

Jesus presents in the Gospel a wise and patient God who allows the good and the evil to coexist in the world and blesses the evil ones for the little good they may have done, so that they may come to conversion before their time ends.

In other words, God awaits repentant sinners, giving them the strength and good will to get reconciled with Him. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR MASSES!


