


St. Edward Daughters of Isabella would like to thank everyone who purchased our bake goods at our bake sale. We especially want to thank the ladies of the parish,



From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Saint Edward Parish Family:

Alleluia! Celebrate the healing and increased faith that comes from growing closer to Jesus through the faith-building exercises of Lent and the solemn meditations of Holy Week!

The doorway into heaven is the cross. Experiencing the glory of the celebration of Easter -- deep within our hearts, within our needs, within our desires -- began with accepting our sorrows and sacrifices and sufferings that are our own personal connections to Jesus. And now, Easter joy comes not only from accepting what Jesus did for us on the cross but also from continuing the journey, side by side, step by step with Jesus.

When we're sincere about following Christ, if we truly want to grow in faith, we do whatever He does, united to His ministry of helping others grow in their eternal relationship with God. In this, we face the cross again and again. There is no gain in salvation without the pain of sacrificial love.

The victorious alleluia of Easter is the triumph of the cross. It's the realization that life doesn't have to be free of troubles in order to be full of joy. It's the day -to-day living out of a faith that comes from trusting that God is carrying us through the trials and bringing good out of bad.

Our cross is a soft word that we speak when someone else is angry and we feel like shouting. Our cross is a hand outstretched to comfort the afflicted when it's inconvenient and we feel like withdrawing. Our cross is a good deed that we do to those who treat us unjustly and we feel like retaliating. And our resurrection is the joy that comes from knowing that we have made a difference in the lives of others for the sake of God's Kingdom.

Love that's given when it's difficult is a suffering love, a passionate love, a salvific love, i.e., it benefits the eternal lives of others. Then, our sacrifices have a value of endless worth. This is so much better than a self-serving, easy life. It's eternally better! Easter Sunday Mass is the celebration of rising with Jesus into glorious victory over evil.

He is risen. He is risen, indeed. Alleluia! Alleluia! May God Bless and Keep You Always!



Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

READINGS:

raise this question to all of you who read these words as I along with Fr. Rick offer you our Easter greetings. These words were pronounced by two angels in the appearance of men who appeared to the group of women who had come to anoint the dead body of Jesus in the tomb.

Jesus is alive! He is not dead. The Cross was the step to the Resurrection. As long as we dwell on the difficulties and sufferings in our life in a spirit of despair, as if Jesus was not able to give us hope, then we are doing the same thing the women did on the morning of Easter. We are looking for Jesus as if he was dead, while in fact He is alive and close to each one of us.

But we have to marvel at the love and perseverance of these women. After all, they continued in their love and affection for Jesus, and this is what we are called to imitate during this Easter Season. We must look for Jesus, and continue searching for opportunities to show Him our love, especially where He is alive in His Risen Body at Holy Mass. We hear in the Gospel of St. John that Mary Magdalene was rewarded for her perseverance by the tomb by seeing the risen Jesus and receiving the commission to proclaim his Resurrection to his apostles.

May we too, as we rejoice with Mary, the Mother of Jesus in the Resurrection of her Son, be filled with joy and hope during these days, eager to help those around us to proclaim the Good News of Easter.

Vicky's Voice

Hello Dear Friends!

He is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! Happy and Blessed Easter to you, dear friend!

I always get nervous writing reflections for big, important holy days, like Easter and Christmas. I always want to write something that sounds profound or moving, only to be stumped as I look at my blank Google doc, empty thoughts reflected by the blinking cursor.

But today, when I was reflecting on the Easter readings (of which there are a lot), three words kept coming to my mind: See, go, announce. Today, we listen to the Gospel stories of the women going to anoint the body of Jesus, only to **see** an empty tomb. They then **go** back to their friends and the apostles, who are hiding in fear of their lives. Lastly, they **announce** what they have seen and experienced and in doing so, invite others to do the same. See. Go. Announce.

Three ordinary words. Actions. Things that we all do often. And, in relation to the Resurrection which we are celebrating today, things we are still called to do.

See: Take time today to really take in what you will see and experience or what you saw during Mass. What kind of music did you hear? What stories were told? How did the homily move you? What is Christ speaking to you at this moment? What is your own faith story?

Go: Where are you called to go? Who are you called to go to? So moved by the experience of the Resurrection, what are we called to do next? Announce: Once we figure out where we are called to go and what we are called to say, we need to say it! And not just say it, but announce it. How can you share your own faith story? How can you talk to others about your relationship with Christ? How can you show in your words and actions what Jesus means to you?

This was how our faith was passed down. The women who went to the tomb, Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James, saw the empty tomb, went back to their friends and family members, and

then announced what they experienced. If they weren't open to encountering the Risen Christ, if they didn't go to their friends, if they didn't announce what they experienced, we would be very different people. But they didn't. They overcame their fear and ran back to announce their experiences. Are you ready to do the

Happy Easter dear friends! Praying for you as you go and announce the Gospel!


