GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

"My sheep hear my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27)

Jesus, Our Peace

You probably know that the Jews in the first century did not particularly like the Gentiles. Some of them who became Christians still looked down on the non-Jewish Christians. In the epistle today, Paul addresses this problem by reminding them that Jesus died for all people, Jew and Gentile. And just as Jesus rose from the dead to a new life, the converts to Christianity were given a new life also. That new life of baptism joined them all to Christ, who lives in them, forgives them, and brings them peace. So why was that unity so hard to accept?

One reason is that as much as we complain about laws and regulations, many people like to live by them. We even make our own rules: "I always eat breakfast at 7:15," or "I have to read the newspaper every morning." Even though our rules may not be bad in themselves, if we get angry at anyone who interrupts our routine, those rules lead us to sin. But some of the Hebrew Christians thought that they still had to keep the laws and regulations of the old covenant. There is nothing wrong with keeping the Ten Commandments: They are simply examples of Jesus' command to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself. So why not just do that?

The problem with only keeping commandments is that we can avoid doing evil things, but still not love God or my neighbor. For example, we can avoid using God's name in vain and kick back and relax on the Sabbath, but still not really love God. We can keep from killing, robbing, or lying to our neighbor, without loving anyone. Fortunately for us, God loves us first; we need only respond to that love. And if we make the decision to love God and our neighbors, and base all our other actions on that love, we will not break any commandments, or even worry about breaking them. We will have the peace that Paul mentions in our reading, the peace that makes us all one in Christ.

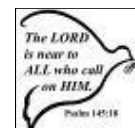

PARISH YEAR OF EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

NATIONAL
**Eucharistic
Revival****When did Eucharistic Adoration first start in the Church?**

While the Church believed in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist since the beginning, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament developed later.

The Catholic Church has believed since the time of the Apostles that Jesus is truly and substantially present in the consecrated Eucharistic host at Mass.

However, the practice of the Eucharistic adoration, whereby individuals gaze lovingly at the consecrated host, did not develop until later.

Initially most hosts consecrated at Mass were consumed immediately or were distributed to the sick and suffering. Tabernacles were rare and typically set off from the main church, not designed for individual devotion.

That all changed in the 10th and 11th centuries when an archdeacon in France publicly denied Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. This prompted an intervention from Pope Gregory VII and afterwards a type of "Eucharistic revival" occurred in France.

Fr. John Hardon describes what happened next in the book "The History of Eucharistic Adoration":

With this profession of faith, the churches of Europe began what can only be described as a Eucharistic Renaissance. Processions of the Blessed Sacrament were instituted; prescribed acts of adoration were legislated; visits to Christ in the pyx were encouraged; the cells of anchoresses had windows made into the church to allow the religious to view and adore before the tabernacle. An early ordinal of the Carmelites included the words "for the devotion of those in the choir" when referring to the reservation of the species.

Elevation of the host at Mass

Another major development that happened around the same time was the new practice of elevating the host after the words of consecration.

For much of Church history, the priest was accustomed to face the altar in the same direction as the people. This meant that when the priest was reciting the Eucharistic Prayer, the host and chalice were hidden from view.

Initially this did not pose any problem for the people, but by the 13th century, many saints were seeking ways to deepen the Eucharistic faith of the people.

The *Catholic Encyclopaedia* explains how this development started to spread:

At Paris, this elevation became a matter of synodal precept, probably before the year 1200. Before long it came to be regarded as a very meritorious act to look upon and salute the Body of the Lord. In this way, even before the middle of the thirteenth century, all kinds of fanciful promises were in circulation regarding the special privileges enjoyed by him, who, on any day, saw the Body of his Maker.

The institution of the feast of Corpus Christi shortly after these events solidified the devotion of adoring Jesus in the Eucharist and has continued ever since in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church.

Is my Marriage Recognized by the Church?

Like other couples in our parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon. Unless they received a "dispensation from canonical form," Baptized Catholics who exchange vows in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials, without their Bishop's permission, are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church.

Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family's mission to sharing God's love.

We are planning to have a special Mass for the convalidation of marriages. If you were married civilly, you are invited to contact Fr. Naveen or Fr. Anthony to be prepared for your marriage to be recognized by the Church.

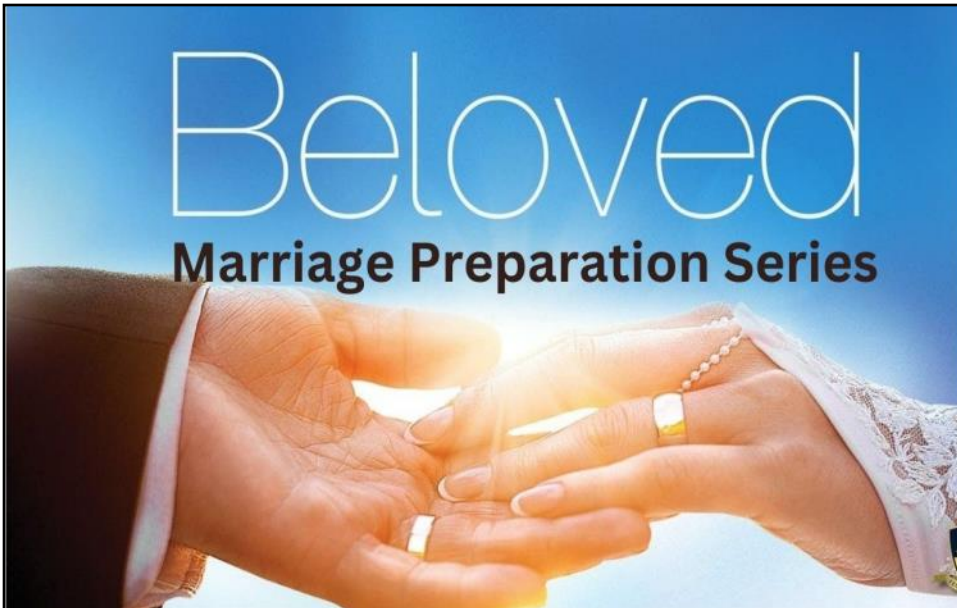


- Be mindful of how you're parking your car, using the spaces as you should.

We are planning to start a **SMALL GROUPS MINISTRY** within our Parish...and hope you would consider being a small group leader/facilitator or host a small group in your home, a school classroom or any other convenient place...

- **Small Groups are communities of parishioners that come together for fellowship, faith sharing, and deepening their relationship with God.**
- **Groups choose to participate in studies offered by the Parish or independently, typically in the Summer, Fall and Lenten time periods.**
- **It is a great way to get to know people in the community**

Small Groups Frequently Asked Questions....

- When do groups meet? At various times-some daytime, some evening. Some meet virtually and some meet in person.
- What do small groups do? Small groups meet for 60-90 minutes with this format:
-fellowship
-opening prayer
-watch short video on a chosen or scheduled topic
-conversation regarding video topic
-closing prayer
- How often do groups meet? Ideally weekly, but several meet once or twice per month.

ST. IGNATIUS/DOROTHY RICE SCHOLARSHIP FUND — FINISHING OUR 27TH YEAR ASSISTING FAMILIES WITH SCHOOL TUITION! *Give the gift of EDUCATION!*

The St. Ignatius/Dorothy Rice Memorial Scholarship Fund assists families who are not able to afford the full tuition at St. Ignatius School. Each year we help to keep children in our school who otherwise couldn't afford a Catholic Education.



The average child in this programme receives about \$200-\$300 per month off the fees, paid by the scholarship fund (directly to the school bursar), while the child's family pays the rest.

In return for the help, the families actively contribute to the school and parish in a variety of ways (helping out with fundraisers, chaperoning school trips, cleaning the grounds, assisting at sports days, serving on committees, etc.). Please consider the Scholarship Fund from time to time when doing your charitable work throughout the year! 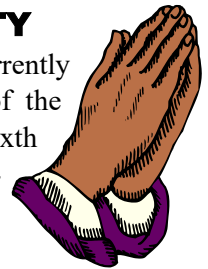

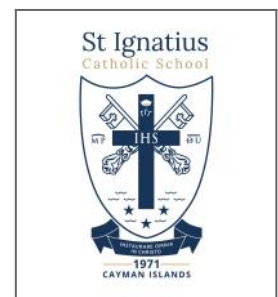
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
