**COMMENTARY**

Believing in only one God has many advantages, such as we kneel only to that God. G.K. Chesterton said that the problem of the 21<sup>st</sup> century will not be believing in God, but believing in many false gods, because when one does not believe in God, one is capable of believing in anything, such as politics, money, or pleasure. As Christians, not anyone or anything can take the place of God in our hearts and in our lives. Neither work, nor politics, nor our country, nor our family comes before God. As the first commandment requires, you shall love God above all things.

That does not mean that we should not love our friends, our work, our country, or our family. It means that, if at some point this love competes with God and separates us from Him, we will have to remember and remind others that we are Christians and, precisely for this reason, we kneel only before God and only Him do we adore.

At the same time, this strict monotheism that we profess teaches us that only from God can we expect all things, and only in Him can we find happiness. This helps us to be less demanding of others and to understand that, since they are not God, it is normal that they might not be perfect. Above all, they are not going to make us happy. At most, they can help us to be happy, but they cannot give us complete happiness because that is beyond the capability of any human being. It also helps us not to despair upon realizing our own imperfections; it is enough to strive to attain sainthood and to start over again each time we fall.

## LOOKING AHEAD


Our **Angel Tree** will be displayed soon with gift tags to purchase for our community in need.


## LIGHTS OF LOVE
