

This Weekend's Readings

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

"I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. ." (John 10:14)

The Rejected Savior

In the reading of Acts, Peter explains to the leaders of Israel how they cured a crippled man. They probably expected Peter to take credit for the cure, so they were waiting for him to hang himself by his words. Peter, of course, gives the credit to Jesus and then makes two important points.

First he calls Jesus the "stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone." This quote from Psalm 118 was used often by the early Christians to show the Jesus was rejected by fellow Jews when he was crucified, but was actually doing God's will when he gave his life on the cross. Thus he became not just a martyr, but the savior of the world. This gave comfort to those who had expected the leaders of Israel to follow Jesus and recognize him as the Messiah. It also told those leaders that they could be forgiven for crucifying Jesus if they would simply repent.

The second point made by Peter was that Jesus is the one and only savior of the world. In those days, the Roman emperor was considered to be a god and was called a savior. Peter says this to the leaders because they had to obey the emperor and his appointed rulers over Israel. While we no longer look to politicians to be saviors, we need to remember that Jesus is the Savior: he forgives our sins, shows us how to love God and our neighbors, and hears our prayers. He lives in us to support us when the answer to our prayer is "no." And in the end, he is with us when we die to bring us to eternal life. When we love others (and are loved by others) we experience a taste of God's love. Now the Choice is yours: to reject the Savior or make Him the cornerstone of your life.

PARISH YEAR OF EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival



Can the Eucharist help prevent us from committing future sin?

St. Thomas Aquinas explains that receiving the Eucharist can spiritually strengthen us, as long as we are open to God's grace.

There are many spiritual benefits from receiving the Eucharist on a regular basis, and one of those benefits is the strengthening of our soul, that we may more easily resist the allure of future sins. St. Thomas Aquinas explains this effect of the sacrament in his *Summa Theologiae* by first framing the objection.

It seems that man is not preserved by this sacrament from future sins. For there are many that receive this sacrament worthily, who afterwards fall into sin. Now this would not happen if this sacrament were to preserve them from future sins. Consequently, it is not an effect of this sacrament to preserve from future sins. This is a very rational argument, as we experience this ourselves whenever we receive Holy Communion and then continue on our life of sin.

However, St. Thomas Aquinas explains why we this reality shouldn't distract us from the reality of God's grace given to us. [T]his sacrament preserves man from sin ... For, first of all, by uniting man with Christ through grace, it strengthens his spiritual life, as spiritual food and spiritual medicine, according to Psalm 103:5: "(That) bread strengthens [Vulgate: 'may strengthen'] man's heart." Augustine likewise says (Tract. xxvi in Joan.): "Approach without fear; it is bread, not poison." Secondly, inasmuch as it is a sign of Christ's Passion, whereby the devils are conquered, it repels all the assaults of demons. Hence Chrysostom says (Hom. xlvi in Joan.): "Like lions breathing forth fire, thus do we depart from that table, being made terrible to the devil."

At the same time, the key to preventing future sins is contingent on the person's openness to God's grace.

The effect of this sacrament is received according to man's condition: such is the case with every active cause in that its effect is received in matter according to the condition of the matter. But such is the condition of man on earth that his free-will can be bent to good or evil. Hence, although this sacrament of itself has the power of preserving from sin, yet it does not take away from man the possibility of sinning.

If we receive the Eucharist in a state of sin, closed-off from God's grace, then we will likely continue sinning for the foreseeable future.

However, if we are open and receive God's grace with our whole heart, God will help us in our time of need, protecting us from future temptations.


PARKING SAFEFTY

APPEAL FOR ASSISTING NAJIB CHEHWAN


