



# **GOSPEL REFLECTION Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

God's Grace in the Here and Now

Mental healthcare professionals will tell you that constantly looking back on the past leads to depression and constantly looking toward the future causes anxiety. God's grace is not in the future. God's grace is not in the past. "Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery, today is a gift of God, which is why we call it the present" (Bill Keane).

What moment do we find ourselves in right now? We are on the cusp of the holy season on Lent. We are standing on the edge of the precipice, looking at the spiritual disciplines that lie before us, getting ready to sink or swim.

Our second reading says: "When this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: Death is swallowed up in victory." What exactly does that mean? We must allow ourselves to be changed, to be transformed. We who were once corruptible, must now flee from sinfulness. We who were once dead in our sins can be brought to everlasting life in Christ's forgiveness.

And who is the victor over death? It is Christ who swallows it up through His death. Of course God could simply say the word and we would all be saved, but He chose to send His Son and He chose to require our cooperation. "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher."

And so it was that God Almighty sent the most unfathomable present to us here and now, our very own Teacher. His grace is with us in this moment, leading, guiding and loving. Let us receive this gift and open our hearts to all the lessons and graces He has in store for us today.

### Worried about getting Lent right? Here's a better way.



Ultimately, Lent isn't about what we do, but about how God works in us.

As Lent draws near, many Catholics start thinking about what they'll give up or how to make it the "BEST LENT EVER." The pressure to pray more, fast, and give alms can sometimes feel like a checklist, as if we're just trying to survive the next 40 days without falling into Catholic guilt. But what if we approached this season differently? Instead of seeing Lent as a path to perfection, what if we viewed our Lenten commitments as an invitation to receive what Jesus truly desires to do in us? Ultimately, Lent isn't about what we do, but about how God works in us.

Here are a few ideas to consider before Lent begins on March 5th:





The traditional Lenten practices - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving - are ways to build virtuous relationships: with God, with ourselves, and with others. For example, consider fasting from negative thoughts about yourself and replacing them with short prayers. Try fasting from uncharitable thoughts and gossip about others. Maybe this Lent, you could dedicate more time to being present with your family in shared spaces, or even plan to have meals together at the table - a simple yet powerful way to strengthen bonds. Or perhaps, you'll encounter God more deeply through the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, or by reading and praying with your Bible more often. As you make your Lenten plans, bring them to God - not as tasks to check off, but as part of your relationship with him and with those around you. Remember, Lent is

ultimately about the relationship you nurture: with God, with others, and with yourself.

### 2. Digging to the Root of Your Sin

Take a moment to reflect: What is the root cause of your sin? Is it pride, selfishness, greed, or apathy? Identifying the deeper patterns behind your sin isn't about beating yourself up or wallowing in guilt - it's about addressing the root so that, with Jesus' help, you can sever your connection to the poison of sin. Our goal is to get to the heart of the matter, for it's in the heart where sin takes root. As part of your Lenten journey, make a plan to go to Confession to seek forgiveness and healing.



### 3. Journeying Through Lent with Jesus

Imagine sharing the next 40 days of Lent with Jesus, inviting him into every moment. How often do we have intimate conversations with him, or even just pause to ask, "Jesus, what do you think about this?" Or, when something joyful happens, do we take a moment to pray, "Thank you, Jesus, for being here with me and sharing this joy?" Ask God to help you recognize his presence more deeply throughout each day. Let Lent be a time to cultivate a more intimate relationship with Jesus - through both the big and small moments of your life.

### 4. Reflecting on Your Christian Mission

As Christians, we're called to show God's love to everyone - our family, friends, neighbors, and even strangers. What does loving your neighbor look like for you this year? Are there areas where you feel called to grow, especially in serving those with whom you may not see eye to eye? This Lent, consider how God might be calling you to love others more deeply, especially those who challenge you the most.

Lent is not a race to perfection, but a journey of transformation. It's about allowing Jesus to work in you, healing what is broken, and deepening your relationship with God, yourself, and others. Let this season be one where you open yourself to the grace of God and his transforming love.

If these ideas have resonated with you and you're eager to explore them further, don't miss out on <u>Wilderness Within: A Guided Lent Journal for Prayer and Meditation</u> by Sr. Josephine Garrett, CSFN, with beautiful illustrations by June Jameson.



# ASH WEDNESDAY REFLECTION Return to Me



I was on retreat several years ago and found myself standing alone next to a still pond surrounded by trees. Across the pond from me was a crucifix raised on a pole such that I could look straight at it. I felt God calling to me with the words at the beginning of our first reading today: "return to Me with your whole heart." This simple request sank deep into my soul.

Return to Me. Give yourself entirely to Me. Trust Me. Let Me care for you and pour Myself out for you. Don't let your worries and concerns stand between us. Don't let your desire for approval make you forget who you are living for. You are Mine

It was there that I gave myself more completely to God, where I made a commitment to Him that I would continuously dedicate myself to Him. We hear this same call in the Gospel today, on this Ash Wednesday as we enter into Lent. May we return to God with all our hearts. May our hearts not be divided, but may we give them entirely to God.

It is so easy for us, as we live this life in the flesh, to do what is asked of us but for the wrong reasons, such as seeking approval from others. Perhaps we allow others to see us piously carrying out our Lenten obligations so that we may be counted among the holy or admired by them.


We are called to give ourselves to God and to live our lives for Him, including fasting, giving alms, and praying, making sacrifices to Him out of love rather than for any other reason. When we do things for others, it is to be for the sake of God and those He has put in our lives, not to serve our own egos.

This illustrates a larger point. Giving ourselves to God involves two main movements which go hand in hand. One is turning away from the things of the flesh. The other is turning toward God. Repentance from sin leads to reconciliation with God. Detachment from worldly things creates space for Him to abide in us.

This summons to return to the Lord with our whole heart requires both movements, fueled by His grace. It is to turn away from the desires and lures of the world in order to give our entire heart, our entire selves to God. Undivided and unreserved. This is a lifetime endeavor for most of us, myself included. But Lent is the perfect time to step further into it.

This Lent, I encourage you to offer each sacrifice up for God. Offer them in outward silence and in love to the One who sees all and who abides with you in your inmost being, to the One who delights in you, longs for you, and gives Himself up for you.








branches (branches) that remain in it bear much fruit. According to agriculture, the vine is a vine, that is, a perennial plant with leafy branches.

An important part of the vine is the leaves. It is obvious that a vine has leaves, but Jesus does not mention them, preferring to focus on the branches. The parts of the vine are the roots, trunk, branches, leaves, flowers and fruit. According to this division Jesus would be the trunk, but he claims to be the complete vine. This is a picture of the unity that Jesus wants among his followers. Let us remember that Jesus celebrates the Last Supper with his disciples. The community of disciples united to Jesus form the vine. The shoots or branches conduct water and minerals to the leaves, flowers and fruits, and are useful as long as they are attached to the vine. The same goes for Christians, disciples of Jesus. They are the ones who make Jesus present and give life to Jesus in today's world.
