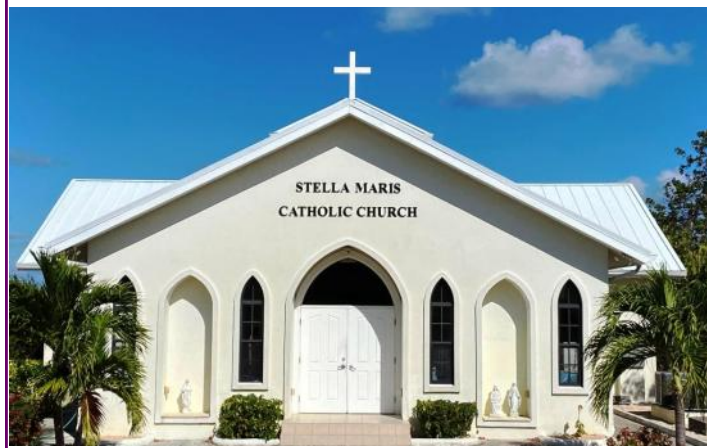

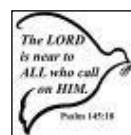

Why Fasting Leads to Freedom



The practice of fasting from food can lead a person to spiritual freedom and peace.

At first glance, fasting from food can appear to be a difficult practice with no clear benefit. While it might help take a few pounds off, the discipline involved can be overwhelming.

However, if we are able to stay faithful to a regimen of fasting (especially during Lent), the spiritual benefits are profound. In fact, you can experience a freedom you never thought possible.

One of the main reasons why fasting leads to freedom is because often we are “enslaved” to food, whether we realize it or not. Certain foods can have power over us and if we aren’t careful, we can end up indulging in habits of eating that endanger our health as well as our spiritual wellbeing.

On the other hand, when we fast from particular foods (like sweets, for example), we take control over the situation and develop the ability to say, “No!” That is a powerful ability that fasting can unlock for us, leading to a freedom we may have never experienced.

Fr. Richard Simon affirmed on one of his shows for Relevant Radio this spiritual principle.

Fasting is an exercise in freedom ... The purpose of it is to train your will to do God’s will. To train your will to obey the Lord. Freedom is the absolute requirement for the Christian life. And most people think that freedom is getting what they want, but they don’t understand that they don’t want what they want, it is their passions controlling them ... Fasting is to dispose you to do God’s will ... the purpose of a fast is to make you able to say no to yourself and yes to what the Lord wants. It’s an exercise in freedom.

Spiritual writer Thomas Kempis similarly wrote about how Jesus wants us to be free to accept his will and to do that, we need to deny ourselves on occasion.

Let this be your whole endeavor, this your prayer, this your desire; that you may be stripped of all selfishness, and with entire simplicity follow Jesus only; may die to yourself, and live eternally to [Christ] ... Forsake yourself, resign yourself, and-you shall enjoy much inward peace.

When considering a fast, keep in mind this benefit of freedom and how denying ourselves certain foods can bring about a spiritual peace that endures. Instead of being ruled by the refrigerator, we are in control and experience true freedom over our senses.

Encountering THE SEASON

LENT *for the* FAMILY

THE
FOURTH WEEK
of LENT

Have you ever been outside or in your bedroom when it's really dark? As you stare out, you try to make out the details of what's around you, but you can't. It's like you're blind. Sometimes when we are going about our day, taking in the scenes around us and hurrying from one thing to the next, we forget to stop and actually *see* the world. We become blind to the gifts that the Lord gives us daily. St. Celidonius, who was born blind, could still clearly see the world around him. He was able to recognize who Jesus was and share it with others.

Whenever you become too troubled with the stresses around you, think of St. Celidonius. He shows us that we can step outside of the darkness and live in the light of Christ. We can move beyond the fear or stress that might be distracting us and turn our eyes instead toward Jesus.



Challenge of the Week

Think about the things that are making you anxious. Maybe it's an upcoming test, chores, or a recital. In these moments, consider praying the Rosary, or going on a Rosary walk, and contemplating the mysteries for that day. Allow yourself to trust that the Lord will take care of your stresses and anxieties.

Prayer of the Week

Lord, you revealed to St. Celidonius your true identity so that he could spread the good news of Christ. Help guide us to step out of the darkness to follow you. Help reveal to us your true identity so that we may be more like St. Celidonius, who saw you through his blindness. We ask this through our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Fourth Sunday of Advent (A)

God Draws Close to Us, Becoming One of Us

Advent reminds us that we eagerly await the coming of Jesus. As we remember and celebrate his birth, we also look forward to his second coming. This week's Sunday readings highlight Isaiah 7:14: "The virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." In Matthew's Gospel, we see the fulfillment of this prophecy as the angel reassures Joseph that Mary's child is conceived by the Holy Spirit and will be named Jesus—a name that means "salvation."

While the virgin birth is miraculous, the deeper wonder lies in the humility of God himself. The Creator of the universe—filled with 100 billion galaxies, each with 100 billion stars—chose to come to Earth, becoming one of us. Unlike the Roman and Greek gods, whose myths are filled with stories of how they exploit humanity, our God comes to love us, save us, and gift us eternal life. He is truly Emmanuel—"God with us."

This act of love is reflected in the Prologue of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, which beautifully summarizes Christmas: "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. For this reason, at every time and in every place, God draws close to man" (CCC 1).



He pursues us, calls us to love him, and adopts us as his children through Jesus Christ. This adoption brings us into a covenant family, offering us divine life.

Christmas is far more than festive traditions. It is the celebration of God's relentless pursuit of us, his desire to draw us into his family, and the gift of salvation through Jesus. As we prepare for Christmas, let us open our hearts to this truth: We are not merely forgiven—we are deeply desired, loved, and invited into divine life.

Living the Gospel

This Advent, reflect on the profound truth of "Emmanuel," God with us. Consider the humility of our Creator becoming one of us, not out of need but out of love. Take time to meditate on the first paragraph of the *Catechism*, which reminds us that God desires to draw close to us and make us his sons and daughters. This week, ask yourself: How can I respond to God's pursuit with a heart open to his transformative love?

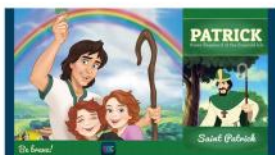

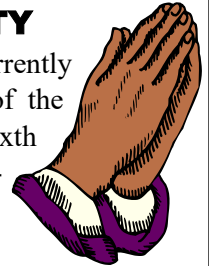
