

## THROWING STONES



*Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her" (John 8:2-7).*

We celebrate Independence Day this year in the context of large demonstrations throughout the country of protestors and rioters who see only evil and no good in American history. They have torn down statues of the founding fathers, Christopher Columbus and even St. Junípero Serra. They have attacked the World War II monument in Washington, D.C. despite the fact that the war brought an end to the racial cleansing of Europe by the Nazis. Even the statue of an abolitionist in Wisconsin who gave his life in 1863 for the cause was destroyed. There may be some statues that should be taken down. But issues of who and how to honor historical figures is a matter to be decided at the ballot box and by elected officials, not by rioting crowds. It is a failure of duty on the part of mayors and other officials to allow ignorant and violent crowds to control the streets and public squares, and to destroy property. Their dereliction of duty is a threat to the functioning of democracy and to the safety of the public. This is not only a political issue, but a moral issue, since human rights are involved.

Racism is a terrible vice which needs to be condemned, as I have done numerous times from the pulpit and in writing. It is the original sin of the founders of our country, who hypocritically adopted a Declaration of Independence from Britain which proclaimed the right of all men to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, but allowed for the continuance of slavery in the new nation. Not only that, they also allowed states to deny the franchise to men without property, and to women, who did not win the right to vote until the Constitution was amended in 1920. Clearly, there were injustices in the founding of the United States government. But should we let these faults, as egregious as they are, delegitimize the honoring of America and the men and women who made her what she is today?

We are in a sorry place indeed if someone has to have never made a mistake in order to be honored. Consider that President Lyndon B. Johnson got Congress to pass the Voting Rights Act in 1965 by a rousing speech to Congress which was broadcast throughout the country, stirring up support among the public. It took political courage, for there was strong opposition from members of his own party. His signing of the legislation was a decisive moment in ensuring the right of African Americans to freely participate in elections, and he is justly honored for it. But Johnson also got the U.S. entangled in a no-win war in Vietnam that cost tens of thousands of Vietnamese and American lives. Must we ignore the good he did and remember only the bad? Should we forget this hero of the civil rights movement and topple his likenesses and remove his name from buildings? I suggest that honoring Johnson for making America more of a democracy does not do dishonor to those who suffered from his decisions in foreign policy.

Surely there has never been a great nation, tribe or city without a regret in its history. The United States is no exception. But we must not disregard the good that America has done at home and around the world because she did some bad things. It seems to me that even if we have not reached the goal of equal justice and opportunity for all, we ought to celebrate the progress that has been made, which is substantial. Moreover, it would be a shame not to celebrate our nation as the earth's longest-lasting representative democracy, admired around the world for her stability, prosperity, freedoms, and ideals. It is love for America, not hate, that will move us to strive for the conditions that will allow all Americans to share in her prosperity. True patriotism motivates people to want what is best for their country and to sacrifice to achieve it. It does not ignore the problems but pushes for their reformation.

No country has ever become prosperous and secure without citizens who sacrificed to build it. No one makes sacrifices for something they despise. Hating America and pulling down statues will never make her better. She will be better if we strengthen our democratic institutions, carry on respectful dialogue, and make laws to protect all human life from conception to natural death. Just as it is healthy to celebrate our birthday or a personal accomplishment, even though we are painfully aware of personal failures and shortcomings, so it is healthy, in my opinion, to celebrate the United States of America on the anniversary of her founding. Her past and her present are a mixed bag. But let the one who is without sin be the first to throw stones at the statues of her heroes.

### Parish Finances

Please Note:

Fiscal year results for the Offertory Collection will be presented in next weekend's bulletin.

For the 2019 - 2020 fiscal year our budgeted offertory income goal is \$722,000. This is \$150,000 less than needed to balance the overall parish budget. That deficit will be made up by the Annual Parish Appeal. This week more than seventy percent of our regular weekly donors contributed. Our offertory financial support for June 21 is about \$3,000 more than the budgeted amount. For the fiscal year, despite the shutdown, our offertory collection is about 2% more than our budgeted amount. Thank you. Keep up the good work.

### Parish Appeal Update

The 2020 Parish Appeal is doing well thanks to you. In the first thirty-four weeks of the campaign we have commitments from two hundred eight-two families for more than \$140,900 with \$132,832 received. The first \$150,000 will go to balance the parish budget; the remainder will go toward the emergency fund for unbudgeted, major expenses for the church; e.g., the ultimate replacement of the church roof.

#### St. Benedict, Abbot (July 11th)



St. Benedict (died 547 A.D.) wrote the famous Monastic Rule noted for its wisdom and moderation and need for obedience. He founded twelve monasteries including Monte Cassino. 

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We are all familiar with the refrain, “You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!” In Baptism, we “put on” Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means. It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God’s vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life’s journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God’s unconditional love to my hurtful memories and sinful choices. With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn’t it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced!


