The Commemoration of ALL the
FAITHFUL DEPARTED
November 2, 2025 - Year C

It is not death that is the main content of today's celebration – but **LIFE** – new life, life with God and in God, communion of life with the Risen Christ. **The sadness felt over the death of loved ones and friends is tempered by the certainty that they possess new life, over which death no longer has power.** We believe that God's eternal love and His unfathomable mercy are stronger than death. Our God is the God of the living, not the dead, and therefore God desires to welcome everyone into His fatherly house, where there are many dwellings... Today, therefore, we pray for our deceased, that they may share in the resurrection of Jesus and that we may become like Him in His glory. Our deceased today appear to us as truly living in God. All Souls' Day reminds us of our community and the solidarity of human fate, which seems always to end the same way: in death and in a grave. However, if you believe and live by this faith, tears of sorrow turn into Easter joy and remind us of our communion with God and our future resurrection "Jesus died and rose again. God will unite with Him those who have died in Jesus. As in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. Thus instructed, we pray that the Almighty God strengthen our hope that we will all rise from the dead. It was with this hope that Job fulfilled his ministry. And today we cry out: "In the punishment of life, I will see the goodness of God"—the defender of my life. Therefore, I pray: "Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud... I believe that they will see the Lord's godness in the land of the living." For in Christ, all will be made alive. Jesus Christ is the firstborn from the dead. To Him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen. Everyone who lives and believes in Him will never die. And we pray that all who profess faith in the resurrection may share in the joy of eternal life. The Psalmist sang: "As a deer longs for streams of water, so my soul longs for You, O God... You are my joy and delight." Saint John the Apostle wrote: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son..

... whoever believes in Him has eternal life." Today, we pray, Lord, that You would wash our deceased brothers and sisters of their sins and grant them full forgiveness, "for You are full of goodness," and "the salvation of the righteous comes from the Lord," who, like a father, has compassion on his children. God's grace is eternal for His followers, over all who keep His commandments. What is seen, passes away; what is unseen, lasts forever. "This is my Father's will that everyone who believes in the Son may have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." In the Father's house there are many mansions... We pray, Lord, open the gates of Your Kingdom to our dead, so that, freed from the bonds of sin, they may share in eternal life. We all "await our Saviour, Jesus Christ, who will "...transform our mortal bodies to be like his glorious body and give us the fullness of eternal joy."

2. ALL SAINTS’DAY (Nov. 1, 2025) Today's celebration is a Thanksgiving for the saved men. Jesus—like a grain of wheat cast upon the earth— produces an abundant harvest: the Saints, the Blessed, and all the saved ones; all who continue to grow from the death and resurrection of Jesus and reach full maturity. Today, we turn our gaze to the final harvest when the Lord will come and command "the wheat to be gathered into the barn." Today, we think of the day when the saved will shine "like the sun in the kingdom of their Father." We are still burdened by the weight of earthly life and its many tribulations. Now, we are sustained by faith in the "COMMUNION OF SAINTS,"; that means we have a bond that unite us with the saints and the saved in heaven. We hope that we too, will achieve the full freedom and glory of the children of God. We already have the Holy Spirit who will lead us to full glory with all the Saints whom we honour today. "As we celebrate the feast of All Saints, let us all rejoice in the Lord and, with the angels, praise the Son of God, so that through the intercession of All Saints, He may generously grant us the forgiveness we long for. The Book of Revelation shows us the bright side of world history, which is the history of salvation, and this is revealed in the vision of the full gathering of the saved ones before the throne of God. It is from God that salvation for tormented humanity comes, it is the salvation accomplished by the Lamb seated on the throne. Through the sacrificial death and exaltation of the Lamb, death was conquered, and new life—indestructible—entered this transient world. This new life is the deepest meaning of our existence. Although bodily death has not yet been removed from the world, “for all who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb”, it has become a transition from oppression and persecution into the world of God, where there is no suffering and no death. From this source, through faith, we must draw strength and power for the difficult days ahead. We ourselves struggle to understand what it means to be a child of God, what it means to be raised and formed by God's love. "If we act justly," we gradually become able to perceive God's presence in our neighbours and in our world. The Beatitudes are addressed to all people,
