

SPECIAL FEAST DAYS DURING ADVENT ST NICHOLAS THE TRUE SANTA CLAUS DECEMBER 6

Do you believe in Santa Claus? Is that a true Santa Claus?

Back to late 1960's, my family went to Town and Country Mall on Page Ave in Overland, MO where there was shopping along the hall. There was a large Christmas tree with a Santa chair in the hall. My sister, brother and I hopped on Santa Claus's lap and he asked us what we wanted for Christmas.

On Christmas eve, we left a glass of eggnog and several cookies on the table near our real, large Christmas tree. We realized that we



We were in bed and tried to stay awake and hoped to catch him in our sights but it never happened because we fell asleep and missed him! A few years later, we did not believe Santa Claus, but it is a great memory.

Don't be shocked! I do believe in Santa Claus...am I crazy or weird? LOL. But, I do not believe that he flies in the sky with reindeers and drops presents off at every home around the world. Why do you think that I believe in him? His real name was Saint Nicholas. But people called him Santa Claus. I found an interesting story to share with you below:


Saint Nicholas was a Christian bishop who provided for the poor and sick and is the basis for the popular character of Santa Claus. After his death, the legend of his gift-giving grew. He transformed into the legendary character called Santa Claus, who brings Christmas presents to children around the world.



A poor man who had three daughters and could not afford to pay their dowries and decided to put them into prostitution. St Nicholas secretly went to their house at night and put a bag of money inside. He did the same for the second daughter. On the third visit, the father caught him and thanked him for his kindness.

His uncle (also named Nicholas) was a bishop of Myra, Lycia, and ordained

him to the priesthood. St Nicholas gave all of his money to the poor people, entered the monastery, and then became an abbot. After his uncle passed away, St Nicholas was chosen to be a bishop of Myra. He and other priests, deacons and bishops were imprisoned and tortured for the Faith during the persecution waged by Emperor Diocletian. Later, he was released by Emperor Constantine after the legalization of Christianity.



Various stories about St Nicholas helping others:

Three innocent men were punished to die by beheading. He went over to stop the guard and rescued them and moved to do penance.

Sailors were on a ship and got caught in a terrible storm at sea. St Nicholas was still on the land and took to prayer. The miracle prayer answered was that the wind and waves were calmed and the sailors were safe.



St Nicholas was traveling in France, stopped at the inn and at night, he dreamed that three boys were lured, murdered and hid their bodies in a brine tub by an evil butcher. St Nicholas got up and confronted the butcher. He raised three boys back to life and returned them to their families.

There are many more stories where he saved many innocent people, rescued people from disasters, helped those in poverty, rescued missing children and more.

St Nicholas passed away on December 6, 343 in Myra. He was buried at his cathedral church.

Because of the many miracles, St Nicholas is known as Nicholas the Wonderworker. He is the patron saint of sailors, merchants, archers, repentant thieves, prostitutes, children, brewers, pawnbrokers, unmarried people, and students in various cities and countries around Europe and more.

Now, do you believe in Santa Claus? If so, do not leave fire in your fireplace or leave door unlocked!!! If not, you will get a black charcoal in your stocking!!!



Immaculate Conception Feast of Virgin Mary December 8

One of my favorite feelings is when I finish going to confession. I am happy to know that God has forgiven my sins, and to know that I receive grace from God, I receive his love, to help me to be strong if I am tempted to sin again. Can you imagine what it would be like if life were always like that? What if we always know God's love for us, and we never were tempted to sin again? That would be amazing!

If we go back to the beginning of the Bible in Genesis, we read about Ad-

am and Eve sinning by eating the fruit from the tree of knowledge, even though God told them not to. Because of that, all people have been born with "original sin". That is why we all need to be baptized and receive forgiveness from God. There have been two other people after Adam and Eve who did not have "original sin" when they were born, can you guess who? Yes, one person is Jesus, the Son of God. Jesus does not sin since he is God. But there is one other person, can you guess who? It is his mother, Mary.

The Church teaches that Mary was born with no "original sin." How do we know this? Where is it in the bible? It is not written in the Bible, but we read that the angel Gabriel said to Mary "Hail Mary, full of grace" No one was ever said to be "full of grace" except for Mary. Grace is God's love, and if Mary was full of God's love, then there is no room for sin.

On December 8th every year, the Catholic Church celebrates the Immaculate Conception. This is a celebration of Mary becoming a baby in her mother's womb. We say that Mary is "Immaculate" meaning that she is pure, because she has no "original sin." Many Catholics confuse Immaculate Conception and think of the time when Gabriel announced to Mary that she would give birth to baby Jesus, but that day is called the

give birth to baby Jesus, but that day is called the "Annunciation." Garbriel "announced" to Mary that she would give birth to baby Jesus. The Annunciation is on March 25, 9 months before Christmas, because mothers usually are pregnant for 9 months, right! So on the Immaculate Conception, we celebrate Mary becoming a baby in her mother's womb, and Mary is pure and has no "original sin."
