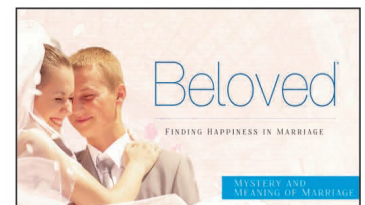

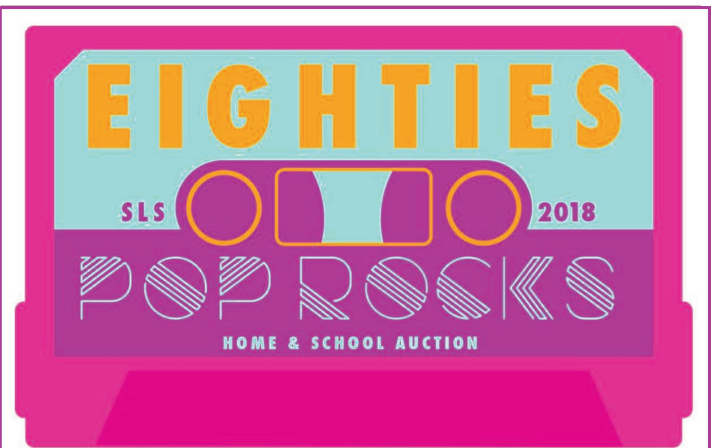

The opioid and heroin epidemic that has infected us, our children, our families, many friends and their families. This disease knows no racial, geographical, political or economic boundaries. It has had tragic effects in Memphis, Germantown and everywhere else. Over 2,000 doses of Narcan were dispensed in Shelby County alone during 2017. This antidote saves lives but does not stop addiction. Two thousand saved. How many not saved?

St. Louis parish wants to help our parish family attack this crisis. This presentation will present information on the epidemic, the warning signs and the consequences. The presentation is open to parishioners 13 and older. HOWEVER, as some of the presentation may be graphic, ages 13 through 16 must be accompanied by an adult, preferably their parent. Teen participation is encouraged as they will be facing this problem head on as they go to high school and college.

This presentation will be led by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA). There will also be representatives present from the Shelby County District Attorney's Office, the Multi-agency Task Force, Shelby County Sheriff's Office and the Memphis Police Department. They will answer any questions that you have and they encourage questions. A box will be available so that questions may be asked anonymously.
