GOSPEL REFLECTION

Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

We Are Family

On the feast of the Holy Family, it is tempting to compare our own families to the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. If your parish used the year A readings that were traditionally used for this feast, the second reading from Colossians has much practical advice for our families. However, while living as family today is challenging enough, the Gospel for year C reaches a lot farther.

Luke's narrative of the twelve year old Jesus in the temple is not a warning for parents to watch their children closely while travelling. The story looks forward to the time Jesus would be "lost" in the tomb after his crucifixion. Just as his parents found him on the third day, so Jesus would rise from the dead on the third day. And Jesus' remark, "I must be in my Father's house" (Lk 2:49) gives us a hint at who is Jesus' family.

Luke was well aware that the Temple was considered God's dwelling place. So to call it his Father's house showed that Jesus was the Son of God. Keep that in mind as you look at the second reading from the First Letter of John: "we may be called children of God." (1 Jn 3:1) Like Jesus, we call God our father, and like Jesus, we are part of a larger family than the one we live with. That family of all God's children is the one we are called to serve.

But remember Jesus was 12 in this part of the gospel. So his duty to God included being obedient to his parents. We too have a tension between obedience to our parents and following God's call, a tension between taking care of our children and giving time to God's children in the church and the community. At election time we have the tension of voting for candidates who will keep our family safe, or for those that help the poor or the aged. Just remember that, while we have a warm, cozy picture of the Holy Family, Jesus' ultimate duty was to give his life for all, especially sinners. Let us ask God to help us appreciate what our family obligations really are.

How to do a Yearly Examen for Spiritual Clarity in the New Year



A great way to move forward in the spiritual life is to look back and examine what worked and what didn't.

The New Year often fills us with hope, as we say to m ourselves, "Next year will be better!" The last

12 months may not have gone exactly as we wanted and our original New Year's resolutions may have only endured to the middle of January. Whatever may be the case, we look forward to the future and have a glimmer of hope that our current situation will improve.

While looking forward to what could be can keep our spirits up for the moment, a much deeper exercise that provides more nourishment to the soul consists of **reviewing the entire year** and being thankful for the many blessings (and crosses) that God has given us.

This process allows a person to understand where they are and where God's actions may be leading them. In other words, it is only in looking back that one can move forward.

One way to reflect on the past year is to make a **Yearly Examen**. This practice is simply an extension of the **Daily Examen** that is a central part of Ignatian spirituality. The Daily Examen is practice where an individual stops two times during the day (at midday and at the close of the day) to examine God's activity and to recognize any faults or sins committed.

Here is how a Yearly Examen might look, based on St. Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises.

Yearly Examen

- After placing yourself in God's presence, first give thanks to God for all the many blessings received during the past year. Pass through each month, remembering the blessings that occurred.
- 2. Pray for the grace to understand God's divine providence.
- 3. Next, review each month again and take notice of any feelings or movements that occur in your heart while doing this activity. Whatever you may feel (whether it was a good feeling or bad feeling), ask God to help you understand why an event happened.
- Fourth, ask pardon for any sins you committed, trusting fully in God's mercy.
- 5. Last of all look forward to the New Year and think of ways that you can collaborate more with God's loving plan for your life.

If we want to progress spiritually in the New Year, we must not forget the past, but learn from it and accept everything that happened in light of God's divine providence. By doing this, we can better move forward and do so in a spirit of collaboration, realizing that God is the one who is in control. In the end, if we are to remember one thing let us recall the words God said to the prophet Jeremiah:

"For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. You will seek me and find me; when you seek me with all your heart, I will be found by you, says the Lord." (*Jeremiah* 29:11-14)

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



Today's feast is new as feasts go, and it sets us this year in a very modern crisis. Amid conflicting reasures schedules and commitments, a young man, testing the limits, has strayed from his parents and gone off to the big city. Mary and

Joseph search frantically, only to find the child Jesus in the temple, conversing with the elders and scholars of the law, who are amazed at his wisdom.

In the time of Jesus, the temple was the religious center of Jewish ritual. Outside of Jerusalem, people gathered in the synagogues, centers of learning, for daily prayer and study. Still, everyone longed to journey to the temple to participate in the offerings, and to fulfill certain obligations of the law that could only be done there. On this feast, we catch a glimpse of the family of Jesus: parents dealing with the normal stresses of raising a child, and yet completely grounded in the ways of faith and tradition.

There has always been an appreciation in Christianity for the value of pilgrimage—the journey to holy places that is a symbol of our life's journey to God, and a sense of connection to important events in our family history. During the Christmas season, many of us undertake pilgrimages to the family homestead for festival meals, to the parishes where we were formed in the faith, or perhaps even to a beautiful manger scene or festival of lights. There are few better days than this in our calendar for spending time with the family, especially on a short pilgrimage to a favorite place. Just make sure that no one gets left behind!

GOSPEL REFLECTION Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

Mary Kept All These Things in Her Heart

Mary and Joseph have not been asked to walk an easy path. They have had to wrestle with the unknown, travel to a distant land, be denied a clean and warm place to stay and give birth, and make use of an animals' feeding trough for their Child's first bed. The King of the Universe is reduced to living at the level of an animal.

The shepherds, who in the eyes of observant Jews already live almost at the level of an animal, are blessed by an angelic Christmas concert and sent to be the first witnesses of this earth-shattering event: they rush to find Christ with his humble parents and enter the first Christian church. They then went and told others this amazing story, glorifying and praising God for this mysterious fulfillment of God's Promise. Did others rush to see for themselves? The Gospel does not tell us. We only know that the shepherds were amazed.

It does tell us something subtle that reveals the inner workings of the heart of our Mother and the Mother of God: "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." God did not reveal to Mary or Joseph a step-by-step plan for how they were to bring the Messiah into the world, or teach the One through Whom all things were made about the world, or raise the One Who called the Chosen People and gave them the Law how to live within the Law of the Chosen People. They had to walk day by day in faith, without any bullet points or instructions, except those revealed to them in the depths of their obedient hearts (and sometimes in a dream). It was with loving trust that Mary held all that happened in her heart, observing the workings of God, repeating her fiat in every moment and never drawing back from it, even when it was hard to understand, even when it was difficult and painful.

Today, as we lift our prayers in honor of Mary, the Mother of God, on the eighth day of the Eight Days of Christmas, let us ask her to help us ponder God's action in our hearts with the same loving obedience and trust. Let us ask her to help us be as eager as the shepherds to gather around the manger near her and St. Joseph, to receive the warm light of God's gentle love. And let us ask her to be a mother to each of us, as Christ gave us his own Mother as his last gift from the Cross.


