

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Isiah 50:4-7

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

"Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name."

(Phil 2:8-9)

With Friends Like These...

This year, we hear the Passion from the gospel of Mark. One thing unique about this reading is the emphasis on Jesus being abandoned by his disciples. First, the leaders of the disciples, Peter, James, and John, cannot even support Jesus in his agony in the garden: They fall asleep, three times. Then there is Judas, who seeks out the chief priests to make a deal with them, Peter, who denies Jesus three times, and the disciples who flee when he is arrested. The crowds who cried, "Hosanna!" a few days before, now call for him to be crucified. Even Simon the Cyrenian had to be forced to help carry the cross. What does this tell us? With friends like these, who needs enemies? No, the point is that Jesus died specifically for these people, not because they were once friends, but because they were sinners, who needed Jesus. All but one of them ended up as saints. And the one who didn't was Judas, who gave up on Jesus, instead of coming back to him for forgiveness. When we find ourselves in sin, when we think that everything we do is wrong, or when we think we can't possibly deserve to be loved by God—that is when God can help us, if we just stop hating ourselves and start loving and trusting the Lord. It is not the time to pretend we have avoided the big sins, or to brag about some of the good we may have done. Instead of trying to convince God that we deserve his mercy, simply agree that you need his help. God loves sinners who know they need his forgiveness and don't deserve it.

But maybe you have already been forgiven and wonder what's next. Remember the ones you would not expect to support Jesus: The centurion supervising his crucifixion proclaims him Son of God. A member of the Sanhedrin gives Jesus a burial place. The women who were there to the end. These were people who did not claim to be worthy, just did what they could to show their love. Ask Jesus each morning when you wake up, "What can I do for you today?" and do what you can.

How the Eucharist is a Sacrifice we need

Your sacrifice on the cross put an end to all the crippling shame that has kept me closed in on myself, depressed and in darkness. Your death has set me free ...


The human compulsion to offer sacrifice to God goes right back to the beginning of time. Abel "brought one of the best firstlings of his flock" (Gn 4:4) and offered it to God in sacrifice. Once the flood waters receded and the ark rested securely on land, Noah "built an altar to the Lord and offered holocausts on the altar" (Gn 8:20). Abraham was so devoted to God that he was willing to sacrifice even his own beloved son in obedience to God (Gn 23:9-14). When the ark of the covenant was returned to Jerusalem and "set in its place, David offered holocausts and peace offerings before the Lord" (2 Samuel 6:17).


What moves all these holy people to offer sacrifice is their mindfulness of the great works of God carried out on their behalf. But God has given us something that can't begin to compare with what he gave to Abel, Noah, Abraham, and David. God has so loved us that he sent us his only Son. And that Son, Jesus, died on a cross for us. How can we possibly ever honour that? What could ever be enough?

The only adequate response to God's extravagant generosity to us is to make a gift to him of what he has given us. The Eucharist is a sacrifice: the "human response to God's creative act of mercy" (Fr. Colman O'Neill, O.P.). The liturgical offering of the Eucharist is our sacrificial act of saying thank you. By our union with Christ as Mass, our sacrifice of thanks is joined with Jesus' sacrifice of himself to the Father.

The wonder of love radiating from the Eucharist moves us to exclaim: Thank you, Jesus, for dying for me. Your sacrifice on the cross put an end to all the crippling shame that has kept me closed in on myself, depressed and in darkness. Your death has set me free, lifted me up, filled me with joy, blessed me with hope, energized me, animated me, given me a passion for life I could not find otherwise. I love you, Jesus. I thank you, Jesus. Your sacrifice makes me want to make my life an unending sacrifice to you.





* The 8:00 am and 10:15 am Masses begin in front of Loyola Hall, followed by the procession to the Church. Please arrive extra early to allow time for parking and assembling in front of the Hall.

Sunday, March 24 at Christ the Redeemer (West Bay):

- Start by holding the palm with the pointed end down.
- Fold the flat edge down. This will be the top of the cross. (How far you fold the edge down will depend on the length of your palm.)
- Take the pointed end of the palm and fold it upward, towards the bottom of the first fold. This is the bottom of the cross. You will now have the vertical part of the cross. (Make sure you have enough palm left to make the horizontal part of the cross.)
- Taking the remaining part of the palm, you will make a small fold where the two ends meet so that the palm is now horizontal.
- Make a loop on the right, bringing the palm behind the vertical part of the cross and make a loop on the left. You will now have the horizontal part of the cross.
- Holding all sections in the middle with your thumb, use your free hand to take the small remaining part of the palm to wrap it around the center of the cross in the shape of an 'x.' This will hold it all together.
- Once you are left will the small tip of the palm tuck it underneath the part used to hold the cross all together.

MASS ATTIRE

Sacred Scripture — in Psalm 29, Psalm 96, and 1 Chronicles — calls us to "worship the Lord in holy attire and splendid in holiness", and all parishioners are asked to reflect on the way that we dress as we prepare to attend Mass.

BAPTISMS



I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those who trust in My Mercy...." (Diary 687)


