Good News First Sunday of Advent Fr. Mark Haydu, LC

Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy! The sleepy apostles couldn't keep awake with Jesus and drifted off when he most needed them.

I have only fallen asleep at the wheel once. During college, I worked the morning shift starting at 6 am. After a late night with little sleep, I sluggishly got into my car. Comfortably driving down the highway at about 5:15 am, I dozed for a few seconds before awakening to the noise of my tires vibrating on the warning tracks just in time to straighten the wheel and avoid the cement divider.

Advent is like those rumble strips. You don't always need them, they are annoying when you accidentally run over them, but they are very important!

We can get tired, trying to keep our hearts awake and attuned to Jesus. The rhythm of life, the background

music of the world, the distractions that fly by us—they all contribute to the danger of a passive heart. Running across Advent is like a wake-up call: "Stay awake! He is almost here."

As in driving, there are many distractions vying for your attention, but you learn to focus on what's important. You survey your surroundings, looking for hazards while keeping your eyes on the road. There are many signs to read, but only certain ones point you where you want to go.

Jesus says to be attentive to the signs; learn to interpret their meaning. Understand them, without being distracted by them. Be vigilant, pray for strength, and stay awake and alert. Thanks be to God for those rumble strips!





What is a prayer chain? God hears and answers all prayers. A parish prayer chain is a group of parishioners who, on request, will pray for any of our brothers of sisters who are in need. The need could be illness, grieving due to the loss of loved ones, unemployment, addiction, etc.

What is requested of prayer chain volunteers? To pray for the requests of St. Louis Church parishioners. Volunteers need to regularly monitor their personal email accounts for timely prayer requests. This information passed along must be kept private and absolutely confidential. Requests will be sent once a week in a group email unless the prayer request is for a timely or urgent matter.

How will prayer requests be submitted? Through the church website or church office.

What is the time commitment? Prayer chain members should be able to set aside time to pray daily for the prayer chain requests. Members pray individually for each prayer request. Other than the informational kickoff breakfast, there are no meetings to attend, which makes this a wonderful opportunity for those who otherwise would be unable to participate in a ministry.

How do I volunteer to be a part of this prayer team? Simply email prayerchain@stlouismemphis.org and provide your name and email address. You will then be contacted as to the date of the brief kick-off breakfast meeting in January.


