GOSPEL REFLECTION Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Coach Paul

Today's reading from First Timothy sounds almost like a coach getting his team ready for the big game. This coach has much higher goals than a home run or a touchdown. Instead of pursuing a league championship, he seeks faith, love, patience, and gentleness. How about us? Are we in the game or on the sidelines? Let's look at what Coach Paul is talking about.

We strive for faith when we see it as not just believing that God exists or that Jesus is God's Son. Faith is a relationship with the Lord in which we imitate Jesus' outlook on life, his teachings, his love of God. We struggle with his commands to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek, to forgive all wrongs, and to take up our cross each day. As Paul would say, we are "competing well for the faith."

We pursue love by listening to the Gospel, in which Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who was only concerned with his own comfort. Jesus says that if we truly understood the prophets, such as our first reading from Amos, we would not spend all our energy and wealth on ourselves. We may find that love for our family is much easier than love for strangers or the homeless, but Jesus never said that love would be easy.

As we learn to let go of our need to have everything go our way, we become more patient with people who disagree with us, or with frustrations and problems. We learn to see God in our setbacks as well as in our successes. Striving to see Jesus in everyone, we can become more patient with them. They will begin to see Jesus in us as our devotion to him grows. Experiencing the Lord is the championship we want.

How to make a Special Consecration to St. Michael the Archangel



The consecration prayer calls on St. Michael to defend your family against all spiritual enemies.

Within the Catholic Church, there are various devotional traditions with which you can consecrate yourself and your family to God, invoking the special intercession of a saint. One of the most popular consecration prayers is that of the "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary" promoted by St. Louis de Montfort.

A consecration prayer essentially places your soul (and the souls of your family members) in the spiritual hands of a heavenly helper. This invokes their spiritual assistance and develops a close relationship with a particular saint.

Besides consecrating oneself to Jesus through Mary, many people throughout history have performed a consecration to God through St. Michael the Archangel. This is a special consecration that invokes his aid against all spiritual enemies. For example, shortly after Pope Francis was elected he consecrated the entire Vatican to St. Michael.

Below is an ancient consecration prayer that some sources say is connected to the shrine at Monte Gargano, one of the oldest Christian sites dedicated to St. Michael the Archangel. It is a prayer that can be used as a home consecration prayer, entrusting your entire family to the protection of the holy Archangel.

Oh most noble Prince of the Angelic Hierarchies, valorous warrior of Almighty God and zealous lover of His glory, terror of the rebellious angels, and love and delight of all the just angels, my beloved Archangel Saint Michael, desiring to be numbered among your devoted servants, I, today offer and consecrate myself to you, and place myself, my family, and all I possess under your most powerful protection.

I entreat you not to look at how little, I, as your servant have to offer, being only a wretched sinner, but to gaze, rather, with favourable eye at the heartfelt affection with which this offering is made, and remember that if from this day onward I am under your patronage, you must during all my life assist me, and procure for me the pardon of my many grievous offenses, and sins, the grace to love with all my heart my God, my dear Savior Jesus, and my Sweet Mother Mary, and to obtain for me all the help necessary to arrive to my crown of glory.

Defend me always from my spiritual enemies, particularly in the last moments of my life.

Come then, oh Glorious Prince, and succor me in my last struggle, and with your powerful weapon cast far from me into the infernal abysses that prevaricator and proud angel that one day you prostrated in the celestial battle. Amen.

Carlo Acutis' 3 Tips for getting closer to your Guardian Angel



Carlo Acutis nurtured a great devotion to angels. Let the life of this young Blessed inspire you to get closer to your guardian angel.

Starting in early childhood, Blessed Carlo Acutis showed a special interest in angels. From a very young age he had concrete experiences of the help of his guardian angel, which strengthened his faith and interest in these heavenly messengers.

The young Italian, recently canonized, even gave his guardian angel a name, calling him Gabriel. He even said that, in his opinion, he resembled the Smiling Angel in Reims Cathedral.

Here's some advice this "millennial saint" could give today to help us deepen our relationship with these spiritual creatures.

ASK YOUR GUARDIAN ANGEL FOR HELP

Angels accompany every person from birth to death, and work on our behalf throughout our lives. The Psalms remind us of this: "For he [God] will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone" (Psalm 91:11-12).

They protect and defend against dangers, both external and internal, advising and guiding each person along the path of life.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga and St. John Henry Newman even claimed that guardian angels could comfort the souls entrusted to them in Purgatory while awaiting their entry into Heaven.

Like many saints, Carlo Acutis was also in the habit of asking his guardian angel for help in his day-to-day life, particularly in combating his own shortcomings. He would also tell the children to whom he taught catechism, "Ask for help from your guardian angel, who must become your best friend." This was one of the key pieces of advice the young Blessed liked to give them to help them achieve holiness.

READ ACCOUNTS OF ANGELIC APPARITIONS

Many saints dedicated texts to the invisible world and its angels, and some even received the grace of having apparitions, including St. Gemma Galgani, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Faustina Kowalska, and St. Catherine Labouré.

Some even received the grace to be in constant dialogue with their guardian angel, to see him pray and contemplate God, or to be miraculously saved by him.

The mystical experiences of these saints left a deep impression on young Carlo. He was so moved by this that he even planned to create a virtual exhibition on this theme. Sadly, he was unable to carry out this plan due to his premature death at the age of 15 from leukemia.

However, his dream was realized a few years later by an Italian journalist who brought the project to life. As in Carlo's case, reading these supernatural tales can serve as a reminder of the existence of these angels, and an incentive to establish a more intimate relationship with them.

Here is one to start with.

VISIT SHRINES DEDICATED TO THE ARCHANGELS

Carlo Acutis' relationship with angels was also strengthened after a family pilgrimage to the shrine of St. Michael the Archangel on Mount Gargano in southern Italy. According to tradition, the Archangel Michael appeared several times to St. Lorenzo Maiorano in the 5th century. In fact, Padre Pio himself used to send people who were particularly tormented by evil to this shrine.

Carlo Acutis was deeply impressed by this shrine, and from then on he made a habit of praying more often to his guardian angel and the nine choirs of angels, in particular by reciting the St. Michael Chaplet.

In Europe and around the world, there are numerous shrines dedicated to St. Michael the Archangel, including of course the famous Mont Saint Michel, where the archangel appeared in 709 to the bishop of Avranches, St. Aubert.

The example of Blessed Carlo Acutis invites us all to rediscover the presence of these heavenly creatures in our daily lives, to get to know them, and to pray to them in every circumstance of life!


PARKING SAFEFTY



money for worthy causes.





SAINT THÉRÈSE OF THE CHILD JESUS (1873-1897) October 1

"The cornerstone's dated 1872, but the stained glass is much later," explained the pastor, astonished when his visitor accurately dated it to just before the Great Depression, explaining, "The window for the Little Flower'—Thérèse's nickname—"gives it away." From her canonization in 1925, her statues and windows adorn most churches where European immigrants worshiped. Entering Carmel at fifteen, victim of tuberculosis at twenty-four, Therese proposed her "Little Way" to sanctity: doing ordinary tasks with extraordinary love. Thus "ordinary Catholics," many of whom had lost loved ones to tuberculosis, embraced her. Though she never left her cloister, this Carmelite's spiritual communion and devoted correspondence with missionaries earned her the title Patroness of Missions. Her autobiography, Story of a Soul, continuously in print since her death, chronicles her prayerful perseverance through doubt and caused her to be the youngest person ever named a Doctor of the Church. Countless physical healings and spiritual conversions testify to her fulfillment of her deathbed promise: "After my death, I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good upon earth!"

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the past century, a desire to recover a deep sense of unity among all believers in Christ has grown. The "ecumenical movement" (from the



Greek word meaning the "the whole inhabited world") began among Protestant Christians, but was given great energy in 1920 with a letter from the Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, calling for closer dialogue and cooperation among Christians. In 1960, Pope John XXIII invited Protestant and Orthodox observers to the Second Vatican Council. In 1964, the Council's Decree on Ecumenism named these Christians "separated brethren," a huge leap forward from the time of labeling them as "outside the Church." A year later, a new pope, Paul VI, and the Orthodox Patriarch officially nullified the condemnations that walled off East from West for nine hundred years.

The pace and optimism of the 1960s has sadly waned, and the signs of progress toward unity are few; yet there are wider agreements on sharing Communion among various Christian denominations, and among Protestants agreements regarding sharing of ecclesiastical life and ministry. Among the success stories of the ecumenical movement are greater cooperation among Christian clergy, a similar Lectionary for Protestants and Catholics, and even experiments in the monastic life and common worship.

The St. Ignatius/Dorothy Rice Memorial Scholarship Fund assists families who are not able to afford the full tuition at St. Ignatius School. Each year we help to keep children in our school who otherwise couldn't afford a Catholic Education.


