



Caution: Three-in-One Love

When I was much younger, I used to think that God was totally invisible, not to be experienced as the people in the bible did. After all, they heard God's voice in the fiery cloud; they saw the waters parted so they could pass through—all the things that Moses talks about in the first reading. But then I ask myself, do I want my faith to be based on special effects? Do I want to be like the people who believe in extra-terrestrials because they saw a light in the sky that they could not explain? Or do I want to trust Jesus, who told Thomas, "Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed." (Jn 20:29)

Jesus was referring to his resurrection appearances, but it also applies to the Holy Trinity. When we see a newborn child, she can remind us of God the Father creating the earth and all living things. When we see the cross, we recall Jesus saving death and resurrection. When we share our faith with someone, we know that it is the Holy Spirit who gives us the words to speak and the courage to speak them. Without seeing the pillar of fire that lead the Hebrew from Egyptian slavery, nor the wounds in Jesus' hands after his resurrection, nor the tongues of flame over the apostles at Pentecost—we can still experience God in Three Persons.

The three are not just equal parts of God, one-third of God each. No, they each are totally God. That is why we say God is love: Three infinite Persons are united in one substance or being, so the love they have for each other is infinite. The actions that show each Person's qualities are not done by that person alone. Everything God does is done by all three Persons. So you could say that everything the Trinity does, is done out of love.

St. Isidore the Farmer's Great Love of the Eucharist

The patron saint of farmers knew the value of work, but did not let work prevent him from attending Mass, even when his fellow labourers persecuted him.

St. Isidore was a holy man who worked as a day labourer. He did not own a farm, but worked on the farm of a wealthy landowner.

One of his habits that he would never budge on was his commitment to attend daily Mass.

Fr. Michael Mueller explains in his book The Blessed Eucharist Our Greatest Treasure how he "was accused by some of his fellow labourers to his master of **staying**

too long in the church and of being always too late at work."

St. Isidore believed that he had a duty to God, but that he also had a duty to his employer. Instead of neglecting either duty, St.

Isidore prayed to God for help in fulfilling his obligations. What happened next was most unexpected and is the most popular story told about St. Isidore's life.

Mueller goes on to explain how the land owner wanted to see for himself whether or not St. Isidore was neglecting his duties to attend Mass:

His master, to convince himself of the truth of the accusation, went out early in the morning to see whether Isidore came in due time to the farm; but how great was his astonishment when he beheld **two Angels**, **dressed in white**, **ploughing with two yoke of oxen and St. Isidore in their midst.** From this time forward Isidore was held in great veneration by the wealthy farmer and by all who heard of the fact.

In this way, St. Isidore was able to fulfill his daily obligation on the farm, and attend daily Mass.

St. Isidore wanted to keep God front and centre in his life, always praying the first thing in the morning.

He also knew the grace and strength he would receive from attending Mass and adoring God in the Eucharist and made daily Mass a priority.

In many ways his faith was similar to that of Mother Teresa, who insisted on a daily holy hour before Jesus in the Eucharist.

Mother Teresa gave a powerful speech to those assembled for the Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia in 1976, and reiterated this simple fact: To be able to live this life of vows, these four vows, we need our life to be woven with the Eucharist. That's why we begin our day with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. With him, we go forward. And when we come back in the evening we have one hour of adoration before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and at this you will be surprised, that we have not had to cut down our work for the poor.


While not everyone is able to attend Mass on a daily basis, we can all learn from these examples and seek to put God first in our lives.

FIRST COMMUNION 2024

Congratulations to all our First Communicants. As we celebrate with them this special day when they receive the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time, may they come to experience the Real Presence, love, and closeness of Christ in the Eucharist.

This weekend, May 25-26, tens of thousands of children, parents, teachers, and catechists from all over the world are gathering in Rome at St. Peter's and the Olympic Stadium for the Catholic Church's first ever World Children's Day. They will be meeting with Pope Francis, participating in various activities and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. What a blessing it is that on this same weekend, 32 children from our Parish will be making their First Holy Communion. This will be witnessed by their parents, loved ones and Parishioners of St. Ignatius, who continue to support them in their vocation as children, sons and daughters of God, and on their journey to heaven.

In his special message to children on the first World Children's Day (which is today), Pope Francis wrote, "... I would ask all of you to pray the same prayer that Jesus taught us – the Our Father. Recite it every morning and every evening, in your families too, together with your parents, brothers, sisters and grandparents. But not just by saying the words! Think about those words that Jesus taught us. He is calling us, and he wants us to join actively with him, on this World Children's Day, to become builders of a new, more humane, just, and peaceful world. Jesus, who offered himself on the Cross to gather all of us together in love, who conquered death and reconciled us with the Father, wants to continue his work in the Church through us. Think about this, especially those of you who are preparing to receive First Communion."

As our First Communicants would have learned throughout their preparations for the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion, prayer is important. The words of our Holy Father confirm all they have been taught. Our prayers will never go unanswered. Our heavenly Father hears every word. Our prayers, especially the prayers of children, do bear abundant and lasting fruits. So families, continue to cultivate and nurture your children's prayer life and watch God work!
