**Sunday Reflection**

Sunday the Winter Olympics come to an end. It was exciting watching all the athletes trying to perform their best on the world stage. While we tend to hold up those who win a medal, perhaps the real "winners" were the ones who achieved a personal best. They pushed themselves harder than they had ever done. I am always in awe of the dedication and sacrifice that all of these athletes must do to make it to this level of competition. This is especially true since many of them had to start out on this path to excellence while still a child or in early adolescence. The early morning practices, the missed social gatherings with friends, the restrictive diets, the time away from family and friends for training and for competitions. They have to give up a lot if they hope to be successful. Yet what is the prize - a medal around their neck, a bouquet of flowers, and perhaps a stuffed mascot. In today's world, they may also get a lucrative endorsement deal, but that would not have been true in the not-too-distant past. Yet who remembers the names of most of the winners. In the end, one could question, what is all that hard work for? Yet each athlete that I saw interviewed, would not have changed a thing. Switching now to another competition, one that has life-long implications, is the competition for our souls. Do we commit with the same intensity to our eternal life as these athletes? Our "prize" is heaven!

**Réflexion du dimanche**

Dimanche, les Jeux olympiques d'hiver prennent fin. C'était passionnant de voir tous ces athlètes donner le meilleur d'eux-mêmes sur la scène mondiale. Si nous avons tendance à mettre en avant ceux qui remportent une médaille, les véritables « gagnants » sont peut-être ceux qui ont battu leur record personnel. Ils se sont surpassés comme jamais auparavant. Je suis toujours impressionné par le dévouement et les sacrifices que tous ces athlètes doivent consentir pour atteindre ce niveau de compétition. Cela est d'autant plus vrai que beaucoup d'entre eux ont dû s'engager sur cette voie de l'excellence alors qu'ils étaient encore enfants ou au début de l'adolescence. Les entraînements tôt le matin, les réunions entre amis manquées, les régimes alimentaires restrictifs, le temps passé loin de leur famille et de leurs amis pour s'entraîner et participer à des compétitions. Ils doivent renoncer à beaucoup de choses s'ils veulent réussir. Mais quelle est leur récompense ? Une médaille autour du cou, un bouquet de fleurs et peut-être une peluche. Dans le monde d'aujourd'hui, ils peuvent également obtenir un contrat de sponsoring lucratif, mais cela n'aurait pas été le cas dans un passé pas si lointain. Pourtant, qui se souvient des noms de la plupart des vainqueurs ? En fin de compte, on pourrait se demander à quoi sert tout ce travail acharné. Pourtant, tous les athlètes que j'ai vus interviewés n'auraient rien changé. Passons maintenant à une autre compétition, celle qui a des implications pour toute la vie : la compétition pour nos âmes. Nous engageons-nous avec la même intensité pour notre vie éternelle que ces athlètes ? Notre « récompense » est le paradis ! C'est quelque chose que nous devrions tous vouloir atteindre. Pensez-vous qu'un athlète aurait pu se présenter aux Jeux olympiques sans aucun entraînement et simplement dire : « Je suis prêt, donnez-moi une médaille d'or » ?

**Phone Call from the Bishop**

Last week I received a phone from Bishop Fabbro. "Hello Matt, how are you doing...I have been getting reports about your Family of Parishes..." I thought, "oh no, what is he going to say next?" He continued by saying that he has been getting many good reports about all the progress we are making as a Family of Parishes.
