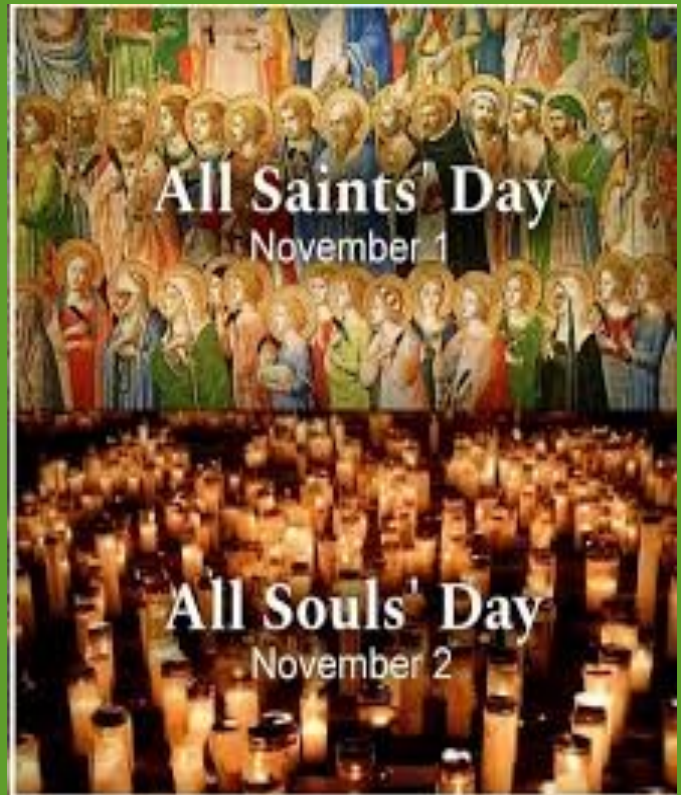

## REMADE FOR MISSION UPDATE

Your Parish Trustees, Fr. Joe, and Kelly Hession joined a diocesan-wide Zoom call led by Fr. Brian Kelly on Sunday evening to hear updates on Remade for Mission, following the announcement of Bishop Scharfenberger's retirement and the appointment of Bishop Mark.

The original plan asked each parish network to submit a proposal to the diocese after a series of joint working groups and synodal discussions within our network as to how we can better use our resources — which includes Sacred Heart, St. Jude the Apostle, and St. Michael the Archangel.

Going forward, rather than focusing our efforts on submitting a formal plan or proposal to the diocese, each network will gather to pray, listen, and discern together as a community. These sessions will help us explore new ways to collaborate and strengthen our shared mission, while entrusting the larger decisions to the Diocese and to Bishop Mark's leadership.

We're preparing topics for these conversations. We want every parishioner to be informed and to be involved. We will begin with our Trustees presenting our annual financial report during Masses the weekend of November 15–16.

**What does this mean for us?**  
We have an opportunity to shape the future of our parishes—together—with Sacred Heart, St. Jude the Apostle, and St. Michael the Archangel.

**How can I be involved?**  
Take part in the upcoming discussions (dates will be announced soon) and join the conversation. Share your ideas for how our parishes can best use our facilities, ministries, and people in creative, collaborative ways—both within our community and beyond our parish walls.

Have you ever been dehydrated? What an awful feeling-headache, extreme weakness, lethargy, confusion, little or no urine output are all symptoms. Doctors say if you start feeling thirsty, dehydration has already begun. Usually, 64 ounces of water a day is recommended for adults, depending on age and any specific medical condition, unless you have diarrhea, or have been vomiting for 24 hours.
