



# Why did Jesus choose bread and wine for the **Eucharist?**

While primarily connected to the Jewish celebration of the Passover, the choice of bread and wine has even more symbolism. At the Last Supper Jesus instituted the Eucharist, using the elements of bread and wine in the context of the Passover meal. While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and wat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the

covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. (Matthew 26:26-28) The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "This [Jesus] did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloves Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us" (CCC 1323). However, the question is often asked, "Why bread and wine? Couldn't Jesus have used something else?" It is true, Jesus, being God, could have established his enduring presence in the Church through anything in his creation. He could have used other types of food, such as lettuce, figs, apricots or even meat. Yet, God chose bread and wine. The primary reason why God chose bread and wine was connected to his previous revelations in the Old Testament and how he was preparing his people for this moment in history. In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in sacrifice among the first fruits of the earth as a sign of grateful acknowledgment of the Creator. But they also received a new significance in the context of the Exodus: the unleavened bread that Israel eats every year at Passover commemorates the haste of the departure that liberated them from Egypt; the remembrance of the manna in the desert will always recall to Israel that it lives by the bread of the Word of God; their daily bread is the fruit of the promised land, the pledge of God's faithfulness to his promises. The "cup of blessing" at the end of the Jewish Passover meal adds to the festive joy of wine an eschatological dimension: the messianic expectation of the bread and the cup. (CCC 1334)

God always knew he would use bread and wine, so he began preparing the people of Israel for this revelation gradually over time. The Old Testament is full of symbolic precursors, making Jesus' actions at the Last Supper a very fitting fulfillment of what had already taken place. Besides the connections to various events in salvation history, God likely used bread and wine becasue of its rich symbolism in how they are made. For example, St. Augustine in his sermon Ad infantes, de Sacramentis lays out the symbolism of the manufacturing of bread and how it expresses the "communion" we are called to celebrate. In this loaf of bread you are given clearly to understand how much you should love unity. I mean, was that loaf made from one grain? Weren't there many grains of wheat? But before they came into the loaf, they were all separate; they were joined together by means of water after a certain amount of pounding and crushing. Unless wheat is ground, after all, and moistened with water, it can't possibly get into this shape which is called bread. In the same way you too were being ground and pounded, as it were, by the humiliation of fasting and the sacrament of exorcism. Then came baptism, and you were, in a manner of speaking, moistened with water in order to be shaped into bread. But it's not yet bread without fire to bake it. So what does fire represent? That's the chrism, the anointing. Oil, the fire-feede, you see, is the sacrament of the Holy Spirit... You see, he breaths into us the charity which should set us on fire for God, and have us think lightly of the world, and burn up our straw, and purge and refine our hearts like gold. So the Holy Spirit comes, fire after water, and you are baked into the bread which is the body of Christ. And that's how unity signified.

This is confirmed in St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf" (1 Corinthians 10:17).

Bread has also been a staple food in various cultures around the world, something universal that everyone can understand. Wine has a similar symbolism, again stressing the way it is manufactured. St. Augustine summarized the symbolism in another sermon. But just as one loaf is made from single grains collected together and somehow mixed in with each other into dough, so in the same way the body of Christ is made one by the harmony of charity. And what grains are for the bod of Christ, grapes are for his blood; because wine too comes out from the press, and what was separated one by one in many grapes flows together into a unity, and becomes wine. Thus both in the bread and in the cup there is the mystery, the sacrament, of unity. (Sermon 229A)This is only a small sample of the symbolism found in bread and wine that the Catholic Church has been able to reflect on for many centuries.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



The Eucharist was never meant to be only "comfort food," something that makes us feel warm and satisfied. It is to be bread for the journey, nourishment for the task that God has set for our community and for each one of us. Thus it is not surprising to see some walk away in today's Gospel, for they understood that recognizing Jesus as the bread of life is a commitment to changing one's life.

St. Augustine, whose feast we celebrate this week, once observed that in celebrating the Eucharist we become what we receive, the Body of Christ. As we conclude the series of

reflections in John's Gospel on Jesus as the bread of life, it is appropriate to think about the role that the Eucharist plays in our lives and in our parish. It is in the Eucharist that we are nourished and renew our commitment in faith to serve the Lord. How does the parish social ministry carry out that mandate? How do you carry it out in your own life? Is it related in any way to the celebration of the Eucharist? How does celebrating Mass Sunday after Sunday make a difference in your life and in the world?



# BRAND NEW CHURCH ORGAN

We have a brand new Church organ that was recently purchased.

It is currently on island and will be released from the port very soon.

The intallation will take place in a couple weeks when the technician arrives on island to do the set up.



It was a proactive and necessary decision to replace our current organ at St. Ignatius since it is more than 35 years old. The parts for fixing it when it's broken is no longer available and so the recommendation from our technician and for some time now, has been to replace it with a newer model. The recommendation has been supported by the Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council.

The new organ is equipped with the latest technology and will enhance all the Liturgical Worship in our Parish.

The cost of the new organ is \$80,000US, including shipping and other expenses. The funds raised from last year's International Food Festival was used to start the organ fund. This was well short of the amount needed to cover the full price.

If you are able to donate to the Organ Fund we ask that you prayerfully consider making a donation to help cover the cost. Donations can be placed in an envelope indicating "Organ Fund" and dropped in the collection basket. You may also send in your donation through online trnasfer, making a note that it is for the 'Organ Fund". Otherwise contact the Parish office for more information.

OUR LADY OF CZESTOCHOWA August 26

The creation of this Black Madonna in Czestochowa, Poland, also known as Our Lady of Jasna Gora, is attributed by legend to Saint Luke. It bears scars and gashes that have been inflicted on it over centuries of sometimes violent events in Polish history.



-fellowship


-opening prayer


