Consecration to Mary

Bishop Mark O'Connell, encourages Consecration to Mary, viewing it as a way to deepen faith, open hearts to God's grace, and follow Mary's example of saying "yes" to God.

A Consecration to Mary is a prayerful act of entrusting yourself, your life, work, family, struggles, and hopes to the loving care of the Blessed Mother, so that she may lead you more fully to Jesus Christ. It's not worship (which belongs to God alone), but a relationship of trust, love, and surrender, much like a child placing their hand in a mother's.

At its heart, Marian consecration means:

- Choosing to walk the Christian life with Mary as your spiritual mother
- Asking her to form your heart after the heart of her Son
- Allowing her to pray for you, guide you, and help you say "yes" to God's will, just as she did

Many Saints have spoken of this devotion as a shortcut to holiness, because Mary never keeps anything for herself, she always leads us directly to Christ.

What consecration is (and is not)

- A deepening of baptismal promises
- A way of saying, "Jesus, I give myself to You through Mary"
- *Not* replacing Jesus
- *Not* magic or superstition

You can make a consecration once and renew it often, daily, annually, or at special moments in life. Some people prepare over several weeks; others pray a simple act of entrustment. Both are beautiful and valid.

You may pray this slowly and intentionally, perhaps before an image of Mary or after receiving the Eucharist.

Prayer of Consecration


O Mary, my Mother,
I give myself entirely to you.
I place into your hands my prayers, my works,
my joys and my sufferings,
all that I am and all that I hope to be.

Teach me to love your Son as you loved Him.
Help me to trust God more deeply,
to listen more attentively,
and to say "yes" with a generous heart.

Form me in humility, patience, and faith.
When I am uncertain, guide me.
When I am weak, strengthen me.
When I fall, lead me back to Jesus.

O loving Mother,
take me as your own,
and present me to your Son,
that I may live for His glory
and the good of His Church.

Chalking the Door

Many received blessed chalk and a prayer last weekend encouraging to take part in the traditional Epiphany blessing done in homes as a sign of inviting Christ to dwell with us throughout the new year. If still needed, Chalk is available near the church entrances write the inscription above or on the frame of your front door:

$$20 + C + M + B + 26$$

- The numbers represent the current year.
- The letters C, M, B refer to the traditional names of the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar—and also stand for the Latin blessing: Christus Mansionem Benedicat “May Christ bless this home.” This visible sign reminds us that our homes are places of faith, hospitality, and God’s presence.

Faith Formation

There will be no Faith Formation classes on January 11th or January 18th. We encourage our families to attend the upcoming 4 pm Saturday masses with Bishop Mark O'Connell (January 10th @ St. Jude's & January 17th @ St. Michael's).

As we end January, we will begin the Immediate Preparation for First Communion and Confirmation. We have 21 children preparing for the Sacrament of First Communion, and 25 for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

In addition, we have just begun an OCIA class for 6 adults. These candidates will prepare throughout the winter, and become full members of the Church at the Easter Vigil Mass on April 4th.
