Good News

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time Fr. Mark Haydu, LC

Often when we think of a judge, we think of severity or cold justice. Courtroom and criminal-justice dramas—even some news coverage of major crimes and scandals—love depicting the offender as receiving his or her just rewards, with the judge or prosecutor smugly reflecting or sighing in relief.

But in the scriptural sense, a judge is much more. A good judge is an educator, teacher, and parent. Good judges promote wise living and respect for authority and the law. Their tools are sometimes mercy, sometimes penance, but always prompted by love.

A better image to understand the judge's role is a parent educating his or her child. Sometimes education means letting something slide; sometimes it means holding the child accountable. Both can be expressions of love.

Today's readings caution us against selfish passions that prompt us to judge. One who has been forgiven much but is then harsh with others will be severely punished—or as Sirach puts it, God "remembers their sins in detail."

Mercy toward others is key to the Gospel message. Some think they are good Christians because they don't steal and haven't killed anyone. They may even be active in their parish but are highly critical of others.

Remember, as Jesus said: "The measure with which you measure will be measured out to you" (Matthew 7:2). And, "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart."

MINISTRY TO THE SICK

If you are homebound and sick and would like to be anointed or receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, call the parish office and we will arrange for a Priest to come and visit you. If you would like to receive Holy Communion, then we will arrange for a minister to the sick to visit you.

If you are going into the hospital for surgery or a planned procedure and would like to be anointed, please note that you do not have to wait until you are in the hospital for an anointing. You can be anointed at the church by a priest before you are admitted. It has the same spiritual blessing. If you are transported to the hospital in an emergency situation, please call the parish office and we will arrange for a priest to visit and anoint you.

If you are going into the hospital or assisted living facility and would like to receive Holy Communion, please call the church office and request that your name be put on the appropriate list. Please note that Federal HIPPA laws do not permit hospitals or assisted living facilities to call us even if you identify yourself as a Catholic and parishioner at St. Louis. That call has to come from you or someone on your behalf or we will not know your situation.


