Vision for Confirmation Preparation

Hello families of St. Mary's & St. Michael's. We are excited to enter into another academic year with your child or children, and we expect God to bring us closer to Himself, to each other, and to ourselves. This year, we will be spending a lot of time together in various ways, all of which aim at helping us live in Christ and let Him form us as a Christian community.

The preparation process for Confirmation aims to help candidates understand a fundamental teaching of the Catholic faith: that my life is not my own but the Lord's, and everything I experience as my life is pure, undeserved gift from the Creator. This life giving gift is called grace. Because of the reality that I had nothing to do with my own creation, that it is all gift, it follows that nothing I do in my life will ever be deserving of His grace. For I am a creation, and creation can never surpass the Creator. The phenomenon of "me" and "I" are nothing but pride when experienced outside of God. Hence, His grace is necessary for us to step out of our ego.

So where does the Sacrament of Confirmation fit in all this? Confirmation completes the graces of Baptism, which is not to say that Confirmation is necessary for salvation (this is already received in Baptism), but put simply, if the Baptismal candidate receives the grace of God unknowingly as an infant, then the Confirmation candidate receives the grace of knowing this grace.

Therefore, Confirmation is not "graduation" or a "rite of passage". It allows the candidate to become aware of the gifts of the Holy Spirit that were given to him or her at Baptism. It equips the candidate with the knowledge and understanding that he or she has been chosen by our Lord, undeservedly and unconditionally with love. It allows the candidate to understand that he or she was baptized as priest, prophet, and king and with the abundance of grace to commit to living this mission. It reveals to the candidate that life isn't about "me", but about God. The knowledge of the reality of grace opens the candidate to receive the Holy Spirit, given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ, for the sake of living our Catholic identity as missionary disciples. (Acts 1:8) We hope to partner with you in fostering a greater commitment and deepening your child's path to holiness.

Confirmation Process

The Confirmation formation process takes two years to complete, beginning in the fall of a candidate's 7th grade and ending in the spring of their 8th grade year. Therefore, 7th-8th grade Faith Formation is synonymous with the Confirmation formation process. Any students who wish to receive the Sacrament and are older than 7th grade will be grandfathered in and complete one year of formation.

At the time of registration, students in 7th-8th grade will register for 7th Grade Faith Formation/Confirmation preparation using the Prek-Confirmation Registration found on the parish website. For those who are above 7th grade, please register using the same form.

High School Confirmation candidates should register with the form above. If there are enough high school age candidates, they will receive formation as a small group separate from the middle school candidates. This will occur at the same time as the 7th-8th grade formation in a separate location in the building.

Those ages 18+ seeking Confirmation should <u>register for RCIA preparation</u> with Corey Manning (<u>cmanning@costm.org</u>).

Note: 8th grade students attending SCCS have a separate formation process within the school. Please contact Sr. Maria Ivana (srmariaivana@stccs.com) for further details.

Confirmation Requirements

We see that in this process and through feedback from parents and candidates that we need to continue to change and adapt each year to the changing needs and desires of those desiring Confirmation.

The program will revolve around 5 main requirements but ultimately the way we go about fostering a greater commitment and deepening of your child's faith will be through partnering with you and the family they come from to keep them growing and encouraged on their path to holiness.

- 1. <u>Regular participation at Sunday Mass, Holy Days, and Reconciliation</u> The Eucharist is the basic foundation of the Catholic faith. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." (Jn. 14:6) We receive the grace to follow him, believe in him, and have life in Him through the Eucharist. It is absolutely necessary for the disciple. We must receive Him and receive Him often! Attending Sunday Mass weekly and on Holy Days of Obligation is the 3rd Commandment and is required for all Catholics, as is receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year. It doesn't make sense for those that aren't attending Sunday Mass to be confirmed. That is like saying that you play football and you are on the team but you don't show up for the games.
- 2. <u>Fall Quest Retreat on November 4-5</u> This is a powerful opportunity to draw back from the busyness of life, and have the chance to encounter the Lord in a profound way. Many candidates that have been Confirmed say that the retreats that they attend are the best part of the process for them, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharistic Adoration. The reason for this is because on the retreat they can truly open themselves up to encounter Jesus Christ. They have the chance to accept a personal relationship with Him and decide to actively become an authentic disciple. Retreats are one of the best ways we help out young people to prepare for a lasting and fruitful prayer life and life in the Church.
- **3.** <u>The Well</u> This is our Wednesday night middle school youth group program that is from 6:15-7:45PM (See calendar for more info). We have games, snacks, talks, prayer time, and more. It is great way for your child to live their faith and keep up with friends who are doing the same outside of a classroom model. They also will be inspired by older high school students who are living their faith out and passing that faith on to the younger youth.

- **4.** Adult Formation Nights Parents are the primary formators, or teachers, of the faith for their children (CCC 2223, 2226). All parish Faith Formation is simply an extension and support of the family, especially the parents. Faith Formation does not replace the parents' formation of their children. Because of this, a parent/guardian of the candidate is required to attend five monthly Adult Formation Nights. These will occur on the 2nd Wednesday of the month from 6:15-7:45PM (same place and time as The Well) from October-May. The topics of each will correspond, making it easier for you and your candidate to continue the conversation at home.
- **5.** <u>Three S's (Sponsor, Saint, Service)</u> A **Sponsor** is chosen by you and your child for their Confirmation to walk with and pray for the candidate. This person should be an active and practicing Catholic (Sunday Mass, Regular Confession, Growing in their faith). He or she can't be a parent, has to be confirmed, and at least 16 years old.

Saint- Each candidate will pick a Saint that they look up to/want to emulate. This will be the name that they will take on as their confirmation name and their patron.

Service- We will be offering service opportunities throughout the year that we hope your student will attend. We as Catholics are called to Know, Love and Serve God.

Confirmation Registration

Registration takes place online at the parish website and is required for Confirmation. More details are provided here:

Confirmation Registration

Once you are registered, you will be added to Confirmation updates via Flocknote, which will be the primary way the Youth Ministry Coordinator will communicate with you.

IMPORTANT: If you are NOT a parishioner of St. Mary's, St. Michael's, or St. Charles, you need a letter of permission from your pastor in order for your child to receive Confirmation preparation from our parishes.

The Well (7th-8th grade)

Three to Four Wednesdays per month from 6:15-7:45PM at St. Mary's Education Center* *except for Cor Jesu which occurs at St. Michael's Church (see "Cor Jesu")

The Well seeks to answer two questions: "What does living the Catholic faith look like for a middle school student?" and "How do I unify my faith and life?" While The Well has a catechetical component, its focus is on formation of the whole person (Human, Intellectual, Spiritual, Communal).

7th-8th Grade Content

The talks given throughout the year will correspond to the <u>Adult Formation</u> topics so that parents can continue the discussion at home. Primary sources are the Catechism of the Catholic Church and The Holy Bible.

High School Wednesday Formation (9th-12th)

Three to Four Wednesdays per month from 6:15-7:45PM at St. Mary's Education Center*
*except for Cor Jesu which occurs at St. Michael's Church (see "Cor Jesu")

High School Confirmation candidates meet separate from the middle school candidates. Their formation follows a small group model, based on how many registrants there are. The small group will follow the Chosen series from Ascension Presents.

Cor Jesu nights

3rd Wednesday of the month from October-April (no Cor Jesu in December)

Every 3rd Wednesday from October-April, our parish has Cor Jesu nights at St. Michael's Church from 6:15-7:45PM. Cor Jesu means "heart of Jesus", and these nights are a time for communal prayer through Eucharistic Adoration, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and songs of praise. These times of prayer are open for all parishioners, so we hope that candidates and their families attend together.

Fall Quest Retreat - Focused on growth in relationship with Jesus Christ and community

We will end with the 4:30PM Mass at St. Michael's on Saturday, families are encouraged to come. Registration will be sent out soon.

Go Forth Retreat - Focused on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, Charisms, and the Great Commission

Sat, April 15, 2022 (tentative) - 9am-12pm, St. Mary's Church

Note: We may run into some scheduling issues. If the April 15 date doesn't work, the retreat will be on Sat, May 13.

Service Opportunity

Various opportunities for service at the parish and in the community are provided throughout the year. Candidates are asked to participate in one of these opportunities per year. More information will be sent in the Confirmation flocknote. If the Candidate has ideas for their own service time, he/she is welcome to check with the Youth Ministry coordinator to see if it meets the requirement.

Sponsor Form

The Candidate's sponsor should be someone who will walk with the Candidate as a mentor and guide on his or her faith journey. This means that the sponsor must be a confirmed Catholic who is at least 16 years old and practicing the faith. He or she should be a witness to Christ's love, inviting the Candidate into discipleship with Him. The sponsor cannot be one of the Candidate's parents. If there is difficulty finding a sponsor, please let me know, there are staff and volunteers who would be happy to sponsor a candidate. Please fill out the Sponsor Form by December 18.

Baptism Form (8th+ only)

The Church requires a record of the Candidate's baptism prior to his or her Confirmation. Baptismal certificates for Confirmation must be current within 6 months of the date of Confirmation. No original certificates or copies are allowed. This form is due December 18.

Patron Saint Form

Discerning a patron saint is not only about asking the saint to intercede for the candidate; it provides him or her with a new name. This name serves as a reminder that the candidate had been baptized in the Catholic Church and was given a name. The patron saint selection can be someone whom the candidate desires to be like, or it can even be his or her baptismal name, as long as it helps the candidate to remember the commitments made during the sacrament. It is important to note that the Candidate doesn't choose the patron saint, the patron saint chooses the Candidate, so it is important to do some research, then take time to discern through prayer on which saint might be choosing him or her. A common way saints choose us is with important dates. Maybe see which saints have feast day on your birthday or during your birthday month! Here is a resource that can serve as a starting point to discerning your saint. This form is due January 15.

Weather Policies

If the Stillwater schools are cancelled or dismissed early due to severe or unsafe weather conditions, Faith Formation sessions will also be cancelled. Cancellations will be broadcast on WCCO radio and other local stations. What this means for Faith Formation sessions:

- · District has a late start means sessions will still meet.
- District has an early release means no sessions.
- · District has cancelled class for the day means no sessions.

Emergency Absence Considerations

Extreme circumstances, including death of a family member, severe sickness and/or inclement weather will be considered emergency absences and a candidates may be excused from the minimum requirements. These unavoidable situations will be evaluated on a case by case basis. If you feel that any of your absences fall into this category please call the youth ministry coordinator to discuss options.
