EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - THE LITTLE DRUMMER BOY

Did you know that the only reason we say that there were three wise men is that they

brought three gifts? The Bible never says their number or their names. The gifts tell us about the givers. And these special gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—tell us much.

When one king visited or sent an ambassador to another, he would give a gift of gold to show that he acknowledged the kingship of the other. So the first gift of the wise men tells us they recognized Jesus as King. The second gift is a type of incense, which was used in Jesus time to worship God. So this gift shows the wise men paying homage to Jesus' divinity. The gift of myrrh is oil used to anoint the dying. It reminds us of Jesus suffering and death on the cross. So what gifts do we have for Jesus? Maybe we can take a hint from the wise men. If we acknowledge Jesus as king, maybe a better gift than gold would be to pledge our obedience to him. Each day we can promise to live our vocation as best we can, to love those around us, and forgive those who hurt us.

A better way than burning incense to pay homage to Jesus' divinity is to take time to pray throughout the day. Some people are able to attend daily Mass, others spend time in adoration before the Eucharist, or even a few minutes of their lunch break to say the rosary.

As for the gift of myrrh, we can give Jesus the crosses we bear each day. When we accept suffering in our lives, especially that caused by our sins, we give ourselves to Jesus as he gave himself for us on the cross.

The song "Little Drummer Boy" reminds us that the best gift is not necessarily the most expensive. Instead, it is the simple gift that only we can give. Let Epiphany remind us to offer our lives to Jesus each day.

They died for the Eucharist. Would you? (Part I)

Many of our brothers and sisters, from our own day to the beginnings of the Church, have given their lives for Jesus hidden in the Host.

A recent poll suggests that too few Catholics believe in the real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. That leaves it to those of us who believe to KNOW and SPREAD the faith.

But there are some Christians who knew with such certainty that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament that they faced danger to be with him, and there are some who died rather than let the Blessed Sacrament fall into the wrong hands. Here are some of their stories.

Siblings Killed at Easter Mass, 2019

In much of the world, going to Mass is never taken for granted. Sharon Stephen Santhakumar and Sarah Epzhibah Santhakumar were just two victims for the Easter bombings of Sri Lankan Christian communities on April 20. Islamist terrorists have targeted Eucharist-believing Christians (Catholics, Chaldeans, Copts and Orthodox) for years, such as Ragheed Ganni. That Easter brought a painful sadness, as bombers attacked churches and hotels on Easter Sunday. Aleteia reports: The toll was highest at St. Sebastian's Church in the seaside fishing town of Negombo, where about a third of the victims died while attending Mass.

Father Hameed, Martyred at the Altar, 2018

Are you happiest at Mass? Fr. Hamel was. And that is where he died. On July 26, 2018, two men armed with knives burst into Saint-Etienne-du-Rouyray parish in Rouen, France. There, Fr. Jacques Hamel, 86, who had been a priest for 58 years, was celebrating Mass, which he called "the essential element" of his every day. His sister said her brother "was transformed at the moment of consecration...the more he aged, the more it was the passion of Christ that he lived. Terrorist burst into Mass one Thursday morning promising to "do away with" all Christians. They drove the old priest to his knees and slit his throat at the altar, shouting "Allah akbar!".

Paul Comtois Ran into a Fire, 1966

Is your faith in the Eucharist strong enough that you would rush into a burning fire to save It? Paul Comtois was a lieutenant governor of Quebec. A devout Catholic, he said the Rosary daily with his wife and five children. The family lived in an official residence, where they got the very rare permission to have the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a tabernacle for the family's private worship. Said his daughter, "When he finally was given permission, it was on condition that he be personally responsible for its safe and proper keeping. And my father was a man who lived up to his obligations at all costs." On midnight of February 21, 1966, a fire swept though his house. The father go the family safely out, then went back for the Blessed Sacrament. His body was found badly burnt, but still safely guarding the pyx containing the hosts.

Fr. Brenner died Saving the Host, 1957

Fr. James Brenner saved the Eucharist while being stabbed dozens of times. On December 14, 1957, Fr. James Brenner, a Cistercian Hungarian priest, was called to give Last Rites and final Eucharist to a dying man. The call was a lie. The priest was being set up by Communists. Revolutionaries in Hungary had been suppressing Catholics for years. Fr. Brenner was ordained during the worst of the persecution. Now, as he went out on the fake sick call, he carried the anointing oils and the Blessed Sacrament in a pyx. Attackers leapt out of the trees and stabbed him 32 times. His body was found the next day, still clutching the Eucharist in his hands, refusing to give it up. The ambush backfired. The priest is revered as a martyr, and a chapel was built on the spot where he died. His bloody surplice hangs inside as a relic.






