LET US LISTEN TO OUR BETTER ANGELS

"We are not enemies, but friends. We must not be enemies. Though passion may have strained, it must not break our bonds of affection. The mystic chords of memory will swell when again touched, as surely they will be, by the better angels of our nature." – Abraham Lincoln, First Inaugural Address, given on March 4, 1861

Believe it or not, there was a time when our country was more divided than it is now. Lincoln's eloquent assurances in his first inaugural address as the sixteenth President of the United States were not enough to avoid a devastating Civil War. At least the politicians today are not calling men to arms, but some of them are unfortunately encouraging their supporters to act in ways that are uncivil. We should expect better of our leaders, but they are a reflection of the moral character of our society today.

We no longer require decency in manners even from the highest office in the land, or honesty and consistency among the members of Congress. News media present reports which they know are false or misleading. Perhaps this dishonesty and lack of decency is tolerated because the population as a whole does not abide by higher standards in their own conduct and conversation. When people disagree with us we too often make them our enemy. If they agree with us we excuse any egregious faults. We sully our opponents' motives and refuse to consider other points of view. When we are insulted we strike back with the same vitriol, and feel justified for it.

The lack of decorum in public is a sad reality which arguably is paralyzing much of the work of government. Worse yet, this prevalence of intolerance and failure to speak amicably is even affecting American families. Many families today are being torn apart by the inability of the members to respect each other's points of view on politics, religion, or lifestyle. They have trouble moving past differences or perceived hurts to allow their common heritage and memories to hold them together.

How do we save the situation, in the body politic and in the family? One way is by trying to see the other side. Recognizing the validity of certain points made by the opposition, or at least their sincerity, does not compromise our integrity. And even if I don't believe that they are sincere, I am should not bow to their level by insulting them. Surely, on some issues there is an objective right and wrong, for instance, in regard to slavery and abortion. But even if I know that I am right, I should not be so intellectually lazy as to refuse to consider an argument contrary to mine. If we try to understand why someone believes the way they do we will be able to speak more congenially with them.

A willingness to engage a counter-argument does not reveal weakness or lack of conviction. It reveals sincerity and confidence. If we do not have the confidence to consider the other side, we ought to ask ourselves why. Maybe we need to make a better effort to understand why we believe what we believe. Truth has no need to fear falsehood. Consideration of other points of view can help me to solidify my own convictions and base them on more solid foundations. It can expose false supports for a correct foundational belief or enlighten me to a truth to which I was heretofore blind. For example, if I had not considered the other side I would never have become Catholic. My initial exploration of Catholicism was for the purpose of understanding, not for conversion. The truth, however, is compelling when it meets someone who is open to it. It was painful to admit that some of what I believed was not true. I found that the truth can hurt, but that it also heals, and embracing it is never bad.

We can contribute to a more civil and respectful atmosphere in our society and our families by remembering that personal conviction does not exempt us from the moral obligation to respect others. As a follower of Christ, I am not allowed to judge or condemn my neighbor, even if he or she promotes something which I know to be contrary to God's law. I am always obligated to speak the truth in love, and never return evil for evil. The sun must not go down on my anger. Jesus told me to turn the other cheek. I must avoid calumny and protect the reputation of others. I must also seek the truth in all things, and try to see beyond my personal prejudices, ideologies and cultural conditioning.

Christians have an opportunity today to stand out as those who hold strong convictions but know how to speak and act with charity. Our goal is not to look good or to win an argument but to humbly serve the truth. Moreover, our strongest convictions and our greatest desires should focus not on politics but on the gospel. We may or may not be right in our political convictions. We are right to believe in the gospel. In our interaction with others our overriding goal should be to help them know that God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that whosoever believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life.


The estimated income for our 2020 fiscal year budget has been adjusted to reflect recent historical income numbers. Our income goal is \$722,000 for the Offertory collection. Our beloved church with the associated facilities is 18 years old. As in your home, maintenance costs and operating costs need to be addressed. You have demonstrated your generosity to enable us to fulfill our fiscal responsibilities. Please continue to be generous.

Parish Appeal Update

The 2020 Parish Appeal is off to an excellent start. In the first seven weeks we have pledges from two-hundred and four families for more than \$70,500 with \$46,964 in hand. The Appeal is supporting continuing operations of the Parish. The first \$150,000 will go to balance the parish budget; the remainder will go toward the emergency fund for unbudgeted, major expenses for the church; e.g., the ultimate replacement of the church roof. 


