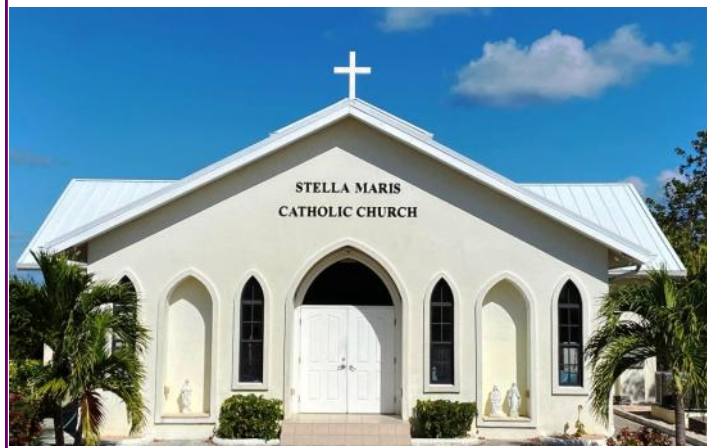

Why the Mass is not a play that reenacts the Last Supper



Jesus' command to "do this in memory of me" was not meant to evoke a simple reenactment of the Last Supper, but a liturgical celebration.

It can be tempting at times to think of the Mass as a play, where the priest reenacts the events of the Last Supper.

However, that is not what Jesus intended or what the earliest Christians did after Jesus' death, resurrection and ascension into Heaven.

"Do this in memory of me"

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) is clear that the Mass is not simply a remembering of past events:

The command of Jesus to repeat his actions and words "until he comes" does not only ask us to remember Jesus and what he did. It is directed at the liturgical celebration, by the apostles and their successors, of the *memorial* of Christ, of his life, of his death, of his Resurrection, and of his intercession in the presence of the Father.

The *Catechism* further explains how the earliest Christians would celebrate the Eucharist:

From the beginning the Church has been faithful to the Lord's command. Of the Church of Jerusalem it is written:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. . . . Day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts.

Re-presentation

Instead of being a reenactment, the Church describes the Mass as a "re-presentation" of the same sacrifice of Jesus on the cross:

The Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it *re-presents* (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross, because it is its *memorial* and because it *applies* its fruit:[Christ], our Lord and God, was once and for all to offer himself to God the Father by his death on the altar of the cross, to accomplish there an everlasting redemption. But because his priesthood was not to end with his death, at the Last Supper "on the night when he was betrayed," [he wanted] to leave to his beloved spouse the Church a visible sacrifice (as the nature of man demands) by which the bloody sacrifice which he was to accomplish once for all on the cross would be re-presented, its memory perpetuated until the end of the world, and its salutary power be applied to the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit.

One of the greatest mysteries of the Eucharist is how each Mass re-presents the sacrifice of Jesus and how we are spiritually transported to the foot of the cross.

The Church has taught this unique truth from the very beginning, and it is why the Mass is a liturgical celebration and not a play that occurs on a stage.

LENT *for the* FAMILY

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is finally here! As we begin to prepare ourselves for Christ's Passion, let us remind ourselves first of how joyful it was when Jesus entered Jerusalem. Everyone was excited, laying palms on the ground for him. Still, even though he was being celebrated then, Jesus knew that in a few days those cries for his glory would turn into shouts for his death.

Have you ever sacrificed something for the sake of someone else? Maybe it was taking the blame for something wrong, even when you weren't the only one to blame—or maybe it was sticking up for someone when they were being bullied. Even though we might be tempted to be prideful in the moment—thinking to ourselves that we *deserve* something because we made that sacrifice—we have to stop ourselves and remain humble like Christ.



Challenge of the Week

As we draw closer to Christ's Passion, look back on the list/drawing you created at the start of Lent. Reflect on what you did well this season and where you struggled. For these final days of Lent, take time to more actively do the tasks that you've neglected during Lent (such as doing a chore you don't enjoy or helping someone out).

Prayer of the Week

Lord, as we enter into Holy Week, prepare our hearts to meet you in your suffering. Allow us to partake in your Passion and reveal to us your merciful heart. Help guide us in these final days of Lent so that we may not be tempted into neglecting our relationship with you. We ask this through our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

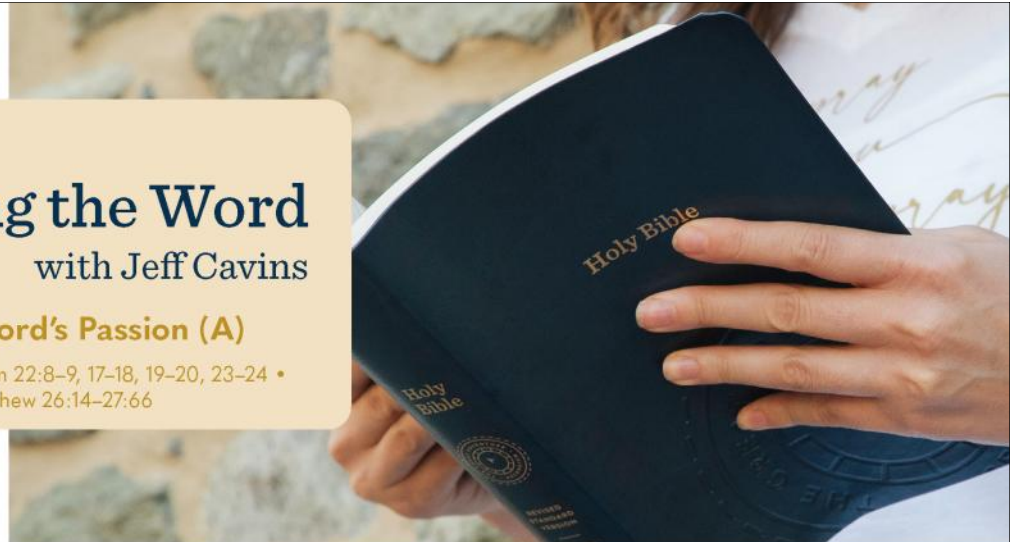

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion (A)

Matthew 21:1-11 • Isaiah 50:4-7 • Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24 •
Philippians 2:6-11 • Matthew 26:14-27:66



The Tree of Life Restored

Palm Sunday ushers us into Holy Week with the solemn proclamation of the Passion. The readings are long and filled with details, and together they reveal one great mystery: through his suffering and death, Christ restores to us what was lost in the Garden of Eden.

From the beginning, humanity was cut off from the Tree of Life because of our sin. But in the Upper Room, at the Last Supper, Jesus gives us access once more. He institutes the Eucharist and inaugurates the New Covenant priesthood, appointing the Apostles to carry on his sacrifice in every generation. The Fathers of the Church saw the Cross as the new Tree of Life and the Eucharist as its fruit. In Holy Communion, we receive this fruit and, with it, the promise of eternal life!

The Passion narrative also places before us the striking choice between Jesus and Barabbas. Barabbas, whose name means “son of the father,” was guilty, violent, and condemned, yet he was set free. Jesus, the innocent Son of the Father, took his place. This exchange is not just a detail of history but the heart of the Gospel: Christ takes our place. We, the guilty, go free because the innocent Lamb of God offers himself on the cross.

Palm Sunday, then, is about access to life. By his Passion, Jesus opens the way to the Father, to the sacraments, and to eternal communion with God. As we begin Holy Week, we are invited to walk with him—to the Upper Room, to Gethsemane, to Calvary—so that we might also share in his Resurrection.

Living the Gospel

Holy Week is not simply about remembering the events of the past, but also about entering into the saving mystery of Christ's Passion here and now. Participate fully in the liturgies of this week, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the veneration of the cross, and the Easter Vigil. Let the Eucharist be your food from the Tree of Life, and allow Christ's sacrifice to shape your heart. Then, go forth to live as one who has been set free, bearing witness to the victory of the Cross.

Ponder and Pray

» In Barabbas, we see ourselves—guilty yet set free, because Christ took our place. When have you experienced the Lord’s mercy in a way that made you realize he bore the weight of your sin? How might this truth move you from abstract gratitude to a lived response of conversion, humility, and love?

» St. Paul tells us that Jesus humbled himself, “becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross” (Philippians 2:8). Where is God inviting you to imitate that same humility and obedience, in your family, in your work, or in the hidden struggles of your heart? How can you unite your daily sacrifices with Christ’s Passion so that his life may be revealed through yours?

“ Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped.... And being found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. —Philippians 2:6–8 ”

» Holy Week is not just a remembrance of past events but an invitation to walk with Christ through the mysteries of his Passion, death, and Resurrection. How will you make space this week to accompany him on this path?

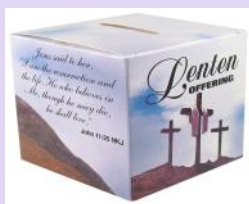

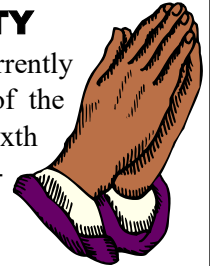
