The Baptism of the Lord, Feast – Sunday, 09 January 2022

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11. Psalm 104:1b-2, 3-4, 24-25, 27-28, 29-30. Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7. Luke 3:5-16, 21-22.

**Prayer.** Jesus himself is baptized by John. Then he prays. In his praying, the Spirit comes and the Father speaks words of possessive pleasure.

- How will I pray this last day of the Christmas season?
- When I am guite enough, what do I hear God say?
- What mercy work does the Spirit empower me to do?

### From the Pastor's Desk

#### **Dear Saint Edward Parish Family:**

This Sunday's readings are full of expectation. What are you waiting for? How do you need God to come and rescue you from injustices, or deliver you from evil, or comfort you as you wait for loved ones to turn their hearts back to God? What guidance have you been seeking while feeling confused and uncertain? Do you feel Christ's gift of peace within you as you wait expectantly? Or do you feel frustrated, worried, and impatient?

In the Gospel reading, we see John the Baptizer's congregation filled with expectancy because they hoped that he was their finally-arrived Messiah. Yearning for God to intervene against injustices, foreign oppression, and sin, they latched onto the fiery enthusiasm of John and his baptism of repentance.

God, however, had something much better in mind, more complete. The real Messiah would baptize with the purifying fire of the Holy Spirit. Whereas John could only call people to repentance, the real Messiah would empower them to grow in holiness by giving them his own Spirit of holiness.

When Jesus submitted himself to John's baptism, it was not because He needed to repent; He was sinless. He was uniting Himself to our need for repentance, thus starting His ministry of delivering us from evil and eventually take our sins to the cross.

In Christian baptism, we are immersed into the holiness of Jesus as well as into His ministry, His priesthood, His prophetic sharing of the Good News, His servant leadership, and yes, His sufferings for the benefit of the salvation of others. The Holy Spirit empowers us to do as Jesus did, and the Father says, "You are my beloved child; with you I am well pleased!"

What do you expect? What do you think should happen in your daily life because of your baptism? Expectation is a good attitude -- unless it's based on impatience, which usually leads to disappointment. Expectation that's based on the goodness of God and what He wants for us is the attitude that brings us joy, greater faith, and even miracles.

# Introducción a la Liturgia de la Palabra

**READINGS: Isaías** 42:1-4, 6-7 **Salmo** 29 **Hechos** 10:34-38 **Lucas** 3:15-16, 21-22

El la primera lectura escuchamos a Isaías proclamar que el elegido, infundido con el espíritu de Dios, traerá la justicia, establecerá una alianza y dará la libertad a los que habitan en tinieblas. Al escuchar sus palabras nos maravillamos de ver cómo Jesus cumplió las profecías de Isaías, pero también estamos conscientes de lo mucho que todavía nosotros tenemos que andar. Escuchemos la palabra de Dios y consideremos cómo Jesus y el Espíritu Santo pueden obrar a través de nosotros para traer luz, bendiciones y justicia para todos.



Jesus, te pido que me renueves con la fuerza del Espíritu Santo. Derrama los dones que necesito para cumplir mi propia misión en este mundo".

a mayoría de nosotros aprendimos en la clase de catecismo que una de las razones por las que necesitamos ser bautizados es para borrar el pecado original de nuestros primeros padres, Adán y Eva. Esto suscita una

importante pregunta sobre la lectura de hoy. ¿Por qué querría Jesus ser bautizado? ¿Acaso no nación sin pecado original? La única manera de responder a esta pregunta es hacernos conscientes de que en el Bautismo hay mucho más que el borrar el pecado original.

Los primeros padres de la Iglesia nos dieron muhas razones por las que Jesus quería ser bautizado. Ciertamente una de ellas era para revelarnos la voluntad y la gloria de Dios. Al ser bautizado, Jesus nos enseñó que nosotros también debemos ser bautizados porque esto agradó a Dios. Y porque nuestro Bautismo es el signo de que, en Jesus, también nosotros somos hijos de Dios.

3. Jesus nos hizo sus hermanos y hermanas, hijos e hijas de Dios.

Ciertamente se escuchó una voz en el Bautismo de Jesus: "Este es mi hijo amado en quien me complazco." Al mismo tiempo, la gloria de Dios se revela al abrirse los cielos y cuando el Espíritu desciende sobre Jesus en forma de paloma. Por supuesto, normal-



mente no experimentamos un bautizo de esta forma. Normalmente sólo vemos al sacerdote derramar agua sobre el bautizado y repetir las palabras del rito bautismal.

Y sin embargo, está ocurriendo algo glorioso y especial si tenemos los oídos espirituales abiertos a oir. En el Bautismo, pasamos a ser hermanos de Cristo, hijos amados de Dios. Porque si escucháramos de manera espiritualmente sensible, podríamos también poder escuchar la complancencia de Dios en todo bautismo...

### Vicky's Voice

Hello Dear Friends!

Do you remember your baptism? Or do you know any stories from your baptism? Last month, in the Confirmation class, we talked

about Baptism and it kind of shocked me that most of the kids couldn't recall the date of their Baptism or know any stories from it. They knew their Godparents,

My Baptism was on March 15, 1987, just 11 days after I was born. Apparently Mom and Dad had waited a bit before Gina was baptized and Fr. Doody wasn't too pleased. So when I came along, they signed me up to get baptized right away. From pictures and stories, I know that there were two other babies who were baptized at the same time. The three of us then kind of grew up together, receiving the sacraments of reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation together. If you are reading this, hi Michelle! I know my Godparents are my Aunt Bea and Uncle Marty. My aunt, later becoming my confirmation sponsor and who still to this day, encourages me in all of my faith endeavors, checking in on how I'm doing. I know my mom still has my baptismal gown and baptismal candle in her hope chest in her room (I know because I've snooped there enough). And I know that there was a party afterwards.

While I can't remember my brother's baptism (sorry Jim, but I was 2 at the time), I do remember some of my younger cousins' baptisms (my Godparents' two daughters, Zoe and Carolyn). I remember gathering around the baptismal font, watching as water was poured over their head. I remember a candle being lit. I remember holding them at their parties afterwards. I remember the cake because of course kids remember what the cake looked like. I remember having to tell my non-Catholic cousins what was going on.

Since then, I've been to a lot of baptisms. For the nieces and nephews, standing next to them as their Godmother. For my friends' kids, two of which are my own Goddaughters. And for you: for the kids at the parish and people welcomed into the faith at the Easter Vigil. Those have been some of my favorite baptisms to go to. There's so much joy in that moment. Babies and kids are so cute because you never know how they might respond to the temperature of the water. A sense of wonder and awe and thanksgiving seeing adults make the choice to be baptized into the Catholic faith.

But also a reminder of my role in the newly baptized person's life. I may not know them. I may not be part of their biological family. But we are now members of the same family of faith. I make a commitment at every baptism to support and pray for that individual in any way I can. It's one of the reasons I love being a catechist. It's a way to fulfill that promise I made at their baptism to support them and their parents and Godparents as they raise their child in the Catholic faith.

On today, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, I highly encourage you to talk with your family about your own baptism or reflect upon your own baptism story. Look at pictures if you have any, talk to your kids about when they were baptized, check in with your Godparents or Godchildren, review the promises you or your parents made when you were baptized.
