6.St. Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop (Oct.24) Archbishop in Spain, founder of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (Claretians). Patron saint of weavers as he was the son of a weaver and a weaver himself before joining the priesthood. Participated in the first Vatican Council. He famously wrote about the traits of one filled with the zeal of Christ: "Nothing deters him: he rejoices in poverty; he labors strenuously; he welcomes hardships; he laughs off false accusations; he rejoices in anguish. He thinks only of how he might follow Jesus Christ and imitate him by his prayers, his labors, his sufferings, and by caring always and only for the glory of God and the salvation of souls.

7. Bl. John Wojciech Balicki (Oct.24) Polish Catholic priest; served as a confessor and spiritual director to seminarians in Poland around the time of World War II. Acted in various leadership positions in the education of new priests and was noted for his intellectual gifts.

8. 9. NEWS FROM THE WORLD: Pope Leo XIV's apostolic exhortation "Dilexi te" (I have loved you) reminds us that Christian love cannot stop at words, but must be expressed in deeds. In this spirit, for 28 years now, the parish of Our Lady Queen of Poland in Chojnice has been dedicated to offer "mercy in practice." This concrete work is a soup kitchen, a place where people receive not only a warm meal but also dignity and "spiritual nourishment." Daily help from the Parish goes out not only to regular recipients of welfare, but *transient people that do not have any other support in the community. They serve 20-130 substantial meals a day,* says parish priest Father Janusz Chyla. "These are nutritious meals. On Fridays, those who use the soup kitchen also receive provisions for the weekend," he adds. The soup kitchen, which has been running for almost 30 years, serves hundreds of people in need each year. Funding comes from various sources: the Municipal Social Welfare Center, parish support, and voluntary donations. Let's praise the Lord to keep and support our Sault Ste. Marie volunteers to keep offering—as always—the same charitable attitude in all our communities!

1. St. Marguerite Alacoque (apologies for quoting October 14 as her celebration... in last week's Bulletin.)

2. St. John Kanty, Priest (Oct.20) Polish priest, theologian, and philosopher; known for his humility, scholarship, and charity. Professor at the University of Krakow; he became a Doctor in Philosophy and Theology. Despite a period of exile due to jealous colleagues, he returned to the university, where he continued to teach until his death. He is the patron saint of Poland and Lithuania, canonized in 1767.

3. Bl. Jakub Strzeme, Bishop & Martyr (Oct.21) He defended the mendicant friars from attacks from the secular wing of the Polish priesthood and government while also defending the rights of the faithful; became Vicar-General of the Franciscan missions in western Russia and organized the construction of religious houses and schools as well as new churches and additional hospitals in his archdiocese.

4. Dedication of Consecrated Churches (Oct.22) This feast day commemorates all churches whose exact date of consecration is not known and provides a yearly celebration for the dedication of any such church .

5. St. John of Capistrano, Priest (Oct.23) Franciscan priest; lived a political career, extensive missionary journeys to reunite separated Eastern Christians with Rome; reformed studies of Franciscan brothers, and enhanced strategies for military battle. He is the patron of military chaplains.
