From the Pastor's Pen ~

Sunday Reflection

The 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time brings a message of hope, calling, and unity. The readings show how God's light shines in the darkness, how Jesus calls ordinary people to follow Him, and how the Church should stay united in faith. These themes remind people to trust in God's plan and to live as followers of Jesus. No matter the struggles or differences, God continues to guide His people.

Many people feel like they are in darkness at times. Life can be full of struggles, disappointments, and uncertainty. The message this Sunday reminds people that God's light is still shining. Jesus is present, bringing hope and calling people to trust in Him.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus calls fishermen to follow Him. God does not ask people to be perfect before they follow Him. He calls people just as they are. The Gospel this week encourages people to trust that God can use them, no matter their background or abilities. All that is needed is a willing heart.

The Church is made up of many different people with different backgrounds and talents. This diversity should be a strength, not a reason for arguments. He invites everyone to follow Him, no matter their background or abilities. He also calls people to work together in faith, not letting differences cause division. L'Évangile de cette semaine encourage les gens à croire que Dieu peut les utiliser, quels que soient leur origine ou leurs capacités. Tout ce qu'il faut, c'est un cœur ouvert.

L'Église est composée de nombreuses personnes différentes, avec des origines et des talents différents. Cette diversité devrait être une force, et non une source de discorde. Il invite tout le monde à le suivre, quels que soient leurs origines ou leurs capacités. Congratulations Emelda Byrne

It was recently announced that one of our parishioners will be awarded The Herb Gray Harmony Award, presented by WFCU Credit Union. This award recognizes individuals that have made outstanding contributions toward building a welcoming and inclusive community. The 2026 recipient is Emelda Byrne who has dedicated more than 35 years to Catholic education in Windsor–Essex, shaping learning environments that prioritize equity, dignity, accessibility and student success.

Byrne began her career in 1987 with the Windsor-Essex Catholic District School Board (WECDSB), serving in a wide range of roles including classroom teacher, vice-principal, principal, and senior administrator. In 2021, she was appointed Director of Education, becoming the first woman in the Board's history to hold this position—an important milestone for educational leadership in our region.
