HOLY FAMILY PARISH

...translates to "son of Talmi" which is an ancient Hebrew name. Many scholars identify him as Nathanael mentioned in the Gospel of John, which says he is from Cana. Bartholomew preached in India, Mesopotamia, Persia, Egypt, and Greater Armenia. The details of Bartholomew's martyrdom are not well established, but it is believed that he was flayed and beheaded in Armenia around 70 AD.

**5. St. Eusebius (Aug.2)** St. Eusebius of Vercelli was the first Bishop of Vercelli. He is famous for establishing a community of priests that lived their lives in the monastic tradition. In addition to work done in his own diocese, he also defended St. Athanasius against Arians at a synod in Milan. His defense of the innocent St. Athanasius resulted in him being exiled by Emperor Constantine II. He was sent to Syria and Egypt where he was dragged through the streets and persecuted by Arians for his beliefs.

**6. St. Peter Julian Eymard (Aug. 2)** French priest who lived in the 19th C. He grew up in poverty, working with his father as a cutler until age eighteen when he entered the seminary. After completing the seminary, St. Peter Julian entered the Marists. He also founded two religious institutes: the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament for men, and the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament for women.

**7. Article 291 From the Catechism:** What is required to receive Holy Communion? To receive it one must be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church,, be in state of grace (not conscious of being in mortal sin). If not, we must receive first the sacrament of Reconciliation before going for communion. **The fast prescribed by the Church is not to eat or drink 1 hour before RECEIVING the Holy Communion. ( not one hour before the mass starts, but one hour before the time that we are actually approaching the altar to receive the Lord.**

**Please restrain from chewing gum, or taking lozenges , candies, or pills. It is a sign of respect to receive our Lord in our bodies and we keep a spirit of recollection and prayer for the gift we are about to receive. Water or medicines before communion are exempted.**

**9. FROM THE VATICAN:** The Youth Jubilee in Rome will be held from July 28 to August 3, 2025, as part of the larger Catholic Church's Jubilee Year celebration. Young people from around the world are invited to participate in a week of events focused on faith, hope, and fraternity that will help deepen their relationship with Christ. The Jubilee will include a special meeting with Pope Leo XIV and culminate in a grand final celebration. At least 1,000 young people from across Canada are expected to travel to Rome. Lets keep them in our prayers for a successful and safe gathering..

In today's liturgical texts, God is called the Defender of those who trust; and the One who shows His great mercy. He alone is the ever-faithful Friend of man and, in the end, will prove to be the Only Friend. He is and wants to be that friend, for us. "He himself gives power and strength to his people." Abraham appeals to God himself, to His justice. Abraham senses that God is Friend and Father. A few righteous men are enough to save the "wicked." I will not destroy this city for the sake of these ten. Thus instructed, we confess: "The Lord answered me when I called." He heard the words of my mouth. Therefore I sing and worship the Lord in His temple. I praise His name for the grace and faithfulness shown to me; for sustaining my life in the midst of troubles, He saves me. He recognizes in me the work of His hands and does not abandon me, because through Baptism we have become children of God. Jesus Christ, He who became Man for us, took upon Himself the sins of each of us. He died on the Cross for our salvation, to bury our misery in His own death, and through His resurrection, to create a new Man. In Holy Baptism, we were raised from death together with Christ to life with God. This is how Christ opens for us the Land of Eternal Life. In Christ, we have become adopted children of God. He taught us to call God Father. "And you, pray: Our Father..." The fact that Jesus prayed prompted the Apostles to ask: "Lord, teach us to pray." Jesus teaches us to pray. "Our Father..." in his Gospel, Saint Luke presents a prayer at the center of which is the request for the bread we need daily. This petition is preceded by two invocations, the themes of which are the glory of God and the coming of His Kingdom. Besides daily bread, what is most necessary for man is the forgiveness of sins and deliverance from evil. Who-

...ever prays with a sincere heart is a disciple of Christ. Saint Luke adds words to Jesus' prayer that encourage supplicatory prayer. Let us remember! God is our Father. He desires to bestow upon us numerous gifts, but he gives them only to those who ask for them in prayer. "Ask, and it will be given to you; ... Everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and he who knocks, that door will be opened." Therefore, the Liturgy encourages us today: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and do not forget all His benefits."

**Readings: (a)** We turn to God, our protector and our Guide and our Defender who hastens with help and strengthens us His people. (b) Our successes can make us too busy, and we may miss the real meaning of true success in God's eye. This is like a warning: **If you hear the voice of the Lord, harden not your hearts; ask and you shall receive.** Look for God, do not forsake the work of his hands, He who raised Christ from the dead. Say: **Father hallowed be your name.** Gather your treasures before the Lord.

#### FROM THE CHURCH & PARISH

**1. Sts. Martha, Mary & Lazarus (Jul.29)** Martha and her siblings Mary and Lazarus are remembered as close friends of Jesus. The Bible depicts Jesus as a welcome guest at their home. These sisters even call for Jesus when their brother Lazarus is dying. After Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead, he said "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" Martha replies, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world".

**2. St. Peter Chrysologus (Jul.30)** He was Bishop of Ravenna in Northern Italy. He is known as the "Doctor of Homilies" for the concise and theologically rich reflections he delivered. St. Peter's short homilies were his weapon against the paganism that was rampant in Italy, while he was bishop. He was named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XII.

**3. St. Ignatius of Loyola (Jul.31)** Spanish priest who founded the Society of Jesus, or the Jesuit order. Ignatius was a true mystic. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity—the Trinity, Christ, and the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam*—"for the greater glory of God." St. Ignatius is also remembered as an influential spiritual director and is the author of the *Spiritual Exercises* first published in 1548.

**4. St. Alphonsus Liguori (Aug.1)** Not much is certain about his life. His name, *Bartholomaios*,
