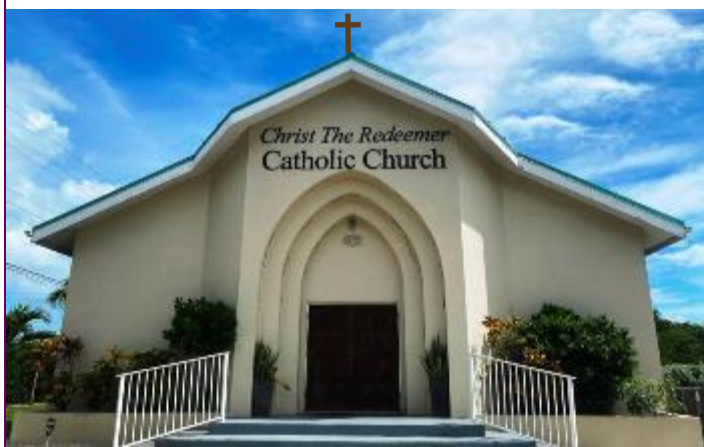

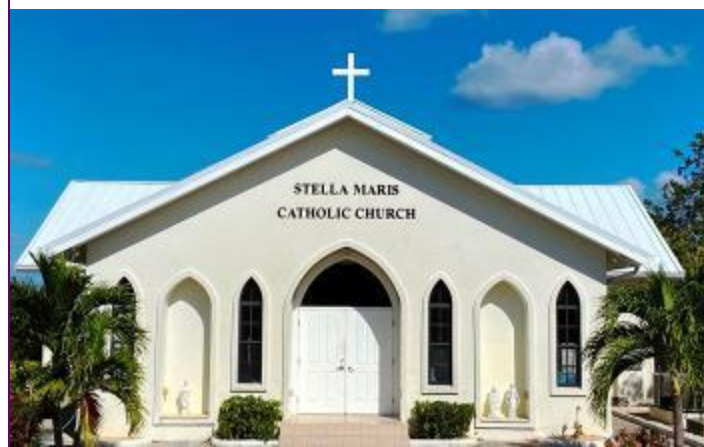

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

"Christ took away our infirmities and bore our diseases." (Matthew 8:17)

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – WHAT DO YOU WANT?

Jesus was starting to become very popular, at least with the ordinary people. They had seen how he had cured the sick and cast out demons. The gospel has one unusual sentence about those demons: Jesus did not let them speak "because they knew who he was." (Mk 1:34) Apparently, the demons would have identified him as the Son of God. Jesus knew the people would not understand this and try to proclaim him as their king. Jesus had no intention of living as a worldly king, in comfort and riches. In fact, he came to free people from needing wealth and power.

Popularity and wealth do not interest St. Paul, either. When he preaches the gospel, the good news of Christ's resurrection (and ours), he needs no other recompense. (1 Cor 9:18) All he wants is to share eternal life. He specifically refuses to be paid for his preaching, to show that he will be rewarded by Christ.

So what do you hope for; what is your goal in life? Do you only feel secure when you have saved enough money and invested it wisely? Do you need other people to make you happy? Or at least a few hundred Facebook friends? Or are you like Job in the first reading: having no hope of escaping a life of drudgery? He eventually found that only by trusting God can anyone be happy, even when things go wrong.

We can follow Paul's example of love for all people no matter who they are. Paul's love was not to make others like him. He genuinely wanted to bring the good news to them: by his love for them, Paul showed that God loves them even more. He knew the gospel requires a change of heart, so his love for others helped them to be more open to change. Let us ask the Lord to fill us with his love, so that we can help each other to hear the good news.

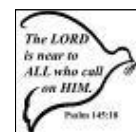

PARISH YEAR OF EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



Prayer is Eucharistic

Fr. Peter John Cameron, OP -

The Eucharist is what is most real in the world. The mystery of the Eucharist contains a divine power making it the principle of new life within us

To the extent that all prayer is thanksgiving toward God, prayer is Eucharistic. For the word “Eucharist” means thanksgiving.

How good it is to pray often in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament. If we are not sure what to do during Eucharistic Adoration, we might pray in words inspired by the beautiful apostolic exhortation [Sacramentum Caritatis](#).

I believe that in the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us, desiring to become one with us.

- Christ nourishes us by uniting us to himself; he draws us into himself.
- O Jesus, come and meet me and be my companion along the way.
- Our wounded nature would go astray were it not already able to experience something of future fulfillment. We find that in your Eucharist.
- The mystery of the Eucharist contains a divine power making it the principle of new life within us. Lord Jesus, let me experience that new life!
- The Eucharist makes possible, day by day, the constant transfiguration of those who believe. May my life more and more reflect the image of the Son of God.
- The radical newness brought by Jesus in the Eucharist touches every aspect of our existence. Lord Jesus, let the grace of the Eucharist reach my most trying challenges and struggles.
- Lord Jesus, may the Eucharist provide me with moral energy for sustaining a life of authentic freedom lived for God.
- The memorial of the Eucharist keeps me mindful that each of us, united with Jesus, is called to be bread broken for the life of the world.
- May the Gift of the Eucharist give new impulse to my life and commit me to becoming a witness of love.

May the sacrament of the Eucharist keep me committed to doing everything for God's glory. We can close our time of Eucharistic Adoration by meditating on these words of Catholic author François Mauriac: The Eucharist is what is most real in the world. The person who once pronounces this acceptance will no longer be able to keep away from Communion (whereas formerly they may have been unable to refrain from committing sin). When tormented by doubt, by anguish, by troubles of the soul and of the flesh, in the midst of the worst perturbations of mind and soul, they will be safe as long as they remain worthy to sit at the banquet — prepared to alleviate all miseries. It is not when everything seems to be lost that one must forsake the Host; on the contrary, it is when all seems lost and, if the state of grace is maintained or recovered, that one must feed on the Host and rely on the solemn and reiterated promises of the Lord. The Eucharist never deceived those who remained faithful to it through all vicissitudes; Christ is never the first to leave us.

Heartfelt thanks to Bishop Cepeda for traveling down to confirm our teens. Our Parish and teens mean so much to him and we thank him for his leadership.

Last week Saturday, Pope Francis met with a group of children, about the age of our 22 Confirmandi. It was an opportunity for him to have a conversation with them as they drew close to their Confirmation day. First he asked them if they knew the date of their Baptism. Then he went on to encourage their parents and them to reflect on the important day of their Baptism and to celebrate it each year, just like they would celebrate their actual birthday. "Have a cake made with candles, too! An extra cake... not bad!", said the Pope. He went on to emphasize the relationship we enter into with God and the Church on the day of our Baptism. He shared that at Baptism the Holy Spirit came to make our hearts his home. He also spoke of our share in eternity through our Baptism.

Reflecting on the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Father explains that Confirmation serves to solidify and strengthen the commitments and promises we made at Baptism. **He outlined the roles played by the Holy Spirit and the Church, saying that through Confirmation we "accept this mission as a personal commitment, as protagonists and not spectators".** (Vatican News)

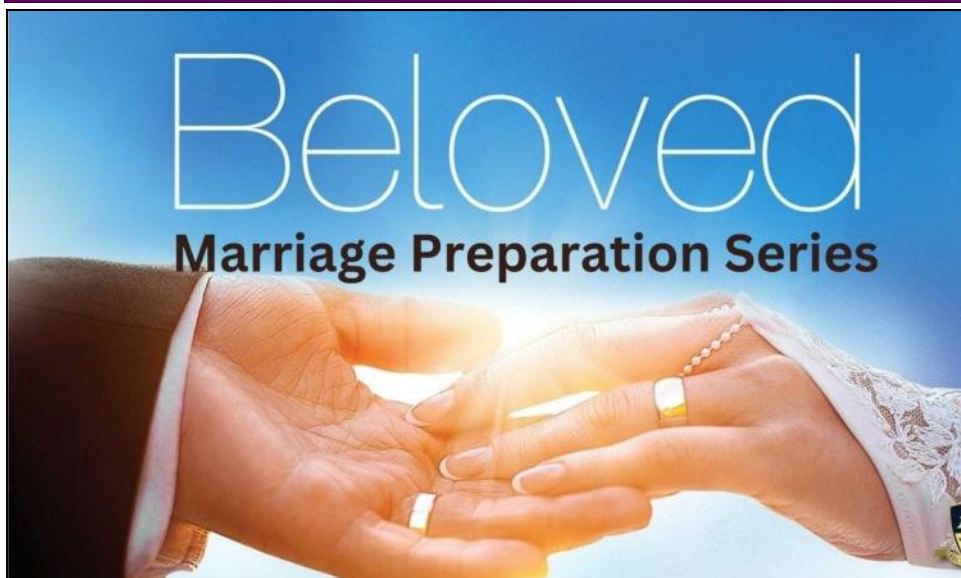
The Holy Father then held up a Saint of our times as a model for the teens, Blessed Carlo Acutis, whose statue is copied below.

This article felt like the Holy Father was speaking directly to our teens who are being Confirmed this weekend. We pray his words of wisdom will find room in their

hearts. For two and a half years these young men and women have been preparing for this special day. All of them have been attending Masses regularly on Saturday evenings or Sundays. They have parents who are great models of the Catholic faith as so it has been easy for them to commit their lives to living it. Of this group of teens, 9 of the young men are faithful altar servers. Some of the young ladies are readers at Mass, volunteers at Vacation Bible School and Fish Fry. Last Easter a group of these young people met up and took on the task of sorting and counting coins from the Rice Bowl Appeal. Thank you to their parents for being committed to this process of Confirmation preparation. Thank you also to their Catechists, Julius Aurelio and Blaise Ting who started out with them two and a half years ago and have lovingly committed to journeying with them to their Confirmation Day. **Teens, "Be a Saint! What else is there?"**

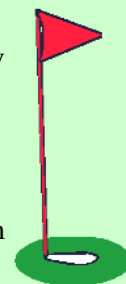

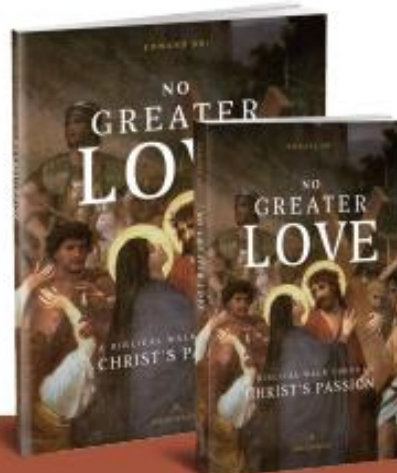

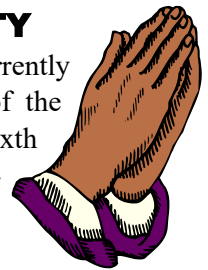
