunch back at St. Alphonsus Church Hall.

Thanks also to SKs John Chenier and Jack Regnier who made a supplied a coleslaw salad to supplement the hot dog lunch. The McGivney Steering Committee who oversees the statue site at Heavenly Rest, will be paying for the lunch.

With the success of this year's entry, it is hoped that more third and fourth degree knights, their families, and squires will come out and display gratitude for being Canadian!

FUND ASSURES FUTURE OF BASILICA

Following the novena mass, **Bishop**Jeffrey Monforton shared that a new fund has assured \$30 million for the restoration of the Church and that an additional \$20 million endowment will assure the basilica is cared for 'into perpetuity'.

The Catholic Initiative, a non-profit created by the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation will provide these funds to restore the basilica which will take three years. The restoration will be carried out by the same firm that has restored the Detroit train station. In addition to the complete restoration of the basilica and the parish facility, the project will include a new outdoor pavilion, enhanced land-scaping and lighting and a prayer wall for reflection.

Following the Novena Mass, DM Gene Suchtya treated all the Honour Guard to a lunch at the nearby Mexican Village Restaurant. Thank you for your kind hospitality! The Honour Guard also led a procession bearing a statue of Ste. Anne adorned with flowers through the aisles of the church. The mass was celebrated in French and English.

The back page of SK Andy's Remembrance Card bore a friendly wave from Andy, with the phrase 'Thanks for the Party' with a Fourth Degree logo in the background. This seemed most fitting, as for quite some time, Andy was the promoter and host of many a dinner gathering at the Michigan Restaurant in the old meeting room of Cardinal Stepanic Council. SK Andy was known for 'working the phones' to ensure a good attendance.

Referring to Andy's published obituary, he died after a brief struggle on August 5, 2025 and was just shy of his 82nd birthday. He was listed as...'the cherished husband and best friend of Joyce (nee Russell) for 59 years. He was the loving father of Troy (Terra Arnason) and Tricia (John Leach). Dear grandfather of Jace, Tyler, Cory, and Alexandra. He is survived by his sister Leslie Hazlett and will be deeply missed by many nieces, nephews and in-laws. His obit goes on to share that he was a Ford retiree after over 30+ years of service, was a proud longtime member of the K of C Assembly 2289, and was involved with Windsor East Little League, Windsor Minor Hockey and was very active in the Catholic Church.

In the days of the 'old regalia' many may remember Andy joining in community parades and ceremonial and religious events. Other capsules in his obituary recalled Andy as a talented woodworker, and that he enjoyed golf, drawing, traveling and 'yelling at overpaid athletes', that he loved life and that his last words were .." Thanks for the party".

As knights, we appreciate the family for scheduling K. of C. prayers at his wake on August 10th and for welcoming the Honour Guard at his funeral mass.
