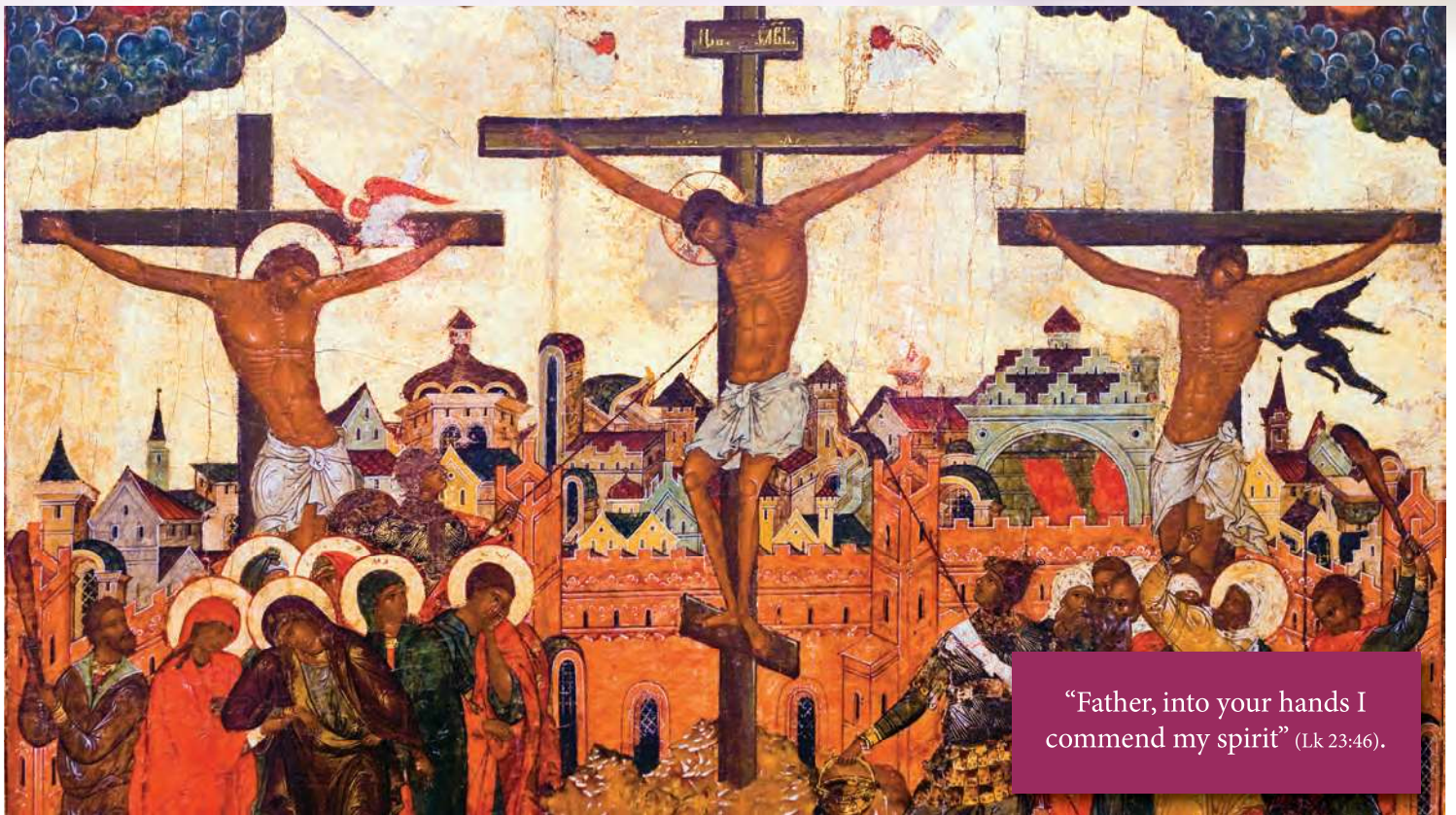

Lenten Reflections on Mercy and Forgiveness

Week 6

READINGS: *Isaiah 50:4–7; Philippians 2:6–11; Luke 22:14—23:56*



“Father, into your hands I
commend my spirit” (Lk 23:46).

Christ's sacrifice allows us to find meaning in suffering

The Passion of Christ is the pinnacle of all human suffering gathered together in one man, Jesus of Nazareth. He believed you were worth it. He believed everyone, even those who seem farthest away from him, to be worth dying for.

It is through the Cross that we come to understand God's mercy. In the Crucifixion, the greatest sacrifice the world has ever known takes place. On that tree, God's only Son shows us that the path toward salvation requires his saving power, his unending gift of forgiveness.

God desires mercy so much that he

was willing to die to prove to us its worth. In dying he destroyed death, and in rising again he restored us to life. Without this act of ultimate sacrifice, our own sufferings would have no purpose. But because of his pain, we are able to find meaning in our sufferings.

We partake in the mystery of suffering by uniting our trials and tears to Jesus. He suffers alongside us in times of need and never ceases to call us through difficult times to a closer communion with him.

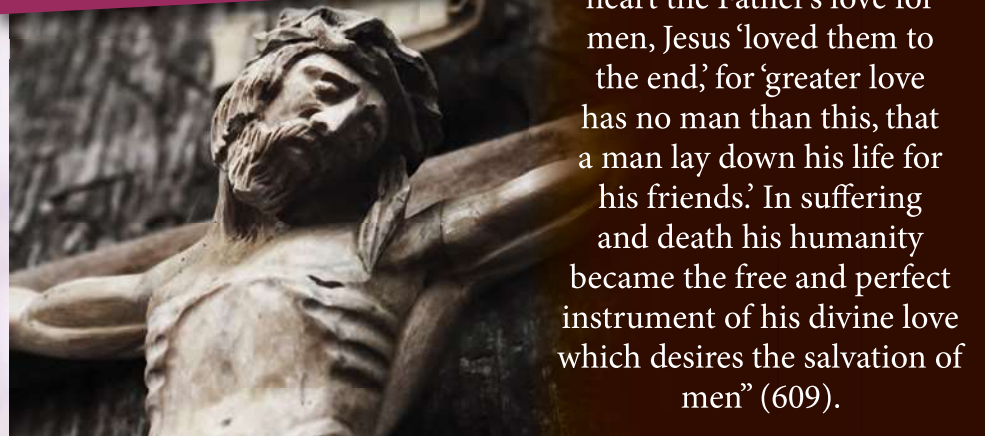
In his mercy, we are given hope that one day our darkness will become light

and our sorrows will become eternal joy. We need only to accept our crosses and follow him (see Mt 16:24).

Catechism Chat



“By embracing in his human heart the Father’s love for men, Jesus ‘loved them to the end,’ for ‘greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.’ In suffering and death his humanity became the free and perfect instrument of his divine love which desires the salvation of men” (609).



Saint

The great denial was forgiven

Peter was one of Jesus’ closest followers. He was one of the first called by Jesus and stood by Jesus at almost every moment of his public ministry. However, when it came time for Jesus’ passion and death, Peter denied his master and was too ashamed, or afraid, to see his Lord die at the Crucifixion. After Jesus rose from the dead, one of his first tasks was to assure Peter that his sins were forgiven and that he would lead the rest of the apostles after Jesus’ ascension into heaven.

Saint Peter committed one of the worst sins a person can commit when he denied the man who he knew to be the Son of God. However, his repentance was pure and his sorrow was genuine. When he was forgiven by Jesus, his sadness and anguish were like coals turned into diamonds of an unshakable faith and an unquenchable thirst for souls.

God’s mercy has a way of changing the very fabric of who we are. May he fashion our souls into the great saints we were meant to be.

Faith Lesson



Our suffering can purify our souls

One of the great deposits of spiritual power in our world comes through what is known as redemptive suffering. We believe as Catholics that our pain and sorrow can be used as a means of spiritual nourishment. When we take on the hardships of life, either voluntarily or involuntarily, we are able to offer them up for the betterment of ourselves and others. In doing so, we do as St. Paul tells us: “Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am fill-

ing up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church” (Col 1:24).

This begs the question, Was there something lacking in Jesus’ perfect sacrifice on the cross? Of course not! But the effects of sin still remain in our world, much like a house in need of a good cleaning. Redemptive suffering, then, provides us with the ability to “clean up the mess” by purifying our souls and aiding in the sufferings of others. We thus work together with God and unite our pain to the cross, where it is nailed, put to death, and poured out into the world in the form of healing, understanding, and hopefulness.

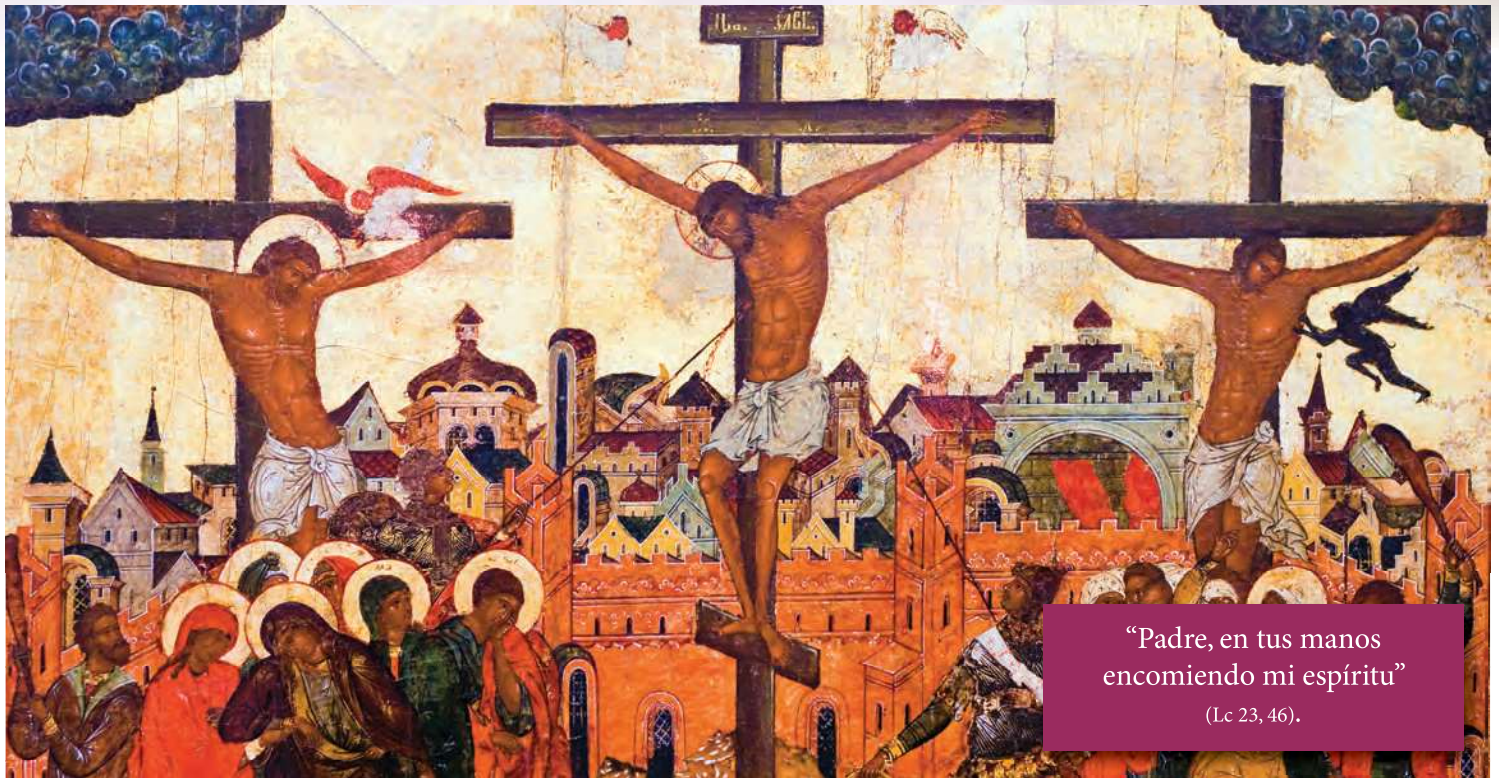

El sacrificio de Cristo nos permite encontrar sentido en el sufrimiento

La Pasión de Cristo es la cúspide de todo el sufrimiento humano reunido en un hombre: Jesús de Nazaret. Él cree que tú vales ese sacrificio. Él cree que todos, aún aquellos que están más alejados de Él, merecen que haya realizado este sacrificio.

Mediante la cruz podemos llegar a comprender la misericordia de Dios. En la Crucifixión, se realiza el más grande sacrificio que el mundo ha visto. En ese madero, el Hijo único de Dios nos muestra que el camino a la salvación necesita de su poder salvífico y de su don infinito de perdón.

Dios desea tanto darnos su

misericordia que estuvo dispuesto a morir para probarnos su valor. Al morir, destruyó la muerte y al resucitar, nos volvió a la vida. Sin este acto de sacrificio, nuestros propios sufrimientos no tendrían sentido. Gracias a su dolor, podemos encontrarle sentido a nuestro sufrimiento. Participamos en el misterio del sufrimiento uniendo nuestras dificultades y lágrimas a Jesús. Él sufre con nosotros durante nuestras necesidades y nunca deja de llamarnos a estar en comunión con Él. En su misericordia, tenemos la esperanza de que un día nuestra obscuridad se convertirá en luz y nuestras tribulaciones se convertirán en

gozo eterno.

Solo tenemos que aceptar nuestra cruz y seguirlo (ver Mt 16, 24).

Mensaje del Catecismo

“Jesús, al aceptar en su corazón humano el amor del Padre hacia los hombres, ‘los amó hasta el extremo’ porque ‘nadie tiene mayor amor que el que da su vida por sus amigos’. Tanto en el sufrimiento como en la muerte, su humanidad se hizo el instrumento libre y perfecto de su amor divino que quiere la salvación de los hombres” (609).



Santo

La negación más grande fue perdonada

Pedro era uno de los seguidores más cercanos de Jesús. Fue uno de los primeros a los que Jesús llamó y estuvo junto a Él casi en todos los momentos de su ministerio público. Sin embargo, al llegar la Pasión y Muerte de Jesús, Pedro negó a su maestro y sintió vergüenza, o miedo, de ver a su Señor morir en la cruz. Después de que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos, una de las primeras cosas que hizo fue asegurarle a Pedro que sus pecados estaban perdonados y decirle que él sería el líder del resto de los apóstoles después de que Jesús ascendiera a los cielos.

San Pedro cometió uno de los peores pecados que una persona puede cometer cuando negó al hombre que sabía que era el Hijo de Dios. Sin embargo, su arrepentimiento fue puro y su tristeza fue genuina. Cuando Jesús lo perdonó, su dolor y su angustia fueron como un carbón que se convierte en el diamante de una fe inquebrantable y una sed insaciable por las almas.

La misericordia de Dios tiene la forma de cambiar la propia esencia de nuestro ser. Que Él moldee nuestras almas para que podamos ser los santos que estamos destinados a ser.

Lección de fe

Nuestro sufrimiento puede purificar nuestras almas

Uno de los depósitos más grandes de poder espiritual en nuestro mundo llega a través de lo que se conoce como sufrimiento redentor. Como católicos creemos que nuestro dolor y sufrimiento puede utilizarse como un medio para obtener alimento espiritual. Cuando enfrentamos dificultades en nuestra vida, de manera voluntaria o involuntaria, podemos ofrecerlas para nuestro bien o el de otras personas. De esta manera, estamos haciendo lo que san Pablo nos dice: “Ahora me alegro cuando tengo que sufrir por ustedes, pues así completo en

mi carne lo que falta a los sufrimientos de Cristo para bien de su cuerpo, que es la Iglesia” (Col 1, 24).

Esto plantea la siguiente pregunta: ¿faltaba algo en el sacramento perfecto de Jesús en la cruz? ¡Por supuesto que no! Pero los efectos del pecado continúan en nuestro mundo, así como una casa que necesita una limpieza a fondo. El sufrimiento redentor, por tanto, nos da la habilidad de “limpiar lo que está sucio” purificando nuestras almas y ayudando en el sufrimiento de otros. De este modo trabajamos junto con Dios y unimos nuestro sufrimiento a la cruz, en donde queda clavado, muerto y derramado en el mundo en forma de sanación, comprensión y esperanza.
