



Saint Jude the Apostle Easter Memorial Crosses

Each year at St. Jude, our parish lawn is filled with simple white crosses in celebration of Easter. Each cross bears the name of a loved one who has died and is placed as a visible sign of our hope in the



Resurrection. The Memorial Crosses are a beautiful way for families to remember those they love during the Easter season. As parishioners and visitors arrive for Easter Masses, the crosses serve as a powerful reminder that we are a communion of saints, prayer, memory, and hope. Forms for the Easter Memorial Crosses are available at all church entrances.

If you have participated in the past, please indicate "PREVIOUS CROSS" at the bottom of the form. If your family has multiple crosses, please note this on one of the forms. We will do our best to keep your loved ones together on the lawn. Please use the space provided to list your family name (up to 24 characters). Kindly place your completed form in an envelope marked "Easter Memorial Crosses" along with a \$15.00 offering per cross. Envelopes may be placed in the collection basket or dropped off at the parish office (Monday–Thursday, 9:00am–1:00pm). *Many thanks to Maureen Hannigan, Jim Hannigan, and Nancy Carey for leading this beautiful project.*

Some Ways to Fast, Pray & Give This Lent

Ways to Fast

- Fast from complaining, practice gratitude
- Fast from social media/ endless scrolling and use that time for prayer
- Fast from gossip, speak encouragement/ send a kind note
- Fast from excess noise, embrace silence
- Fast from judging, extend mercy and ask for forgiveness.

Ways to Pray

- Arrive 15 minutes early for Mass and sit in silence
- Pray one Psalm each day
- Add a daily Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet
- Attend a weekday Mass
- Make a Holy hour

Ways to Give

- Support the Poor Box
- Reach out to someone who is lonely
- Use your gifts and volunteer for a parish ministry
- Bring a meal to someone in need
- Increase your weekly offertory as you are able
- Perform one act of kindness each day

Lent is not about perfection; it's about intentionally drawing closer to Christ.
