



This Weekend's Readings

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Third Sunday of Easter "Smoting" or Non-"smoting"?

Sometimes I get angry at things that frustrate me. I'm driving home and traffic slows to a crawl. The electricity goes out while I'm watching a favorite show. So I have to struggle with the line in our first reading, where the disciples were "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name" (Acts 5:41). They weren't just frustrated; they were flogged for believing in Jesus. And still they rejoiced.

Imagine rejoicing over pain and suffering. These disciples had seen Jesus on the cross. When he rose from the dead, they began to see that his suffering was not a tragic loss, but a sign of his glory. They loved him so much that they took to heart his command to take up the cross. And when they suffered because they believed in him, as is recounted in today's reading, they saw that as a way to imitate Jesus on the cross. Those who had followed him in life could also follow him to the cross—and many did that literally, by dying for their faith.

Most of us today rarely have the chance to die for our faith. We may wonder if we even have the courage it would take. Instead, we usually find ourselves suffering because we have done wrong. God does not use special interventions to smite sinners. Think of the times we were punished as a child. Think of the times we lost a friend because of a cruel remark. Think of the times we got a ticket for speeding. These are the result of our actions. These are sufferings that we would rather avoid.

Jesus, however, suffered for our sins when he was totally innocent. If he could do that, could we not accept suffering for our own sins when it comes? We may not be ready to rejoice in that suffering, but we can at least try to learn from it. If we behave differently because of it, if we can grow to be better persons, then that suffering can be our way of accepting the cross.

Of course, not all suffering is caused by the sins of the person suffering. The suffering of the innocent is a great mystery, a cause for sorrow and a challenge to help where we can. But like growing pains, all suffering is a step to new life in Christ. And that is what Easter is about.

How Mary can be a Star of Hope for us in Our Lives



In the midst of the storms of life, we can look to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who can give us hope in times of darkness.

Life can be difficult at times, especially if we are dealing with a personal physical illness or the loss of a loved one.

Furthermore, the clouds of darkness can be particularly thick when our mental health is going through a trial.

In times like these we can have little hope for the future, not knowing if our life will ever be happy.

The good news is that we can look to Mary during these difficult times, turning to her to increase our hope.

Mary, Star of Hope

Pope Benedict XVI suggests turning to Mary in his encyclical on hope, <u>Spe salvi</u>. He first makes the analogy of how life is like a journey at sea: Human life is a journey. Towards what destination? How do we find the way? Life is like a voyage on the sea of history, **often dark and stormy**, a **voyage in which we watch for the stars** that indicate the route.

He then explains that in this voyage, we should look for those stars that can give us hope along the way:

The true stars of our life are the people who have lived good lives. They are lights of hope. Certainly, Jesus Christ is the true light, the sun that has risen above all the shadows of history. But to reach him we also need lights close by—people who shine with his light and so guide us along our way. Who more than Mary could be a star of hope for us?

Pope Benedict XVI further illustrates why Mary is that Star of Hope:

With her "yes" she opened the door of our world to God himself; she became the living Ark of the Covenant, in whom God took flesh, became one of us, and pitched his tent among us (cf. *Jn* 1:14)...[Holy Mary] Through you, through your "yes", the hope of the ages became reality, entering this world and its history. You bowed low before the greatness of this task and gave your consent: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (*Lk* 1:38).

Mary can bring us hope in our darkest moments.

If we ever feel like we our lost at sea, we can turn to Mary and implore her intercession to give us hope in what is to come.

This devotion to Mary arose among Jesuits in Rome in the late 18th century and quickly spread throughout the Western Church. By the time of Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854, it had become universal. May crownings and other special May events in honour of Mary, such as public recitation of the rosary, stem from this time. During the month of May, remember to pray the Rosary every day.

We will be praying the Rosary starting 40 minutes before each of the weekend Masses all through the month of May (starting next Sunday), so please arrive early and join in this beautiful devotion.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Gospel today sees Peter and his colleagues after the Resurrection,

returning to Galilee and resuming the family business. They are fishing by night. Although it is true that fish feed by night,



the mention of darkness here is more about the human spirit than it is about fishing advice. Modern life keeps darkness effectively under control; much of the world has been glowing radiantly through the night for a century. Yet just as surely as the Risen Christ breaks into Peter's fishing, so does he break into the usual patterns of our own darkness, electric lights notwithstanding. It is Easter, and we are the people of the light.

In our tradition, Evening Prayer, celebrated in monasteries, parishes, cathedrals, and homes everywhere, is a kind of solemn protest against the darkness and its claims, an act of praise for our light-bearing God, and a commitment to carrying that light forward. Sunset is a turning point of our day, felt less acutely in an electrified world, but still an effective reminder that one day darkness overtakes us all. Yet our Eastering has taught us in a hundred ways that the victory belongs to the Bearer of Light. Easter summons us to transform our everyday "blackouts," perhaps in a way as simple as a whispered prayer of thanks at evening for the blessings of the day.


