

The Paper Pulpit

In our first reading today, we see St. Peter, the first pope, make a decision as to whether early Christians needed to be circumcised before they were baptized. He said no, and that has been the decision from that time on, even today. I'd encourage you to read the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. The Church back then did not look the same as it does today. It doesn't look like it did in the 1950's either. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read about the first pope, first bishops, first priests and deacons, about baptism, moral questions and so much more about the Church in the '30's '40's and '50s (almost 2,000 years ago). Why not start reading it now? If not, what is your excuse?

Please join us for our new scripture study on Tuesday evenings beginning at 7:15 pm. We are discussing the Mass. This is a great study, especially if you have never done a Bible study before. Come and learn why we do what we do at Mass. This is a very practical study. Did you know everything we do at Mass has a purpose? Did you know that it all comes from the Bible. Come with your questions. It's only for four weeks. You can invest four hours into understanding your faith can't you? If not, why not? What is your excuse?

We offer two opportunities each week to spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, Sunday evenings from 6:30 to 7:30 pm and Tuesday evenings from 5:00 to 6:00 pm. This week come and pray in thanksgiving for our catechists who taught our children this past year. Come and pray for your children, your grandchildren and children in the parish you may not know but who could all use your prayers. Will you come and give Jesus an hour? Could you use an hour of prayer? Will you come? If not, why not? What is your excuse?

Now that I've made you feel guilty (some good ole Catholic guilt is good), let's turn to the gospel. Today's readings present the possibility of a filial relationship with God. Filial refers to intimacy and trust that can exist between a parent and child. A story from Peru illustrates filial trust in God: It happened that a missionary priest was visiting his extensive parish high in the Andes Mountains. The best way to reach certain parts of the parish was by horseback. Once, toward sunset, the priest got disoriented and could not find the way back to his base camp. Rather than risk exposure at such an altitude, he decided to give his horse free rein and hope to find shelter. After a couple of hours of wandering, he saw a welcome sight. In the distance, a lamp burned in a hut. This was unusual because the native people went to bed shortly after dark in order to get up at an early hour. When the priest got near the hut, a man ran out, "Padre, padrecito," he exclaimed, "I knew you would come." Surprised, the priest asked how he knew he would come there. The man said, "My mother has been praying all day that a priest would come. She is dying." The priest went inside, heard the woman's confession, and then gave her holy anointing and Communion. The woman softly spoke these final words, "Taita Dios heard me." Taita Dios is not easy to translate. Dios of course means God, but Taita is hard to translate. It is an intimate, affectionate way of addressing one's father. Taita is like "daddy," except that a grown person could say it with no embarrassment. Taita Dios, my dear Father, has heard me.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us if someone keeps His word, "The Father will love him." He then describes an intimacy impossible for us to imagine. He tells us He and the Father will dwell within us - by the power of the Holy Spirit. This intimacy has a high price. You know one of the most painful things in this life is the physical separation from someone we love. Some of us have experienced that in relation to our mom - or some other much loved person. Jesus tells us today the reason for separation - so that we might have an even more intimate union. The disciples were devastated by the death of Jesus, but then came the great miracle of the Resurrection.

Now, Jesus explains He must once again go from their sight. He does it for a reason, so he can send the Advocate. An advocate is the one who stands up for us, like an attorney. Jesus calls the Holy Spirit to make possible an intimate union with the Trinity - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Like that faith-filled indigenous woman, we can say, "Taita Dios," my dear Father, has heard us. Yes, the Father hears us. Will we listen to him? Will we take time in prayer? If not, why not? What is your excuse?
