Unless we have another mass or ministerial obligation that day, we will be at the Wednesday, 8:00 AM mass together. Join us! ~ Fr. Mark



On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew,

also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and betraying the Lord on the night of His passion.

Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith.

St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord.

He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting."


Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world.

Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67.

He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

PARENTS' GUIDE TO S M A R T P H O N E

SMART or SCARY?

Smartphones are essentially little computers, so you might be a little worried when handing one over to your child. Take some time to understand the risks and implement a few safeguards so that you can help your child use smartphones safely.



THE RISKS

CYBERBULLYING

With the constant connectivity of smartphones, your child may be more susceptible to cyberbullying or have more opportunities to cyberbully others.

GEOLOCATION

A GPS-enabled smartphone can reveal your child's location through online posts and uploaded photos.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

With smartphones, your child has mobile access to content you may consider inappropriate, such as pornography or violent videos.

SEXTING

Your child may use the Internet and social apps to send, receive, or forward revealing photos.

VIRUSES & MALWARE

Just like a computer, a smartphone is vulnerable to security attacks if your child accesses unsecured websites and apps.

5WAYS TO BE SMARTER THAN THE SMARTPHONE!

1. Be a parent and a resource.

Establish clear guidelines, including time limits and consequences for inappropriate behavior, but be open so your child will come to you with any problems.

2. Set up smart security.

Smartphones today include a variety of security mechanisms including fingerprint scans, facial recognition and password locks. Enable these to protect access to the phone as well as apps with sensitive data.

3. Update the operating system.

New versions often contain important security fixes.

4. Approve apps before they are downloaded.

Make sure you understand their capabilities and approve their content.

5. Understand location services.

GPS features are useful when using maps, but you'll want to disable location-tagging when your child posts anything online.

Santo Tomás Apostol-Fiesta: 3 de julio

Apóstol, quien, al anunciarle los otros discípulos que Jesús había resucitado, no lo creyó, pero cuando Jesús le mostró su costado traspasado por la lanza y le dijo que pusiera su mano en él, exclamó: «Señor mío y Dios mío». Y con esta fe que experimentó es tra-

dición que llevó la palabra del Evangelio a los pueblos de la India. Tomás significa "gemelo".

Cuando Jesús se dirige por última vez a Jerusalén, donde según lo anunciado, será atormentado y lo matarán. En este momento los discípulos sienten un impresionante temor acerca de los graves sucesos que pueden suceder y dicen a Jesús: "Los judíos quieren matarte y ¿vuelves allá? Y es entonces cuando interviene Tomás.

Cuenta San Juan (Jn. 11,16) "Tomás, llamado Dídimo, dijo a los demás: Vayamos también nosotros y muramos con Él". Aquí el apóstol demuestra su admirable valor. O sea: él estaba seguro de una cosa: sucediera lo que sucediera, por grave y terrible que fuera, no quería abandonar a Jesús. Nadie tiene porque sentirse avergonzado de tener miedo y pavor, pero lo que sí nos debe avergonzar es el que a causa del temor dejemos de hacer lo que la conciencia nos dice que sí debemos hacer.

En la Última Cena. Jesús les dijo a los apóstoles: "A donde Yo voy, ya sabéis el camino". Y Tomás le respondió: "Señor: no sabemos a dónde vas, ¿cómo podemos saber el camino?" (Jn. 14, 15). Los apóstoles no lograban entender el camino por el cual debía transitar Jesús, porque ese camino era el de la Cruz. Y entre los apóstoles había uno que jamás podía decir que entendía algo que no lograba comprender. Ese hombre era Tomás. De manera que le expresó a Jesús sus dudas y su incapacidad para entender aquello que Él les estaba diciendo.

(...Cont... Santo Tomas Apostol)

Una de las más importantes afirmaciones que hizo Jesús en toda su vida. Le dijo Jesús: "Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Nadie va al Padre sino por mí". Para no equivocarnos, lo mejor será siempre ser amigos de Jesús y seguir sus santos ejemplos y obedecer sus mandatos. Ese será nuestro camino, y la Verdad nos conseguirá la Vida Eterna".

Los creyentes recordamos siempre al apóstol Santo Tomás por su famosa duda acerca de Jesús resucitado y su admirable profesión de fe cuando vio a Cristo glorioso cuando y e contestó: "Señor mío y Dios mío". Jesús le dijo: "Has creído porque me has visto. Dichosos los que creen sin ver".

Parece que Tomás era pesimista por naturaleza. No le cabía la menor duda de que amaba a Jesús y se sentía muy apesadumbrado por su pasión y muerte. Quizás porque quería sufrir a solas la inmensa pena que experimentaba por la muerte de su amigo, se había retirado por un poco de tiempo del grupo. De manera que cuando Jesús se apareció la primera vez, Tomás no estaba con los demás apóstoles. Y cuando los otros le contaron que el Señor había resucitado, aquella noticia le pareció demasiado hermosa para que fuera cierta.

La tradición antigua dice que Santo Tomás Apóstol fue martirizado en la India el 3 de julio del año 72. Parece que en los últimos años de su vida estuvo evangelizando en Persia y en la India, y que allí sufrió el martirio. (Artículo condensado)


