FORMING A POLITICAL CONSCIENCE

The Church encourages Catholics to be involved in politics. The bishops of the United States, in their document *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, state that "In the Catholic tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation." We are required by our faith to promote the common good, which means taking an active part in public life, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "each according to his position and role" (#1913). For most of us, this means at minimum we exercise our right to vote. But our efforts to influence public policy should go beyond the voting booth. Since Jesus teaches that we should love our neighbor as ourselves, we should never hesitate to advocate for justice and peace.

It is not the role of pastors to tell the faithful how to vote. But it is their responsibility to help them to form their consciences. In *Forming Consciences* the bishops state that, "the obligation to teach the moral truths that should shape our lives, including our public lives, is central to the mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ...The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience. Catholics have a serious and lifelong obligation to form their consciences in accord with human reason and the teaching of the Church" (my emphasis!). As good pastors, bishops and priests must help the Catholic faithful to speak about and act on public issues by making known to them the social teaching of the Church.

The bishops recognize that "politics in our country often can be a contest of powerful interests, partisan attacks, sound bites, and media hype." This reality, however, should not discourage us from participating in the shaping of public policy. Rather, "Our commitment as people of faith to imitate Christ's love and compassion should challenge us to serve as models of civil dialogue, especially in a context where discourse is eroding at all levels of society." This means striving to understand before striving to be understood, to treat people with opposing viewpoints respectfully, to reject stereotypes, and to avoid vitriol. At the same time, we are not to be wilting flowers (my metaphor) and remain silent out of an exaggerated sense of humility or to avoid conflict, and much less because of fear. Christ is our model; more than a few times he stirred things up, but always with a pure heart and an unselfish desire to promote what is good.

One of the most important ways that the Church helps Catholics to form a faith-based conscience is by teaching them her social doctrine. Its principles are based on the natural law, which is why they can be entered into discussion in a non-religious context. Their truthfulness can be grasped by reason, apart from divine revelation. At the same time, the Church is aware that sin and concupiscence weaken people's will to do good and to think rightly. There is where the Church has an advantage over the secular world in her ability to discern objective moral principles, for in his generosity God provides humanity with the ability to reason and with divine mandates. Where reason fails, divine revelation picks it up. For example, each of the Ten Commandments is an article of reason as well as of faith. When engaging in public debate, Catholics draw upon their faith but they make their arguments according to reasonable principles that a person without faith ought to be able to perceive as just. Next week my article will be on the four basic principles of Catholic social doctrine.

Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard: What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done? Why, when I looked for the crop of grapes, did it bring forth wild grapes? Now, I will let you know what I mean to do with my vineyard: take away its hedge, give it to grazing, break through its wall, let it be trampled! Yes, I will make it a ruin: it shall not be pruned or hoed, but overgrown with thorns and briars; I will command the clouds not to send rain upon it. The vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his cherished plant; he looked for judgment, but see, bloodshed! for justice, but hark, the outcry!

SECOND READING PHIL 4:6-9

Brothers and sisters: Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you.

GOSPEL MT 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times." Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: *The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes?* Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

COMMUNION ANTIphon: The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

For the 2021 fiscal year our budgeted Offertory income goal is \$740,000. This is less than what we need to balance the overall parish budget. We plan to make up that deficit from the Annual Parish Appeal. This week about seventy-eight percent of our regular weekly donors contributed. As a result, our Offertory financial support for September was \$788 less than the budgeted Offertory support. Please keep up your good work until all our weekly donors return to Mass.

Parish Appeal Update

The 2020 Parish Appeal is doing well thanks to you. In the first forty-eight weeks of the campaign we have commitments from two-hundred and ninety-three families for more than \$159,500 with \$156,292 received. The first \$150,000 will go to balance the parish budget; the remainder will go toward the emergency fund for unbudgeted, major expenses for the church; e.g., the ultimate replacement of the church roof. The 2020 Parish Appeal will conclude on October 31, 2020.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Do you ever wonder why things never seem to come together? We see glimpses of consistency, equity, justice, peace, harmony, and wellbeing, but it always falls short. Human life is still expendable and manipulated, people are used for personal advancement, countries are at war, the economy continues to face turbulence, anger and frustration are widespread, and happiness is the possession of just a few and not the many. Could it be that we are serving the wrong kingdom? We keep trying to make our kingdom work and find ourselves still scratching our heads after repeatedly failed attempts to do so. It is almost as if people are saying, "we'll get it right this time if we do ...," as if some new and secret innovation has yet to be tried.

We serve God's kingdom. We may not like hearing that, but it is true. God did not make only a few of us. God made all of humanity and all of humanity is called into service. How often do we defer any of our decision making to God? Secular leaders enjoy winking at the Sacred Scriptures and using them when they advance a cause, but are they really listened to? Even those who consider themselves believers tend to sift through God's Word, taking what seems to fit and apply and discarding the rest. After all, if we were really serving God's kingdom, we would see an abundance of fruit testifying to this fact. But what's growing on the vine is anything other than good Gospel-centered fruit.

Nothing in this world or the next belongs to us. We have such a hard time believing this and live our lives as if everything belongs to us. And, the fruit does not lie. Trees that are neglected and not properly fertilized reveal that fact. They cannot keep these deep secrets from being discovered. If God's kingdom was really being served, then life would have looked much differently after the crucifixion. By now, there would be plenty of fantastic fruit to harvest in abundance: faith, hope, love, prudence, temperance, justice, and fortitude. Do we see these in abundance around us? Why not?

Still we grapple with ownership, privilege, status, and the protection of our rights. It's all about us and what we want, think we need, and expect to acquire. When did this change of focus occur? We may be struggling with this since humanity's day in the garden and have never understood that the focus cannot be on us and the apple but on God and God's justice. Maybe the only answer is that the Kingdom be taken from us and given to someone who is willing to do a better job. Is that the fate we really want?


