Easter Triduum Celebrations

With the introduction of the Family of Parishes Model, the diocese wanted Families to assess their celebrations of the Eucharist to evaluate whether they were providing the best experiences possible for their parishioners. Those who did such an assessment and made changes to the quantity of Masses in their Family have discovered the gift of celebrating the Eucharist in fuller, more vibrant churches. By bringing the parishioners together, they found it fostered stronger bonds and more connected communities within the Family of Parishes, created more vibrant and engaging liturgical experiences, and it allowed for better use of the time and talent of musicians, choirs and other liturgical ministers. This created an environment where the celebrations allowed the presence of Christ to be not just felt in the Eucharist, but in the palpable energy of a united community. Recognizing that the Easter Triduum celebrations are the climax of our liturgical year and how important coming together is for these central celebrations of our faith, we have looked at our schedule and attendance over the last few years. While having only one celebration for each of the Triduum “days” would be the most reflective of gathering as one Body in Christ, we determined that logistically that would not be possible. However, we discovered that having only two celebrations for Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil would be possible with a full complement of services on Good Friday. So, what we are going to try this year is to have two celebrations on Holy Thursday (at St. Simon and St. Jude and at Good Shepherd) and two celebrations of the Easter Vigil (at Ste. Anne and Good Shepherd) with the thinking being that we would rotate the locations each year. We will have Good Friday Services at Ste. Anne, Good Shepherd and St. Simon and St. Jude. Fr. Christophe will be working with the francophone community at St. Jerome to determine their schedule. Based upon the desire of the diocese and the experience of other Families, we will try this for this year and see what may need to be changed next year.

Ceux qui ont procédé à cette évaluation et ont modifié le nombre de messes dans leur famille ont découvert le bonheur de célébrer l'Eucharistie dans des églises plus pleines et plus vivantes. En rassemblant les paroissiens, ils ont constaté que cela renforçait les liens et créait des communautés plus unies au sein de la famille de paroisses, offrait des expériences liturgiques plus vivantes et plus engageantes, et permettait une meilleure utilisation du temps et du talent des musiciens, des chorales et des autres ministres liturgiques. Cela a créé un environnement où les célébrations permettaient de ressentir la présence du Christ non seulement dans l'Eucharistie, mais aussi dans l'énergie palpable d'une communauté unie. Conscients que les célébrations du Triduum pascal sont le point culminant de notre année liturgique et qu'il est important de se réunir pour ces célébrations centrales de notre foi, nous avons examiné notre calendrier et la fréquentation au cours des dernières années. Bien qu'une seule célébration pour chacun des « jours » du Triduum reflète le mieux le rassemblement en un seul Corps dans le Christ, nous avons déterminé que cela n'était pas possible sur le plan logistique. Cependant, nous avons découvert qu'il serait possible d'avoir seulement deux célébrations pour le Jeudi saint et la Veillée pascale, avec une série complète de services le Vendredi saint. Nous allons donc essayer cette année d'avoir deux célébrations le Jeudi saint (à St. Simon and St. Jude et à Good Shepherd) et deux célébrations de la Veillée pascale (à Ste. Anne et Good Shepherd), en pensant que nous alternerions les lieux chaque année. Nous aurons des services du Vendredi saint à Sainte-Anne, Good Shepherd et St. Simon et St. Jude. Le père Christophe travaillera avec la communauté francophone de St. Jérôme pour déterminer leur programme. Sur la base du souhait du diocèse et de l'expérience d'autres familles, nous allons essayer cela cette année et voir ce qui devra être changé l'année prochaine.
